Message from Coralie

When the world was dark and the city was quiet, you came. You crept in beside us. And no-one knew. Only the few who dared to believe that God might do something different.

Walking down a quiet Datchworth lane on a still, bright, chilly November morning I had no idea what to write here. The news offered little inspiration; the death toll in Pakistan rising, the financial news totally incomprehensible, gangs of young people on our town and city streets still inflicting great pain on one another and feeling grumpy 'is good for you'.

Then I picked up a book, *Forgiving and Forgetting* by Nick Fawcett. There is no mention of tinsel, turkey or indigestion - just a summary of four key truths at the heart of Christmas or what the season is all about; a time for giving, for getting, forgiving and forgetting.

Christmas is a time for giving presents, thoughtfully chosen, from the heart, 'it's the thought that counts'. As well as giving at Christmas we also receive. Do we remember what we got last year, do we still have it or has it joined the bag for the Tombola. It's not just about gifts, it's about getting the most out of Christmas and so often the more we put in the more we get out. In Jesus God offered us joy, love, hope, mercy and life but they don't just happen we need to do something about it.

Christmas is a time for forgiveness, peace and goodwill. It isn't easy to say sorry and some people won't accept an apology but we can try to mend broken relationships, restore trust and learn to let go, to forget. Whoever we are we shouldn't dwell on the past but live today and tomorrow in this world as well as the world to come. There may be trials, stresses and strains but there will be joy and peace.

Other building works are progressing, if somewhat slowly, due again to weather condition. The top coat of plaster has been applied in the toilet and the porch has been painted, with the exception of the new plaster which will be lime washed at a later date when the plaster is completely dry.

An enormous thank you goes to Ken Feakes for his sterling work replacing the chevron boarding in the tower following the installation of the new loft ladder and the re-siting of the free-standing ladder. It looks even better than it did before, now that the boards are all flush. His workmanship and attention to detail are amazing.
