"Patriotism is not enough. I must have no bitterness or hatred toward anyone"

These words were spoken by Nurse Edith Cavell after receiving Holy Communion on the eve of her execution by firing squad on October 12<sup>th</sup> 1915. The Church commemorates her death on that day each year. In a year in which we have lost the last remaining survivors of that terrible conflict, it's definitely worth recalling the many acts of heroism carried out in the Great War and I think that Edith Cavell's sacrifice stands as a fitting tribute to them all.

The quotation above wasn't just empty words; she lived out that philosophy by nursing both allied and German soldiers alike. But the reason she was executed was because, at great personal risk, she sheltered British soldiers and arranged for them to be funnelled from occupied Belgium into neutral Holland and, as a result, more than 200 Allied soldiers were guided to safety. When her activities were discovered, and as German military law operated in Belgium at the time, she was tried for treason and sentenced to death by the German authorities.

Throughout her trial, which seems to have been somewhat farcical to say the least, Edith Cavell is reported to have had complete disregard for her own safety and to have annoyed her accusers by her outspokenness. Yet such was her character that even the German Civil Governor was moved to speak out in her defence stating that she should be pardoned because of her honesty and the fact that she had saved so many lives, German as well as Allied soldiers.

Edith's patriotism was never in doubt as evidenced from a conversation she had with her German prison chaplain during which she said: "Ask Father Gahan to tell my loved ones later on that my soul, as I believe is safe, and that I am glad to die for my country." This remark also testifies to her deeply held religious belief. She was an Anglican and the daughter of a Church of England priest, and her faith was steadfast to the end.

Evidently Edith took to heart Jesus' injunction in his sermon on the mount: "But I say to you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, so that you may be children of your Father in heaven." To love one's enemies is a hard thing to do, but it's not impossible, as testified to by Edith Cavell's courage, fortitude and sustaining faith. As Barack Obama would say: "Can we do it? Yes we can!" Yes we can, with the help of Jesus.

#### SCHOOL LANE FLOODING

Highways have agreed to lower the kerb line and arrangements for a road closure have been made for one week between 16<sup>th</sup> and 31<sup>st</sup> October.

Highways intend to liaise with the Environment Agency about establishing a new gully to alleviate water pooling outside 5 School Lane. They will also investigate whether the existing system is working to its maximum capacity and bid for a "holistic drainage scheme assessment" in 2010/11.

Parishioners are reminded that litter bins are not for household rubbish. A car driver was recently observed depositing a bag of bottles into a litter bin on Lower Green. This of course easily fills a bin up, and makes it unavailable for its normal use. Note that litter bins are usually emptied on Friday each week.

# Operation Christmas Child 2009 ~ Will you help again please?

It's hard to imagine never having received a gift before, but that's the reality for many children in countries where Samaritan Purse sends shoe boxes. Imagine the look of amazement and joy as a child opens up their shoebox full of gifts sent by you, the box you created?

Picture the joy of two year old Merita and her eleven year old sister Sylvia, who live in a Roma camp with their parents on the edge of a rubbish tip in Bar, Montenegro. The girls aren't able to attend school and never receive presents, so the day when some shoe boxes arrived at the rubbish tip they were just over whelmed. Merita loves playing ball games with the other children in the camp, so imagine her excitement as she pulled out a tennis ball from her shoe box along with a pair of sunglasses. She proudly wore the sun glasses from that point on. Sylvia loved the scarf she was given and smiled saying "Thank you for sending such presents. Thank you for remembering us!"

Last year Tewin and other local friends contributed 235 decorated shoe boxes to the 1.2 million boxes sent out from the UK to war torn and poverty stricken countries in parts of Africa, Central Asia and Eastern

Europe. These boxes were filled with gifts such as a toy & game, may be a pack of cards, a ball, a cuddly toy, pencils with a pencil sharpener, paper, a hat, scarf & gloves, some soap, toothbrush and toothpaste, a packet of sweets – just simple things but each item is treasure to a child in say an orphanage, who has nothing.

Would you be kind enough to help once more this year? If any one is interested in doing so, would you please contact me for a leaflet with instructions and if necessary a box. All that is required is a medium sized shoe box, decorated with Christmas paper (lid covered separately). It is important that none of the gifts chosen are breakable or in any way war related. A cheque or postal order for £2.50 is also required to cover the cost of despatch of your shoe box. It is a good idea to ask the tax payer in the household to sign the cheque and tick the gift aid box on the envelope. Alternatively the tax payer can donate and gift aid securely and conveniently online at Samaritans Purse websites (www.samaritanspurse.co.uk.com).

On 17th November there will be a coffee morning here at 10.00 am to hear a speaker from Fairtrade and also to receive your boxes. Do hope you can come.

# **Dilys Aileen Applegate**

On 15<sup>th</sup> September we joined together to celebrate the life of Dilys. If you are looking at your watches with a view to timing what we are about to say – you are only doing so because that's what Dilys would have done. She was notorious for timing the vicar's sermons!!

Dilys was bright, amusing and quick-witted, as well as direct, opinionated, pedantic and we are sure we will all share some happy memories. She always had a twinkle in her eye and loved chatting to everyone. She had an awesome memory for names, places, events and was fiercely loyal. She was immensely proud of her daughters, Ann and Jane and of her five grandchildren Charles, Harriet, Emily, Abbie and Samuel.

Dilys was born on 17<sup>th</sup> September 1926 and was brought up in Chester, where she enjoyed her childhood, hardly noticing the war. Encouraged by her family and her two brothers she was able to go to Liverpool University to study Law, and on July 22<sup>nd</sup> 1950 she married Brian whom she met through a choir in Chester. In 1952 they moved to 'Little Coppice' in Cowpers Way and remained there until their move round the corner to Burnham Green on 21<sup>st</sup> May 1996.

Always busy – whether professionally as a conveyance, acting for nearly everyone in Tewin, Welwyn Garden and places beyond, or so it appeared, or socially, singing in various choirs, on stage with the Tewin Players, visiting the mobile library, W.I., playing bridge, bell ringing, Scottish dancing, NADFAS lectures, walking, helping at jumble sales, and latterly in the Village Shop or holding office in organisations such as the P.C.C. as Secretary, Tewin Wood Roads, Tewin School Governors (she was a member of the Governing body for 40 years), Tewin Horticultural Society and several others – many will remember her whizzing about on her bike delivering newsletters and notes.

A very serious operation in the spring of 2005 removed a large part of her stomach and she rapidly lost weight- but continued working as hard as ever. Her social life, work friends and family saw her through the loss of Brian in July 2005. A re-occurrence of her illness at the end of last year was borne practically, as she carried on as normally as possible.

We are poorer for losing her, but richer for having known her!
