Roger Temple 1942 – 2020

As the son of a Tewin farmer and bookkeeper, Ernie and Peggy Temple, Roger inherited a love of the outdoors, hard work, and numbers. These qualities would serve him in the two professions of his life. He also inherited, a love of whisky, conversation, people and of course Tewin. A friendly face, greeting newcomers, and in the process selling them something too.

Ever since he was a delivery boy for Tewin stores, his dream had been to own the village shop.

First though, he worked with his father at Warrengate farm and dairy. He treasured the outdoors, but he also enjoyed the chance to sell on the occasional milk round, which he did as dairy manager. He loved to make new friends and contacts, instinctively knowing the importance of trust and reliability, qualities, amongst others, that he would always be known for.

In 1982 with the help of his family he became the proud owner of Tewin Stores, unofficially known as Roger's shop. For 18 years he gradually made the shop the hub, and even the hubbub of Tewin. His enthusiasm for selling and for promoting all that was good in the village, bringing people together, was always a positive force.

He was continually raising funds and awareness for his daughter, Emma's, Romanian charity and had fun helping his son, David, at gigs, setting up equipment and just being part of it all.

Many years were spent on the PA and Parish Council, 30 years selling poppies, over 25 years on the Tewin Charities and helping to write the History of Tewin. It is not surprising then that, in the many thoughtful cards of sympathy which the family has received, he was always remembered as a welcoming, generous, and happy man. And will be deeply missed by his family and those who were lucky enough to have known him.

Free E-Learning For Children And Young People's Mental Health And Wellbeing

Hertfordshire's Just Talk campaign is encouraging students of all ages to complete the Five Ways to Wellbeing e-learning module, to help them think about how they and others are feeling and improve their mood.

There are <u>separate modules for primary or secondary school students</u> and it only takes around 20 minutes to complete. Since its launch last November, over 800 young people have already benefited from this engaging new training.

Hertfordshire County Council's Cabinet Member for Public Health and Prevention, Cllr Tim Hutchings, said: "The routine of going to school for most young people, is being disrupted again following the latest coronavirus restrictions, making this an ideal time to create some healthy new routines at home.

"These e-learning sessions encourage young people to think about some easy things they can do to boost their wellbeing, so I'd urge everyone to help spread the word about the modules and encourage young people in Hertfordshire to take a look."

The "Five Ways to Wellbeing" are clearly explained in each module, together with suggestions for how to support good mental health. A printable checklist for primary school children and an interactive journal for secondary students is also available.

Just Talk is a multi-agency mental health campaign, steered by young people and coordinated by Hertfordshire County Council. It encourages young people to show strength through talking about their mental health. The <u>Just Talk website</u> has a range of free resources for children, young people, their parents, schools and professionals, as well as details of who to contact for further mental help support. Three years ago we extended the Churchyard and put a hedge and rabbit-proof fencing around it. We see the first grave has been dug and we hope the new arrival will lie in peace and know they are in a lovely country churchyard.

I must mention the footpaths. I have never seen so many people walking them. Unfortunately, because of the wet weather, they have become so very muddy and slippery that great care must be taken when using them. I am sure that like me, you cannot believe that another year has gone. During the Second World War my mother wrote in one of her many letters to my father, who was in the Forces – "another weekend overanother week gone. How the days drag interminably and the weeks fly". I think that is how I feel about our current situation. I have plenty to occupy me, I am lucky to be well and for my friends and family, by and large, to be safe and healthy, but I am frustrated and bored some of the time. Nevertheless, like my parents' generation, we must soldier on and get through this next period, hoping to stay well and avoid Covid-19. As our Bishop Alan says " Stay positive, test negative".

Covid coloured much of our celebrations in the Church this Christmas. Susannah was unable to be with us as planned as her family were selfisolating. We were fortunate that the Welwyn Team were able to call on others to take over services she should have led, and even Nick and I stepped up for the Nativity service. People opted in and out of attendance at church over Christmas, but we had a congregation for every event. And now the church is closed for public worship for the time being. You can always find a service on-line, streamed from one of the Welwyn churches, via the www.welwyn.org.uk website. The church remains open daily for private prayer.

The good news is that the church repairs were completed before Christmas and the scaffolding removed. To our great relief the church clock is now working again, and you will have heard it strike the hours as usual. For the moment, whilst the lime mortar dries hard on the clock tower, the bells cannot be rung. Hopefully, once things get back to normal, our bellringers will be able to be back in action again after the end of February. Pete, our Verger, has had help clearing the leaves in the churchyard this season from Mark Lee and his son Adam – thank you to them for their hard work. Thank you also to Sue Whitbourn and her team of flower arrangers who decorated the church so beautifully for services in December, and to Clare Rawlins for decorating our Christmas tree.

We continue to hold in our prayers all those affected by Covid-19, those who have been ill, those who have died or are bereaved, those whose livelihoods have been devastated during the epidemic, and those who have family members at school or university or have returned to work.

Our clergy are in contact with those self-isolating or unable to get out of the house, or with any bereaved families.

Be Alert to Vaccine Frauds

Criminals are using the COVID-19 vaccine as a way to target the public by tricking them to hand over cash or financial details. They are sending convincing-looking text messages letting people know they are eligible for the vaccine or phoning people directly pretending to be from the NHS, or local pharmacy. **PEOPLE ARE WARNED TO BE ALERT TO THESE SCAMS**:

The NHS will:

NEVER ask for payment - the vaccine is free

NEVER ask for your bank details

NEVER arrive unannounced at your home to administer the vaccine

NEVER ask you to prove your identity by sending copies of personal documents such as your passport.

Top 4 Vaccine Scams

TEXT MESSAGES

People are asked to press a number on their keypad or to send a text message to confirm they wish to receive the vaccine, doing so is likely to result in a charge being applied to their phone bill and fraudsters collecting personal information to use again.

PHONE CALLS

Victims receive a phone call from a fake caller offering the vaccine for a fee or asking for bank details.

WEBSITES

Fake URL links to convincing-looking NHS vaccine booking forms, these look like official NHS forms and may contain some personal information already, at the end of the form it asks for bank details.

IN PERSON

Fraudsters are calling unannounced at the homes of victims by pretending to be from the NHS to administer the vaccine there and then, in exchange for a cash payment.

If you receive a call you believe to be fraudulent, hang up. If you are suspicious about an email you have received, forward it to report@phishing.gov.uk.

Suspicious text messages should be forwarded to the number **7726** which is free of charge.

If you believe you have been the victim of fraud or identity theft, you should report this directly to Action Fraud either online or via phone on 0300 123 2040.

If you have any information relating to vaccine fraud you can report and stay 100% anonymous by contacting Crimestoppers COVID Fraud Hotline online or call 0800 587 5030.

The volunteers who were involved in setting up Tewin Stores will never forget the support that Roger gave us in the early days. Roger had run the shop for over 18 years until his retirement in 2000, but in 2007 when the shop lease was taken over by the village, Roger returned; cutting the ribbon at the formal opening ceremony on 21 February 2008 and then running the Post Office every weekday morning until ill health forced him to retire. We are truly grateful for all that Roger did for the shop, as well as for the village. His legacy lives on.

Roe Hill, Hilary Tipping, Damien Redlich and Wayne Rolfe were all reelected to the Committee. Judy Puddefoot continues as Minute Taker for the Committee Meetings. We were sorry to say goodbye to Brenda Barber who stepped down from the Committee after serving for many years.

Traditionally, our first event of the year is the annual Senior Citizens' Lunch. So, on 19th February, using funds raised at the 2019 Classic Car & Craft Show, we served a two-course lunch to 96 guests in the Memorial Hall. After the meal, our guests enjoyed a light-hearted quiz, followed by chocolates, tea & coffee. We delivered 4 meals to villagers who were unable to attend. This annual lunch is a very popular and well-established event in Tewin.
