Whilst the paintwork on the railings around the Lady Anne Grimston tomb has lasted well for some years, the metalwork has failed in a number of places. Several finials are missing as are a number of vertical railings. The horizontal rails have rusted away entirely at some points weakening the whole structure. We have investigated a degree of remedial work and have been most fortunate in receiving on offer from Alan Glasson of Glasson Metalwork, W.G.C. This offer includes the repair of the horizontal rails and replacement of the missing vertical railings. Our thanks to Alan for this generous offer.

POTHOLES

If you would like to report a defect/pothole in the road or pavement you can either:-

1. Ring the Highways fault line 01438-737321 and provide them with details of where the defect is and its size. The road name and a house number can be helpful in order to find the exact location.

2. Go online to <u>www.hertsdirect.org</u> and click on "Highways Fault Reporting" on the right hand side of the screen and follow the instructions. You can search for the location by address and will be asked to mark the exact location of the pothole on a map.

In both cases you will receive a reference number which can be used to track the pothole repairs.

HIGHWAYS

Following a meeting between the Parish Council and Herts Highways Engineer on 1st March 2010 it was agreed that:-

- as soon as possible from 1st April the ditches on Upper Green will be dug out in order to create greater holding capacity and thus take some of the water off the road.

- to check for details on the underground gulley system in Upper Green Road.

- to submit a request to the Long Term Programme to cover up the ditches in Upper Green Road, although this may take a few years.

- to check ownership of the verge opposite the Upper Green Road ditches with a view to reinstating the ditch on that side of the road and clearing the verge.

- to check ownership of the green between 49 Upper Green and the 'Plume of Feathers' with a view to creating a larger holding ditch for the water there which is currently flowing out of the ditch and down the road.

- to note a few gullies that do not seem to be on the "annual gulley cleansing list"

- to order a replacement triangular sign for May Pond Green

- to report the road deterioration on Churchfield Road and the flooding at Lousehole Bottom, Hertford Road.

PAVILION REFURBISHMENT

East Herts Council has given the Pavilion refurbishment planning permission.

Out of hours, please ring the same number following the series of recorded messages to complaining about noise or stray dog option and you will be put through to an "out of hours" Duty Officer who will be able to advise you or contact an Emergency Environmental Health Officer.

FRIENDS OF DANESBURY AND QUEEN VICTORIA MEMORIAL HOSPITAL

This month's exciting news is that Danesbury's new Day Room extension has received planning permission. This new facility will be financed by the Friends and construction is expected to commence in the spring. In addition the Primary Care Trust has now completed modifications to the existing building to provide two additional bedrooms which will be used to increase the capacity of the Neurological Centre.

A major contribution to the estimated £150,000 cost of the Day Room came when Johnny Tait, an entertainer and after dinner speaker based in Codicote, handed over a cheque for £3,416. This was raised from two performances of the pantomime Cinderella which Johnny produced and directed at Welwyn Civic Centre. The cast known as "The Goat Players" had rehearsed over many weeks in the back room of the Goat Inn in Codicote. Both performances were sold out and thoroughly enjoyed by the enthusiastic audiences. This is not the first time that Johnny has contributed to the QVM and Danesbury and we are most grateful for all his support.

Sally Chandler the volunteer coordinator for the QVM and Danesbury for the last 15 years is retiring in March. In addition to her duties arranging volunteer rotas and liaising with "the Friends" Sally has arranged entertainments and has been responsible for the patients Art group. Sally has made a great contribution to the quality of life of the patients during their many weeks in hospital. She will be sadly missed but we hope she will herself continue to be associated with us as a volunteer. A replacement will be appointed but in the short term anyone wishing to know more about volunteering should contact us by phone or via the internet.
