Jubilee Thanksgiving Service Sunday 5th June, 12 Noon

As part of Tewin's village Jubilee celebrations, a thanksgiving service for the Queen's Platinum Jubilee will take place at 12 Noon on Sunday 5th June at Upper Green, Tewin. All welcome.

On the Farm

I am writing this article in mid May, which you will not read until early June.

Our life is dominated by the weather. The last 4 weeks have been completely dry, with hardly any rain. Weather like this forces crop growth stages, like today, the 9th of May, I'm walking through our fields of growing crops with my Agronomist Martin Harwood. He is my main crop advisor, he gives me all the latest information. We were surprised to find the Flag Leaf poking through the stem of a wheat plant, it will be fully out in a week or 10 days. We must look after this leaf because it controls the plant. It must be kept clean and free from disease, as it feeds the ear and determines the grain size. I will spray the wheat with a Broad Spectrum Fungicide, also another Trace Element Spray of Magnesium and Copper, all sprays are Bee Safe! Wheat crops at the moment have a lovely dark green colour. The heavy dews in the morning keep the crops growing on, the leaf is like Blotting Paper, so it soaks in the moisture every morning, and feeds the plant, and keeps it growing in a drought.

Our Naked Oat crop this year is sown in the valley of Range Field and Cooks Fields. They look quite well as the land in those fields is nice loamy soil which retains the moisture. Our only spring sown crop this year is spring beans, at Burnham Green. They were sown early in good conditions, but would at the moment love a night's rain! They are just about holding their own.

We are now selling our last few loads of wheat. It was sold for a good milling price, but with every load of fertiliser (29 tons), costing $\pounds 25,000$, it needs to be.

I think the Ukrainian war will be remembered for a very long time to come, and the effect it will have on agriculture, and the cost of living throughout the country.

St Peter's News

A church at the heart of the village, with space for all

It is cloudy and grey today as I write this. April has been a beautiful month but now we are all saying how much we wish it would rain. The footpaths are hard and cracking, and our gardens need water. The lovely weather on the Saturday before Easter brought many families to the churchyard to enjoy an Easter Hunt and a crafts afternoon. The church looked magnificent on Easter Sunday after the plainness of Lent, with all the wonderful flower arrangements. To these were added the Easter garden planted by the children and the bunting and stained-glass windows also created by them. It was a joyous occasion with the bells ringing out and the service led by Edward, at very short notice, as poor Susannah tested positive for Covid on Maundy Thursday. We missed her of course but were glad to see the church full for the Easter services on Good Friday and Easter Sunday.

On Palm Sunday Mick led the congregation in a reading of the Passion according to Luke.

Seeing and hearing the story of the run up to the crucifixion in this way is always very moving and an appropriate way to start this important week in the life of the church. On Good Friday we held a beautiful service, planned by Susannah, but led in her absence by Mick, which included readings from the Liturgy with music and hymns for the Passion.

On Easter Sunday Edward Cardale stepped in to take the service. We began taking wine again with the bread for Holy Communion. The priest intincts (dips) the wafer in the wine before giving it into the hands of the communicant. Another small step back towards normal ways of worship.

Our **Annual Parochial Church Meeting** took place after church on Sunday 1st May. Another year has passed, and we have reviewed all that has happened here at St Peter's during 2021/2. We elected our PCC and re-elected our Churchwardens – Nick Whiting and me. Susannah preached about the ways in which we want the church to go during the next twelve months. St Peter's is the only church in the Welwyn team without an accessible toilet. We do have one next door to the vestry, but it is not really accessible, especially when we have large groups of people here for special services. And it is the only church in the team, apart from Ayot St Peter, without a designated Meeting Room close by the church. We have nowhere to meet and greet people who come for regular morning services or for funerals, weddings, and

baptisms. We want a space near the church which can be used for educational purposes, where we can hold meetings, Harvest lunches, bible study, choir practice, coffee mornings, and where young people can gather. Believe it or not, St Peter's have been thinking about doing this for about 40 years. Will 2022 be the year it starts to happen? With the help of everyone in the church and village community, we hope so. And we will be sharing our hopes and dreams for this in the coming months.

Special thanks are due this month to Susan and David Hall, two of our bellringers, who have donated a new flag for the tower. The original finally died in the winter gales. Can I also remind you that we have a Remembrance Book in the display cabinet by the South Door in which anyone who dies here but is not buried in the churchyard may be commemorated for a small donation to church funds.

A reminder that the church will be participating in the village Jubilee events with an **Open-Air Service on Upper Green on Sunday 5th June at noon** which will precede the fun and games afternoon for children and families that day. The **SAVoce choir** will be holding another **concert at 3pm on Sunday 12 June in the church,** followed by tea and cake. Free entry but with a retiring collection in aid of the church and the Ukrainian appeal.

Covid is still around us with several members of the congregation finding they have tested positive for the virus. So please take care and look after yourselves. Our clergy continue to support those with Long Covid, or who are self-isolating, and any families who are bereaved or in poor spirits. If you need to, please get in touch with
