PROPOSED NEW FOOTPATH ON HERTFORD ROAD



Thank you to everyone for your comments on this proposal. Due to the cancellation of the Parish Council meetings on 1st February and 1st March 2021 the discussion/decision will be postponed to the next meeting on 12th April 2021.

LAND OFF HERTFORD ROAD, Tewin 3/21/0104/FUL

Change of use of land, erection of stable block & fencing, creation of an exercise yard and hard standing with 3 car parking spaces and internal access way. Tewin Parish Council has submitted an objection to the application raising concerns over the openness of the green belt, safety concerns re the access, lack of screening and the importance of the ditch on the site in reducing flooding at Lousehole Bottom.

This application has been withdrawn by the applicant as they were advised that it was going to be refused by East Herts Council on the basis of Green Belt, Highway and other issues.

CAPTIVE BIRDS

Please be aware that England is still on lockdown in reference to captive birds as Bird Flu is still at a high level. Anyone with birds of all types, including chickens, must keep them in enclosed housing with a roof.

CHARGING FOR GREEN WASTE COLLECTION

As at 1st April 2021 East Herts Council will be introducing a chargeable garden waste collection fortnightly from your existing brown bin. The annual cost will be £49.

WATER SUPPLY ON LOWER GREEN

The Parish Council has agreed to install an underground water connection on Lower Green in order to water the Christmas tree. Affinity Water will be completing the connection and a separate contractor will be installing a manhole. **LITTER BIN COLLECTION**

East Herts Council empty the litter bins in Tewin and they have had temporary staffing shortages due to Covid which have meant that the bins have not been emptied on a weekly basis as per usual. The service should be back to normal soon.

REPLACEMENT OF 388 BUS SERVICE

The 388 Centrebus Welwyn Garden City to Ware bus service has been replaced by the 879 Reg's Coaches Welwyn - Presdales School which has been rerouted via Burnham Green and Tewin. The timetable is available to view on www.regscoaches.co.uk and annual, termly, half-termly and weekly tickets can also be purchased through their website.

A Saver card can be purchased online from Hertfordshire County Council (www.hertfordshire.gov.uk) for £20 pa for 11-19yr olds in Hertfordshire and it provides half price bus travel in Hertfordshire.

Maundy Money



Every Maundy Thursday, The Queen distributes special Maundy money to local pensioners in a service which commemorates Jesus' washing of the feet of the Apostles at the Last Supper.

The Maundy Service happens each year on the Thursday before Easter Sunday. In normal times, The Queen travels to a different cathedral or abbey each year to give gifts to local people. Unfortunately, due to the pandemic, the gifts were sent by post in 2020 and will presumably be distributed the same way this year.

During the service, The Queen distributes gifts according to the number of years she has lived. In 2021 she will distribute 95 pence worth of Maundy money to 95 men and 95 women in recognition of their contribution to the community and to the church.

The service dates back to 600AD and these special coins have kept much the same form since 1670. They still bear the portrait of Her Majesty designed for her coronation in 1953, even though the image on ordinary circulating coinage has since been changed four times.

The coins come in 4 denominations: a groat (4p), threepence (3p), half-groat (2p) and a penny (1p).

Each recipient of Maundy money is given two small leather purses by The Queen, one red and one white.

The first contains a small amount of ordinary coinage which symbolises the Sovereign's gift for food and clothing. The second purse contains Maundy coins up to the value of the Sovereign's age. The coins are legal tender but recipients normally prefer to retain them as a keepsake.

On The Farm

As I write this it is March, the month when things start to warm up and we put the clocks forward. The days become longer, the soil temperatures warm up and the dark, cold days of Winter are in past. As long as the ground is fit to travel with machines, fieldwork can resume.

Michael Gove says we have 30-40 harvests left in England on our land. What rubbish! Farmers are very aware of the need to look after our soil and soil health is paramount in all that we do on the land. We mix in the chopped straw stubble to enrich the soil. We had an acre of peas last year. After the peas had been harvested, we chopped and disced the residue into the soil for the next crop. Peas are a nitrogen fixing crop.

After a walk through the fields with my Agronomist, we assessed the crops for their growing potential. He commented that our crops have come through the winter very well. The first wheats are always a bit further forward than the second wheats so they have a little nitrogen and sulphur put on them now. After another very wet Winter, I'm lucky to have a gravel subsoil which acts as excellent drainage, but it can dry out very quickly in the Summer. If you have a farm with heavy clay you have to have it drained to take the water out of the soil into ditches.

By the time you read this in April, I should have given my wheat crops a fungicide treatment as there is a threat of Yellow Rust about. As our weather changes so much - too cold, too wet, too dry - disease pressure is always around. I have to spray to control the disease and in the spray will be plant food to keep the crop healthy through to the next growing stage.

The old saying goes that 'March comes in like a lamb and goes out like a lion'. The first few days of March this year were calm. We will have to see if it goes out like a lion!

A church at the heart of the village, with space for all

After two months of streaming services online, at long last we were pleased to welcome people back into church at the beginning of March. It was strange to hear the Reverend Edward Cardale, who was leading the service for us on 7th March, remind us that the last time we were in church for a service was at Christmas. Suddenly the Spring is with us, and it is as if Winter never happened. Looking back at the same time last year, we seem to be in a more positive frame of mind now. Last year we had just gone into lockdown and were setting up support for people who were unable to go out, keeping the shop open, continuing to give to Food Banks, and clapping for our carers. This year, at least the number of people diagnosed with Covid-19 is reducing, many have had their vaccination jabs, and our young people are back in school.

Thank you to those who have contributed personally to services in March – those who decorated baskets and made posies for Mothering Sunday, those who sang for us when the congregation could not do so as a whole and our clergy, who are so delighted to see people coming through the door! It has been a hard year for us all and it is not over yet. We continue to stream services every Sunday for those who cannot attend, and we have continued to hold the Lent Course on Zoom. The Lent Course, designed by colleagues in the Diocese of Norwich, has been challenging, covering six key issues for our time entitled home, work, waste, food, neighbour, and nature. For example, we have discussed the importance of "home" to us all and hence, homelessness. Under the issue of "work", we thought about modern slavery, while under "waste" we confronted again the issues around plastic and clothing waste products. It has been an excellent course including short videos and some very well documented topics.

We continue to hold in our prayers all those who have lost loved ones during this year from whatever cause. We pray for those whose livelihoods have been devastated and for those who have felt the pain of loneliness during the epidemic. Please light a candle at home each evening to remember those who have died and those who grieve their loss.

Our clergy are in contact with those self-isolating or unable to get out of the house, or with any bereaved families.

There seems to be light at the end of the tunnel. Many of us will already have had our first Covid-19 jab, and there are promising signs that sport, and especially tennis, will resume this summer. The Lawn Tennis Association has

announced its calendar of tournaments for 2021, beginning with the Nottingham Open on June 5, followed by Queens Club, the Birmingham Open and the Eastbourne International.

June is rounded off in the usual spectacular fashion with the start of Wimbledon fortnight. The big question for all these events is what level of spectating will be allowed, and that's something we'll only find out nearer to the time. The LTA remains "cautiously optimistic" that fans will be able to be present at all its summer events this year.

As far as Tewin Tennis Club play is concerned, the future is bright! The LTA has gone through the government road map, concluding:

- Outdoor tennis courts will be able to open from 29 March. This will mean recreational tennis will be able to resume, including singles and doubles social play, 1:1 coaching and formally organised activities for groups. This includes group coaching
- Indoor courts are to remain closed until later in the roadmap
- Tennis in schools can resume from 8 March

The court booking page has reopened on <u>www.tewintennisclub.co.uk</u>, and we are expecting a lot of pent up demand.

Sensibly, that doesn't mean responsibilities have changed one bit: "Social distancing has to be maintained before, during & after all outdoor tennis activity". So no high fives, and we'll have to wait another two weeks before we can retire for a relaxing drink outside the pub. It seems almost touchable.

Tewin Website Annual News Bulletin www.tewinvillage.co.uk for year ending December 2020

The website group met once during 2020 before the Covid-19 restrictions halted our face-to-face activities. However, that doesn't mean the website hasn't been reviewed or kept up-to-date during the year by members of the Website group.

The Home Page was re-designed to better reflect the needs of the community during the pandemic. We gave prominence to the services provided by Tewin Ladies Group and East Herts Citizens Advice. Information about Tewin Stores opening hours and the valuable services it provides was given centre stage.

The homepage also links to the "Tewin Chat" Facebook group, which was set up at the start of the first lockdown to give Tewin folk another way of talking to each other, and sharing information. This Facebook group is complementary to, but completely separate from the village website.

The Events Calendar which is usually situated at the top of the Home Page was moved lower down as all events were cancelled due to Covid-19.

The Banner photograph at the top of the Home Page is now changed quarterly with a seasonal image of Tewin.

There were 5,513 hits on the website during 2020. The average number of visitors to the site each month is 4,594, peaking in February at 9,929.
