St Peter's Church Kneelers

In 1988 the old sawdust-filled kneelers used by the choir were replaced with tapestry designs depicting the life and countryside of Tewin by members of the village. So impressive were the final results it was thought all kneelers should be replaced following the same theme, so in 1998 sewing began again as a Millennium celebration.

Some 65 volunteers, male and female, aged between 11 and 75 years made their own design, assisted by Elisabeth Buchanan, who ensured the design had the correct perspective and proportions whilst Peter Walters was busy making frames for the stitchers to ensure even tension.

Audrey Walters upholstered new planks, which would be hinged to the wooden kneeler lengths that husband Peter meticulously renovated, enabling the tapestries to be lifted up to use the foot-rest. The individual kneelers were sewn together into lengths of 4', 6' and 10'. For continuity, the aisle end of each length has alternating 'AD2000' and 'MM'. The opposite end has a set of St Peter's keys which are all slightly different.

The first completed kneeler was dedicated in January 2000 and sewing continued. Following Peter's death in April 2009, Ken Feakes completed the remaining wood supports. The final kneeler length was dedicated in September 2009 by Rev. Coralie McCluskey.

#### <u>PAVILION REFURBISHMENT</u> : PLEASE TAKE EXTRA CARE WITH DOGS AND CHILDREN AROUND THE PA-VILION DURING THE TIME OF THE REFURBISHMENT. EVERY EFFORT WILL BE MADE TO ENSURE THE SITE IS SECURE.

#### PLAYGROUND

The playground will still be open during the Pavilion refurbishment however the playground may be shut for 24hrs in order to carry out remedial works on the gates sometime during the summer.

#### SPRING HOUSE MEDICAL CENTRE, Ascots Lane, Welwyn Garden City AL7 4HL

This is a new type of GP-run medical centre, with extended opening hours and open access. The service is free to anyone eligible for NHS care and open **365 days** from **8.00am to 8.00pm** enabling you to be seen by a doctor or nurse at a time convenient to you, including for routine matters. It is hoped this will mean patients take less time off work simply to see the doctor or nurse.

You **do not need to register with the centre to be seen**, and remain mainly with your current practice and GP as this would be for occasional use only. However, you may **register** at the practice to use the full range of services that would be offered by any modern GP surgery. In this case you would need to move from your current GP.

The Centre is a brand new building opposite QE2 hospital in Welwyn Garden City, on a single level, with full disabled access and loop induction facilities. Disabled parking is available. The car park is adequate in size, but **you may need to pick up a coupon from reception and put visible through the windscreen** - to allow parking while using the Centre itself, not the hospital! You can walk in without an appointment and wait to be seen but, **you may wish to phone in advance**, so you know of any waiting time. Registered patients may pre-book an appointment.

The centre will not normally have access to medical records for unregistered patients so it's important you answer the doctor's questions fully. Details from your appointment will be sent to your own surgery keeping your medical records complete. Medical records of registered patients will be kept at the centre.

Spring House Medical Centre aims to work in partnership with you to help you maintain your own health and manage any health conditions. eg a 'patient self-management' room for you to measure your height, weight and blood pressure with health information available. Just 'drop-in' to use this service, no need to ring.

Spring House Medical Centre is run by Ephedra Healthcare (an organisation set up by the eight GP practices in Welwyn & Hatfield area) in partnership with East & North Herts PCT.
