On Sunday 5th April Holy Week begins with a Palm Sunday celebration at 9.30am at St Peters. It is a week that begins with joy as we remember Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem, mobbed by the crowds as a king, a mighty warrior who was going to deliver the people from the oppressor. It was a challenge to the Pharisees, to the Romans, to Herod, to the military and to the ordinary people because all of them, in their own way, were confused, not knowing how to respond to this man.

He refused to argue, he was not violent, discouraging violence in any form. The poor, the outcast, the oppressed wanted peace, an end to occupation, surely this man was going to lead them to victory. Too soon the jubilation turned to anger, became threatening. Why? Did those who followed realise that they stood out, were at risk, or did he challenge them to acknowledge what they knew about themselves - things that they preferred to attribute to others?

As the journey through Holy Week continues Jesus' closest friends find themselves in an uncomfortable situation, they've given up everything to follow this man, their homes, their security, their status and now as he is arrested they find themselves on the losing side.

They didn't know where it was going to end but they had a good idea, a savage beating, imprisonment, the cross. Every year as I travel through Holy Week I pray that the next year will not reflect the pain, the suffering and the fear that is the crucifixion, the pain, suffering and fear that we have witnessed in the world this year, in Zimbabwe, Sudan, Afghanistan and once more in Northern Ireland.

The long day stretched into night

and time crept onward towards the new day.

With the gold of dawn came a resurrection,

a new hope that grew with the rising sun, and went out to a waiting world.

Tea Garden and café: UPDATE

We hope that the tea garden will be open again this summer, although (as last year) that does depend on willing volunteers. The longer term plan is to renovate the store room and the loo, and to make the outside courtyard more easily accessible for prams, pushchairs and wheelchairs. This will hopefully encourage more customers, improve the building and enable us to sell a more diverse range of local goods and crafts.

The plan is to carry out the works in four phases. Phase 1 is the preparation of the courtyard to provide better drainage, a path and a base for the new stock room shed. Phase 2 is the erection of the shed and the relocation of the stock room. Phase 3 is the renovation of the old store room. (If you want to know more about the design, please ask any member of the Committee). Phase 4 is the renovation of the loo.

The builder is due to start work on the courtyard in the next few weeks.

On the basis of the builders' estimates, a grant of £8000 was raised from EHDC, which must be spent by June 2009. This money represents 50% of the total cost. It can only be claimed in two tranches, and each tranche must amount to no more than 50% of the money claimed. This means, for example, that to claim £4000 we must have spent £8000 and £4000 must have been raised from elsewhere. So far we have raised £2500 from other donors, £1500 of which is a grant from Tewin Parish Council.

BOX CLEVER - with a box of Free Will Offering envelopes

Members of the congregation at St Peter's mainly give their financial support by one of two methods – bank standing orders or the Free Will offering envelopes. Both these arrangements provide an opportunity for you to make your regular gift to St Peter's, whether or not you attend a service each week or month. After all, the church's costs continue week by week even if you're not there yourself!

Standing orders have the advantage of regular *automatic* payments throughout the year; the envelopes involve a bit more discipline to use them regularly. The downside is therefore that envelopes get missed, whereas the potential up-side is that giving can more easily be adjusted to individual circumstances.

At last month's AGM I reported that in 2008 there had been a drop in the total sums given to St Peter's through the weekly envelope scheme. This is not because people have changed from envelopes to standing orders; rather it is because some "regular" users have used them less regularly, resulting in a 12% fall in this category of income compared with 2007.

April heralds a new envelope year (as well as a new tax year) and this year we have a new style of envelope. I have ordered some extra boxes in the hope that those who currently attend St Peter's, but don't currently give by standing order or envelope, will take a box for the first time and use it for their regular giving. We have welcomed a number of new people to St Peter's and it would be wonderful if they were to join the weekly envelope scheme.

Gift Aid tax recoveries continue to be a valuable source of income and for 2008 contributed about £8,000 (16%) of our total receipts. So if you pay tax on any of your income, please make sure your giving to St Peter's is tax efficient by signing a Gift Aid declaration or by using the special yellow Gift Aid envelopes, both of which are always in church.

The yellow Gift Aid envelopes are specifically for Gift Aid donations; so please only use them if you fill in your name and address.

If you would like a box of envelopes, or a bank standing order form, a Gift Aid declaration form, or just some help on any of these subjects, please speak to me in church or give me a call. I shall be happy to hear from you. All details of giving are kept strictly confidential.

Ted Sharp gave a report on last year's Deanery Synod meetings and Coralie gave the Team Vicar's report. It was very encouraging to hear that the congregation numbers have increased by 10% during the last year, due in no small part to all Coralie's hard work.

Many people, both local and visitors, comment on the wellcared for appearance of our church. Much of the credit for this goes to our band of cleaners who do such a good job on a weekly basis.....but, once a year it really does need a DEEP CLEAN. So our annual Spring Clean is planned for Friday evening, May 1st and Saturday May 2nd. You will see the details elsewhere in this Parish News. Please come and help. Even if you can only spare a short time, it would be much appreciated. There is a list on the organ at the back of the church where you can sign up. This also gives details of what implements and materials you need to bring with you.

Although we are half way through Lent it is not too late to join the Lent Course run by Mick Simmons at 8pm on Monday evenings in the Tewin Memorial Hall.

Already our thoughts are turning towards Easter. This is a very busy time for our flower arrangers in a season when there are few flower in their gardens and bought flowers are very expensive, so they would be grateful for contributions to the Flower Fund. These donations can be given directly to Sally Owen, handed on by churchwardens or put in the collection bags on Sunday clearly marked "Flower Fund".

Lastly, an item of housekeeping. Our coffee makers on Sunday morning perform a much appreciated service, but since it has become customary to store the box in the vestry rather than pass it on to the next person on the list, there has been some confusion about the level of supplies in the box. From now on we will replenish the non- perishable items [tea, coffee, sugar], but would ask you to continue to bring milk and biscuits. Thank you.

POLICE Tewin's Police Community Support Officer, Karen Broad, attended the meeting on 2nd March. She is relatively new to the area, but she can be seen regularly walking though the village. She advised the meeting of a new contact telephone number: 01707-354192. Only one recent burglary has been reported in the area, in Burnham Green.

TEWIN STORES At the meeting on 2nd March, the Parish Council approved a grant to the Tewin Stores Association to be used to improve access to the courtyard cafe area for pushchairs, prams and wheelchairs. Tewin Stores Association has responded to the Council with thanks and appreciation.

INTERNAL AUDITOR The Parish Council has appointed a new Internal Auditor for the annual internal audit, and the quarterly internal audit was completed by Councillor's on 26 February.
