#### **PLANNING**

**3/22/1555/OUT – Land East of Upper Green Road, Tewin** - Outline planning application for erection of 4 three bedroom detached bungalows together with creating two new vehicular accesses - all matters reserved except for access. New plans

for the entrances have been submitted – *Tewin Parish Council have requested a 3D image.* 

**3/22/0254/FUL – Land South of Churchfield Road, Tewin** - Change of use of agricultural barn to one bedroom short-term holiday accommodation. Alterations to openings and installation of wood burner and flue – *TPC have raised concerns about the access to the site being over Common Land CL147 which is in the custody of Tewin Parish Council. No legal permission will be granted for re-surfacing the entrance with bound gravel or tarmac. Tewin Parish Council will not grant any legal permission for work on existing vegetation on Common Land CL147 to create or maintain a visibility splay nor will it guarantee that vegetation on CL147 will not increase in the future.* 

#### **HIGHWAYS**

All the outstanding Highways issues below were raised with Herts County Councillor, Ken Crofton, and Hope Merriman, Highways Engineer, who will endeavour to chase these up but cannot guarantee anything. Works have already been started on the leaking gulley on Orchard Road. Outstanding issues include: Upper Green Road Broken Birdsmouth Fencing, Churchfield Road Potholes, Lousehole Bottom Cut In Clearance, Upper Green Road Blocked Gullies and Orchard Road Leaking Gulley.

#### 204 BUS

Centrebus is now the new provider for the 204 service and there will be no change to the Service.

#### **TEWIN PARISH COUNCIL AUDIT**

The Parish Council auditors PKF Littlejohn advised that, whilst the AGAR has been submitted with supporting documentation prior to 30 September 2022, PKF have not been able to complete their review work in time to enable to Tewin Parish Council to publish the required documentation in line with statutory requirements. Once they have completed their review a final report will be provided with the certificate of completion detailing any qualifications and 'other' matters. In the interim a statement from PKF has been published on the Tewin Village website.

#### Work on the Farm

During the summer we plan our crops for autumn sowing thinking about what will give us the best returns. Since the first rain for many months on the 18th of August, it's been a joy to plough and cultivate our land. We got Chris, our hedge cutter man, to cut our roadside hedges after the 1st of Sept as before that we are banned from cutting hedges by Government Policy. I like to make the approach to the village look attractive and cared for.

We plan to grow a large area of peas this spring and, with our sown naked oats, it will be our break crop for the coming season. Wheat will be sown on the rest of the arable land. This is in high demand at the moment due to the Ukrainian situation. There is a particular need for milling wheat. There has been a new mill built in Harlow, and of course they want local milling wheat. We are also very lucky to have a company in Welwyn Garden City which takes in a very large amount of feed wheat for use as pet food and animal food.

Drilling our crops, including our new land, which I will report on next month, started on the 25th of September with the heavy land at Brickendon and finished on the 12th of October. We have never known such a perfect drilling season as we have just had. Lovely sunny, still days in which drilling followed by rolling, and spraying made a perfect seed bed and hopefully a good crop next year. An old Farm Saying is ' if the ice will bear a man before Christmas, it will not bear a mouse afterwards'. Ivor Williams.

#### Avian Flu

A new Avian Influenza National Prevention Zone (AIPZ) has been put in place by the government across the whole of Great Britain, with specific bio Security requirements for ALL keepers of all poultry (including game birds). There are different requirements depending on the number of poultry being kept commercially and backyard owners with smaller numbers of poultry including chickens, ducks and geese must also take steps to limit the risk of the disease spreading to their animals.

The AIPZ now in force across Great Britain does not include a nationwide legal requirement to house birds. However, this is being kept under constant review and in Hertfordshire we are close to the area already covered by the regional housing order.

Backyard owners are encouraged to voluntarily register with the Animal and Plant Health Agency (APHA). To register and receive updates go to **https://tinyurl.com/Poultry-Registration.**

#### **St Peter's News**

A church at the heart of the village, with space for all

It is a month since Her Late Majesty Queen Elizabeth died, as I write this. Where have those weeks gone? It seems an age ago. For the church here, it was a busy time – hoisting the flag at half mast, ringing the bells, putting out the Book of Condolence and arranging a special Service of Commemoration for the day before the funeral at Westminster Abbey. A special thank you to the bellringers for their efforts around this time. And Susannah was away on a long-arranged holiday just after the Queen died. She was still texting me and Nick from the plane, I think, to make sure we had everything in hand!

And then, we had made all these arrangements for Harvest Festival! Should we, shouldn't we go ahead with it? And in the end, we did – Mick Simmons led a service for about sixty adults and twenty children on Lower Green. It wasn't a very nice day, but Ivor brought his tractor and trailer and the children climbed all over it. He also read the lesson, something he has been doing for our Harvest Festivals for nigh on sixty years. The Carley family brought bales of straw. Some children, and their parents from Tewin Cowper sang to us. The Clarkes and the Hatts poured Pimm's and soft drinks and Paul Griggs entertained us all while we ate our picnics afterwards. Thank you to all for their support. In the evening we had a contemplative service celebrating the Queen's life of duty and service to our nation and the Commonwealth.

At Harvest Festival we raised over £373 for famine relief in East Africa and the flood victims in Pakistan and took a carload of tins and dried goods to the Food Shed in Stevenage. Thank you to all who contributed to this. And thank you to those who signed the Book of Condolence, which will be sent to the diocese in due course, and who left flowers at the church.

# We are organising an **Open Day for the village to consider** "A new vision for St Peter's". This is on Saturday 5<sup>th</sup> November from 10am to 4pm at Tewin Memorial Hall.

We want to consult the village about how we shape the future for the church in the coming years. We need to agree on the way forward to make our church eco-friendly, to improve the way it is heated, to make it easier for everyone to access toilets and baby changing facilities and to provide better space for us to welcome people to the church. Please come along and see the scale of the problem and give your views on whether we should go ahead with proposals for a new community meeting room. In preparation for our Open Day, the PCC, and other members of the congregation, met for an Awayday at Church House by St Mary's ,Welwyn on the 8<sup>th</sup> October where we heard about the many initiatives in the diocese to combat climate change. Rachel Johnston, the volunteer Diocesan Environmental Officer, gave an interesting presentation on ways in which we can make a difference and the way that the church can lead in caring for our environment. St Peter's is one of 92 churches in the St Albans diocese that is registered for the Eco Church scheme and is working towards a Bronze award for this. It is an important milestone on our journey to become net zero carbon by 2030.

We are waiting for permission from the diocese to have the church clock cleaned and repaired. At the same time, we intend to have an autowinder and a pendulum regulator for the clock installed. The clock keeps good time but that is partly thanks to David Hall, Captain of the Bell Tower, who bravely climbs up into the tower once a week to wind the clock. We have money set aside for this and for the new lighting. Everything takes a while in the church as we must ensure we do not break any rules in making changes in the church. It can be frustrating to get anything done but at least you may be sure nothing is done unless it has been thoroughly examined by the great and the good on behalf of the church authorities as well as the caring public.

On the first Sunday in **November (6<sup>th</sup>)** there will be a normal service of Holy Communion in the morning at 9.30am, followed by the service **for All Souls at 6.30pm**. This is a service which many people value where they can come together to commemorate their loved ones who may have passed away recently or many years ago. All are welcome. The following Sunday (13<sup>th</sup>) will be **Remembrance Day** when we commemorate those who died in time of war. Again, all are welcome at 10.50am by the War Memorial at the church.

#### **Antibiotic Resistance**



The overuse of antibiotics in recent years means they're becoming less effective and has led to the emergence of "superbugs". These are strains of bacteria that have developed resistance to many different types of antibiotics. These types of infections can be serious and challenging to treat, and are becoming an increasing cause of disability and death across the world.

The biggest worry is that new strains of bacteria may emerge that cannot be treated by any existing antibiotics.

Both the NHS and health organisations across the world are trying to reduce the use of antibiotics, especially for health problems that are not serious.

What You Can Do to fight antibiotic resistance and to protect yourself from infection:

**Don't take antibiotics unless you're certain you need them**. An estimated 30% of the millions of prescriptions written each year are not needed. Always ask your doctor if antibiotics will really help. For illnesses caused by viruses -- common colds, bronchitis, and many ear and sinus infections -- they won't.

**Finish your pills**. Take your entire prescription exactly as directed. Do it even if you start feeling better. If you stop before the infection is completely wiped out, those bacteria are more likely to become drug-resistant.

Get vaccinated. Immunisations can protect you against some diseases that are treated with antibiotics. They include tetanus and whooping cough.

**Stay safe in the hospital**. Antibiotic-resistant bacteria are commonly found in hospitals. Make sure your caregivers wash their hands properly. Also, ask how to keep surgical wounds free of infection.
