

Some news from another church in the Welwyn Team Ministry

St Peter's, Ayot St Peter

where a 'Church Recording' has taken place, similar to the 'Recording' at St Peter's, Te-win in 1983-1986.

On 18th April, following morning service, John Banbury of NADFAS presented to Stephen a file containing the results of three and a half years of volunteer effort. NADFAS, [the National Association of Decorative & Fine Arts Societies] is an arts-based educational charity with over 300 societies and 90,000 members worldwide.

At the heart of NADFAS are the local societies and one of their activities is church recording. We were fortunate that the Harpenden DFAS has a team of specialist recorders who are working their way round churches in Hertfordshire and, even more fortunate, that they offered to make St Peter's their next project.

Since 2006 the team of up to 20 recorders has been meeting at St Peter's on Tuesdays, recording every aspect of the church, from the floor tiles to the ceiling. Everything to do with the church has been described, photographed or drawn and, where necessary, its history researched. That the file is over 4 inches thick gives some indication of the dedication the recorders have brought to their task.

After the presentation the congregation was invited to stay for a chance to meet members of the Recording Team and discuss their work over a glass of wine. Talking to the Recording Team's artist Clare Allen, I asked for an example of where pen and ink was superior to the camera. She told me about a feature I had never noticed in 10 years of kneeling at the altar rail. The wooden rail is supported by decorated wrought iron pillars. Where each of the nuts securing the rail to the metal are tightened onto the iron structure you might expect to see a washer, but not in a Victorian arts and craft church. Instead of a plain washer there is a tiny rosette and one of Clare's many drawings in the record showed this little detail.

Visiting the church one Tuesday during the recording work I was lucky enough to see the team's photographer Sheila Collingwood at work recording the church plate. This must be one of the most difficult tasks, with so many potential reflections and shadows. A miniature studio had been set up in the chancel, with the chalice being photographed in a white cube and illuminated with a complex lighting arrangement.

One of the highlights of the record is the first professional photographs of the stained glass from the previous church, which is stored under the floor in the church. This was taken out, cleaned and photographed in all its Victorian glory. Also on record is the painted chancel ceiling, which must have been another photographic challenger when it came to lighting.

These photographs will provide a valuable source of information for our next project – cleaning the ceiling. Here the news is that during the last week of April we removed the altar between services enabling scaffolding to be erected for a professional conservator to inspect the ceiling and also try the effect of various cleaning media. Here the good news is that there is no damage to the paintings and an appropriate cleaning solvent has been selected to remove over a century and a quarter of accumulated grime.
