Three years ago we launched our very own village history book, which the History Book Group is pleased to see still attracts interest and sales. Before publication, and with the book launch, our sales totalled 534 books.

Since January 2010 we have sold a further 229 books, mostly through Tewin Stores. In accordance with the Financial Regulations of the Council it was unanimously agreed at the 12<sup>th</sup> November Parish Council meeting that the precept should increase by only £700 to £27,000 for the next financial year commencing 1<sup>st</sup> April 2013.

# Upper Green

The Parish Council would like to thank all the volunteers for their time and effort to help plant the 65 saplings donated by the Woodland Trust on the western boundary of Upper Green. These saplings comprise Oak, Hawthorn, Hazel, Birch, Rowan and Blackthorn and Tewin Parish Council would like to thank Margaret Knight for looking after the saplings and her valuable advice. The Parish Council would also like to thank *THACS* and Friends of Tewin who have kindly provided the funding for the necessary equipment.

## **Public Sewers**

At the beginning of November the public sewer running through Muspatts Farm collapsed and was repaired. The Thames Water representative advised that there is not a shortage of capacity in the area but that it is what is flushed down the toilet that causes the problems.

Their recommendations are that only water, toilet tissue and waste water goes down into the sewer. All other items such as sanitary products, nappies, and wet wipes should be disposed of in the bin. Fat and oil from cooking should be left to cool and can be disposed of in the bin or mixed with seeds and nuts to make a feeder for the birds.

Chemical solvents, engine oils and paint should be taken to a local refuse site and medicines to a pharmacist for safe disposal. The Seven Acres site is not connected to the public sewer yet. All rain water goes into the bore holes put in at the beginning of the build.

Danesbury's other gift was a new reception and the transformation is startling. On the day of completion one NHS visitor thought that they had come to the wrong building! The look on people's faces let us know that our money has been very well spent.

As well as gifts there were traditional celebrations with entertainment and festive fare for those unable to be in their own homes at Christmas. We are delighted we helped bring a little cheer into the patients' lives.

We look forward to 2013 knowing that it will be a year of change in the Health Service and we are confident that with the help of all our supporters we will be well placed to play our part.

#### New Plan to improve the River Mimram

Plenty of projects planned to improve the River Mimram are about to start. Improving the quality of this rare chalk stream, the wildlife and our accessibility to enjoy it. From Jan 23<sup>rd</sup> ...... see what's happening at www.beaneandmimrampartnership.org

The Friends of the Mimram, in conjunction with the Herts Middx Wildlife Trust have developed a Catchment Management Plan to improve the river quality and help meet EU Water Framework Directive guidelines. This is being presented as a dynamic website which will evolve as the projects come to fruition. The projects have been developed in consultation with other local conservation groups, parish councils, Welhat Borough Council, HCC and the Environment Agency.

One of the projects will start in Singlers Marsh this winter. Chalk streams should have crystal clear water flowing over gravel. After years of low flows, silt has built up to 2 feet deep in the river at the top end and trees overgrown keeping out the sunlight preventing vegetation growing. So HMWT have managed to obtain some funding for an Environment Agency plan to dig out the silt from a section of the river opposite the Vineyards, replacing it with gravel, while also pollarding some trees to let in the light. The Friends of the Mimram will also clear some of the scrub away from the river bank and maintain a footpath along the river so that we can enjoy it. Meanwhile the Friends will also continue the work near Singlers Bridge to narrowing the river slightly to increase the flow and achieve the same effect.

If the trial is successful it will be extended upstream when more funds become available.

#### Vicar's letter

I love Professor Brian Cox. Partly it is because of his floppy fringe, sparkling eyes and his 'I'm everyone's friend' smile. But that aside I also love him because he recognises mystery.

In his book the Wonders of the Solar System he describes what it felt like to witness the Aurora Borealis, the Northern Lights, while filming a science programme for the BBC. Referring to an ancient legend about the mysterious lights in the night sky– where they are said to be the spirits of women he writes: 'Just after midnight the aurora came...They came gently. Sheets of colour drifted slowly then suddenly broke off and danced Impossibly fast...and as I turned to camera I realised that I didn't care about the physics of what I was seeing. My reaction, composed sitting at my desk in Manchester, was worthless in the face of Nature at its most magnificent. The Sami had it right...it is made of majestic mournful dancing spirits trapped in the Arctic night.'

From time immemorial the night sky has been a vehicle for spiritual experience and yearning. King David is recorded in the Psalms as pondering the majesty and vastness of the Universe and calling out to God: *When I look at your heavens, the work of your fingers, the moon and the stars that you have established; what are human beings that you are mindful of them, mortals that you care for them?* Psalm 8:3-4

On Sunday 6<sup>th</sup> January the Church celebrates Epiphany – as we remember the Magi who, studying the night sky, set off on a quest to discover the mystery that the stars would lead them to. Their star-gazing led them to find a small child. I wonder as they knelt before him whether they recognised his hands as being those which had flung the stars into space in the first place.

It is mysterious – but a sense of mystery is what sets us apart as human beings. Human beings which were designed to look up and be stirred to set off on a journey of exploration. I wonder this year if you do that – where you may be led?
