CONSTRUCTION NOISE

Construction noise is part of development and therefore a restriction on working hours is often prescribed as part of their planning permission, however it can also be controlled by Environmental Health at East Herts Council. Generally the

Council would expect noisy work on construction and demolition sites to be limited to:

- Monday to Friday 07:30 to 18:30-hrs
- Saturday 07:30 to 13:00-hrs
- At no time on Sundays or Public Holidays

If you have concerns about the noise from a construction or demolition site you should contact East Herts Council on 01279 655261 and ask for the Environmental Health team. You can also report noise disturbance via the website www.eastherts.gov.uk and search for noise pollution.

This has now begun and the proposal is for Hertford Rural South to be renamed Hertford Rural and include both Tewin wards and with one East Herts Councillor rather than two. Closing date for comments is 9th May 2022.

On the Farm

As we get towards April, we hope the weather will improve, as we have lots of work to do. We did plan to sow Blue Peas on our land at Burnham Green, but decided against this because, all along one side of the 45 acres is woodland and those pigeons would play havoc with the crop. It's the worst thing possible on your most far away land to grow peas, so instead we plan to sow spring beans on the fields when the soil dries out a little. This crop is a nitrogen fixing crop plant, it needs no extra nitrogen to feed it, and will leave lots of goodness in the land for next year's wheat.

We use about 3 loads of nitrogen each year on our crops, except our beans. My costs have more than doubled to over £23,500 per load. Wow.

You know my thoughts about our Government's Agricultural Policy. In short our ability to produce food and thus to keep prices down, has been hampered by Government Policy urging us to go for rewilding and sowing crops for wildlife, and not food production. We in this country are only about 50% self sufficient in food production. So now we have the Russian invasion of Ukraine, which has the most fertile land in the world, and produces 30% of the World's wheat, and about 80% of global sunflower seeds. Their crops mainly end up in North African countries and the Middle East.

I hope this Ukraine crisis will act as a wake-up call to our Government, and they will instruct DEFRA to ensure that England increases its food security, and does not buy food from the other side of the world, as this will bring in huge increases in food costs.

As you might know I have let 2 acres of land, to Lloyd Harrison, our organic gardener. He aims to plant his first Early Potatoes in mid March, they will be available in June for his customers' Veg Boxes, and our restaurants at Tewin Bury Hotel. He is now planting a lot of strawberry plants and rhubarb plants. Broad beans, and peas will go out later in the month.

We all hope for a good summer.

Social Prescriber

Did you know that Bridge Cottage Surgery patients have access to a Social Prescriber?

The Social Prescriber can help patients obtain access to non-clinical community services, so anything in your lives that can't be prescribed in a medicine bottle or helped with a pill. They can help those who are socially isolated and put them in touch with local groups, or help them with things like finding debt advice, housing advice, carer support, benefit entitlement or applying for blue badges. A social prescriber provides a listening ear and can be a main point of contact for all the organisations out there and be a support for patients in finding their way through problems.

Social prescribing works for a wide range of people, including people: with one or more long-term conditions

who need support with their mental health

who are lonely or isolated

who have complex social needs which affect their wellbeing

Anyone in a surgery can make referrals to the Social Prescriber so patients can ask for support that way or you can contact HertsHelp directly (0300 123 4044) and they will make the referral to a Social Prescriber (Community Navigator may be another name you hear) or one of the Link workers in the scheme.

A life long puzzle...

I wonder if your household has been caught up in the recent craze of 'Wordle'? Wordling (if such a word exists) has very much taken off in the Vicarage. Phrases such 'wordled in two today, might well be the peak of my day' or 'only just got it in six, clearly not awake yet' have become common parlance. For those of you who have evaded the obsession so far, it's a bit like that game of mastermind you might have played with a child where the aim is to guess the colours of the pegs hidden at the top of the board by your opponent, only in Wordle, you're guessing a five letter word in six tries. Fortunately for productivity levels, there's only one issued every day and so the obsession is kept well in check. Of course there are many things that we solve a letter or number at a time. Some of you might be daily crossword or sudoku solvers and know the joy of plugging away at a new puzzle in the paper each day.

It strikes me that Easter, although technically a letter too long of course, is itself rather like a Wordle. Somehow, another year has passed and here we are again trying to make sense of a great mystery. Having another shot at it. Guessing at what makes up its meaning. Using our previous experiences and our knowledge to try and understand it. Coming at it each year from a slightly different angle, sometimes feeling that we 'get it in one' and it all makes sense. Other times wondering if we understand it at all. And as with Easter so with life. Each of us wakes up and tries again each and every day. Some days the sense of where we're going and how we ought to get there is clear, on other days it's all a bit of a mystery and we just have to hope that tomorrow is that bit easier. Sometimes, we notice things we haven't seen before and we feel that progress has been made that will help us, not just Today, but in the long run. Always there is the very real chance that we will be utterly surprised by something completely unexpected. It's reassuring, to me anyway, to know that faith and life don't always have to make obvious sense. As St Paul put it - now we see through a glass darkly.

But my prayer for each of us this Easter, is that when the answer to our struggles seems beyond our grasp, we would encounter the mystery of Christ resurrected and despite the unknowns in life be able to trust in his unstoppable love.

St Peter's News

A church at the heart of the village, with space for all

I am sure I speak for us all when I say we have all been very shocked by the happenings in Ukraine and the need to support the thousands of people who have lost everything and are fleeing for their lives. The churches in the UK have been working with all aid agencies to send food and goods to those countries accepting refugees. All the churches in the Welwyn team collected bedding, food and toiletries and Susannah was moving van loads of material to Tewin Cowper school, where a Ukrainian parent was organising a delivery through her contacts. Thank you to everyone who kindly contributed to that appeal. The vigil at St Mary's ,Welwyn on Shrove Tuesday raised £1,000, which is fantastic, and we continue to pray for refugees everywhere.

At the end of February, my fellow Churchwarden, Nick Whiting, our Verger, Pete Johnson and I met Michael Dales, who has been our diocesan architect for more than a decade, to sign off the repairs done for the 2018 Quinquennial. Michael had just come from another church where the lead on the roof had been stolen and the security cameras smashed twice, and now their churchyard was covered in fallen trees. We had one tree down in the gales and very little damage. Hearing Michael's news, we felt very fortunate.

The Quinquennial inspection takes place every five years (the clue is in the name) so we are coming up to the next Quinquennial in 2023. St Peter's, Tewin is in good repair, but we are conscious that we need to modernise our church and make it fit for the 21st century. We are planning to install new lighting this year and we are looking at new ways to heat the church.

I spent a week in Suffolk this month and took the opportunity to look at many churches there. Most of their village churches, built in the Middle Ages with money from the wool trade, are considerably larger than ours. Some are sadly quite uncared for, while others, with rather expensive seating, are being used for many community purposes as well as regular worship. We went to a delightful lunchtime concert at a huge church in Bungay where I spent much of the time feeling grateful that our church may be a bit chilly at times but at least it is not a huge space to heat!

Our Lent course has been well attended this month. Those who have read the book A Place for God by Bishop Graham James, former Bishop of Norwich, which has been the basis for discussion, have found it to be easy and interesting reading. We have been pleased to see yet more people returning to take part in our Sunday services. The churchyard is full of flowers with blossom on the trees. Now we are looking forward to Easter, trying to take our minds off the events elsewhere in the world. A full list of services is here in the magazine and on the village website. We hope families will come to enjoy a Craft and Egg Hunt in the churchyard on Saturday 9th April 2.30 – 4.30pm. The blessing of the palms will take place the following day – Palm Sunday. There will be services at St Peter's on Good Friday and Easter Sunday and at other churches in the Welwyn team. All are welcome to give thanks with us for the bright spring weather and to ask for help and support for Ukraine and other places of unrest in the world.

Covid has not gone away. Friends who have so far been untouched by the virus are now suffering, albeit not seriously. But it reminds me that we still need to stay vigilant and respectful of others, including in church, and to pray for those affected. Our clergy are still in contact with those self-isolating or unable to get out of the house, or with any bereaved families.
