Winter On the Farm

I commented in December that we have put the farm and crops to bed for a couple of months, and that's exactly what has happened. Through December we had 5 ins of snow and very hard frosts. Hard frosts and snow do the winter crops no harm at all, it checks any disease that might be on the plant leaves. At the moment all it seems to do is rain, huge amounts which will build up in the aquifer to support the River Mimram for the next couple of years. The river is now in full spate. An old farming saying is *February fill dykes*, and that's what is happening this winter. The first Monday after the 6th of January is known as Plough Monday. It was traditionally the day on which work on the land was resumed, and strangely we still have 60 acres still to plough for spring crops, but that's due to the wet winter. By the next time I write, we hope the peas will be planted.

This month's film on Monday 20th February is *The Duke (2020)*, directed by the late Roger Michell and starring Helen Mirren and Jim Broadbent with Matthew Goode in a supporting role.

Tewin Cowper School



'Hide and Seek' games at Tewin Cowper School will have some new hiding spots for years to come, with the recent planting of two trees. John Sheridan kindly helped the children plant a wild cherry and small leaved lime tree at the southern end of the playing field in December. The trees were provided as part of the Queen's Green Canopy initiative, which was set up before the death of Her Majesty and has recently been extended, with volunteers planting over a million trees as a living legacy to her memory. Team Vicar's Letter

God is love, and those who live in love live in God, and God lives in them. 1 John 4:16

February - a favourite month for chocolate shops and florists as lovers mark St Valentine's day. A day of joy for those in the throws of romantic love, a day of indifference for many who resent its commercialism, and a day of hurt for some who for whatever reason might find romance to be a painful topic at present in their lives.

I'm writing this letter on the day that the BBC has published the headline 'Church of England bishops refuse to back gay marriage', or if you prefer the bishops have published their own headline that perhaps reads a little more affirmingly 'Bishops propose prayers of thanksgiving, dedication and for God's blessing on same-sex couples'.

It is ten years since same-sex marriage has been legal in the UK, but at the point the Marriage Act was changed it remained illegal for Church of England priests to conduct same-sex marriages. It was felt that the church, which is immensely broad in its political and theological viewpoints, should have time to come to a closer agreement before this would be permissible. They have been a difficult and painful ten years, and many Christians (myself included) have longed for the day when all those who would like to marry in church (regardless of sexuality) might be welcomed. Alas that hope is yet to be realised – although the new provision of allowing a blessing in church of a same-sex civil marriage is a step in the right direction.

There are reasons why the church is slow with its workings out, but I am deeply sorry that this process has been so hard for many good friends, including within our villages, congregations and fellow clergy.

"I would not worship a God who is homophobic and that is how deeply I feel about this ...I am as passionate about this (the UN campaign to back LGBT+ rights) as I ever was about apartheid. For me it is at the same level" The late, great Archbishop Desmond Tutu.

A church at the heart of the village, with space for all

It seems my computer was not as daft as I thought when it predicted snow for us in December! There was a lot of snow! It made the church driveway very icy and walking into church for the Annual Carol Service was quite dangerous. It is always a surprise when the rain chases it away almost as soon as it comes. The Christmas services were otherwise uneventful except that the church clock kept stopping and we muddled some of the hymn numbers on Christmas Day. Many apologies to those who came that day to sing jolly carols and were disappointed.

Susannah has had a nasty cold and cough over Christmas and New Year from which we are all hoping she has fully recovered. Nevertheless, she was there for a very well attended Crib Service which was on Christmas Eve afternoon with 27 children all wanting to find the characters for the Nativity, and she kept going for a memorable Midnight Mass in the evening. Fortunately, the Rev. Susan Marsh led the Christmas Day service and Epiphany two weeks later. Epiphany is the day on which we celebrate the coming of the Magi to see the baby Jesus, as described in the gospel of St Matthew. This year its celebration coincided with the Sunday on which we celebrate the Baptism of Christ, thirty years later, by John the Baptist. Susan was assisted by Mick Simmons, our Reader, who managed to preach two sermons to cover both events. Epiphany commemorates the manifestation of Christ to the Gentiles, or Magi, and is celebrated in many countries on 6 January with feasting and presents and is as important as Christmas Day in those places. One New Year I was visiting my French penfriend's family on this day, and we were eating vast hams and cakes until 2 in the morning.

Thank you to the team led by David Rawlins that has been tidying the leaves in the churchyard. Most of the work in the churchyard is done

by Pete Johnson, our Verger. You can see her out most days in all but the worst of weathers, clipping and weeding and, when the wind is in the right direction, even having a bonfire. Many thanks also to all those people who give their time to beautifying the church with flowers or keeping it clean. Over Christmas and New Year, the church flowers were spectacular. Thank you to Clare Rawlins for once again decorating our tree, kindly donated once again by Ivor and Linda Williams.

Nick Whiting, my fellow Churchwarden, is also often busy in the churchyard. He has in hand to re-erect a couple of gravestones which have fallen over this winter and he is getting the wobbly gate post at the end of the drive replaced. These are essential jobs which can be grappled with fairly easily. What we both find increasingly mysterious is the software associated with applying for permissions to do things in the church. I used to think I was getting old when all the policemen looked like they had just left school. Now I know I am an older person because I find dealing with banks, chatbots, multiple telephone choices, and complicated computer forms all a great faff!!

A happy, healthy and prosperous New Year to all in Tewin and our thanks to those of you who helped to make our New Year's Eve Celebration a success by welcoming in the New Year with us.

Although the bowling season ended in September the Club's winter calendar has been in full swing. Carpet Bowls on a Monday night, Art Class on a Wednesday morning, Bridge on Thursday afternoons (every other week) and Table Tennis on Friday nights. The bar is open as normal on Friday nights and Sunday lunch times. The monthly Quiz Nights have resumed. These are well-supported by members and Tewin residents alike and bring in much needed revenue for the Club. Sunday Lunches are limited on numbers to members and Club Patrons on a first come first served basis.

Although the Green closed at the end of September work on it has not stopped. At the beginning of October the autumn renovation of the green was carried out by a company specializing in turf care. The renovation work consists of five stages,

Stage 1. The green is mechanically spiked to a depth of 120mm,

Stage 2. Dethatched to a depth of 40mm to remove most of the dead grass which has built up during the bowling season.

Stage 3. 75kg of specialized grass seed is spread across the green,

Stage 4. 5 tons of top dressing is spread across the green.

Stage 5. Three x 25kg bags of fertilizer are spread across the green. The green is then left for three to four weeks to allow the seed to root. In November and under normal conditions the green would be cut every other week until the warmer weather in April, but with the higher than normal temperatures we have been experiencing it has been necessary to cut every week. The warm and wet conditions have led to another problem, fungus, to which fine grasses are susceptible. The green has been hit hard this autumn/winter and will take some months to recover, however work has to continue to insure a good playing surface in the spring. If you would like to find out more on the subject pop into the club and ask for Rob. I cannot promise to have all the answers as I am learning myself, but am always happy to meet prospective new members!!

If you would like to try your hand at any of the winter activities then just pop along to the club on the day or evening when they are taking place and you will be sure to be given a warm welcome.
