A Message from Coralie

You cause the grass to grow for the cattle, and plants for people to use, to bring forth food from the earth, and wine to gladden the human heart, oil to make the face shine and bread to strengthen the human heart. Psalm 104:14-15

The Church has always played an important role at this time of the year in connecting all God's people, the land and the food that it produces through Harvest. There is a growing interest in food production and cooking. The media has got in on the act with a vast array of glossy magazines weighing down the shelves of newsagents and a proliferation of foodie and gardening television programmes. There is too an increased demand for allotments or, as they are sometimes called, leisure plots.

Fair Trade is important in developing countries and many church congregations have pledged to use only fairly-traded tea, coffee and chocolate.

This year Harvest Festival coincides with British food fortnight (18th September-3rd October). The aim of the campaign is to raise our awareness of the diverse and delicious food that Britain produces and the benefits, not least the reduction in air miles, and pleasure of eating quality, fresh, seasonal and regional produce. It also hopes to encourage us to buy locally produced food where available and to support the British market.

At St Peter's Church on Sunday 19th September we will be celebrating Harvest Festival at 11am, *Family Communion* and 6.30pm, *Evensong*. Following the morning service there is a Harvest Lunch at the school. There are lists at the back of the church to sign up and further details in this Parish News.

I do hope that you will join me for one of the services and the harvest lunch as we give thanks for our good harvest and all that is good in our lives.

Again on a brighter note, Terry Brown has worked extremely hard in the churchyard and the whole of the eastern end is looking very tidy. Many thanks, Terry! Other work proceeding included the inspection of our whole electrical system for which we obtain a certificate every five years. Those of you so used to seeing Pete working in the churchyard but missed her recently, have no fear, she should be back from her well earned holiday by the time you read this.

Now for some future events. On 5th September, the last of the Summer Evensongs will be at St Peter's at 6.30pm, when Coralie will conclude this series which has been on 'Journeys'.

Tewin Bell Ringers Outing

Friday 9th July saw us set off for our annual outing, this time to Ashbourne in the Peak District. The Hotel, built in 1901, still had many old features and a very friendly welcoming atmosphere. Altogether 18 of us arrived, with David and Mark making it to ringing practice at Brassington.



The following morning we set off to the first church in Rocester village with a ground floor ring of eight bells. We were met here by Bill and Eileen, [Marion Meads' son and daughter-in-law], and Alan and Wendy, [Audrey's son and daughter-in law], who live in the area. From Rocester we went to Alton (of Alton Towers fame), where Alan and Wendy live. This was another eight bell ring with a short climb to the ringing balcony. The last church was at Ellastone. We always have an unforgettable tower, this was it! The bells were a 13cwt six and hard going! The climb to the ringing chamber was very steep and the tread of each step quite high. The redeeming feature was a small door in the tower ringing chamber that opened into the main church and an amazing view of the rafters.

We left Ellastone, Staffordshire, on into Derbyshire, and the village of Osmaston. 'The Shoulder of Mutton' was our base with lovely lunch, and more than generous portions.

First ring of the afternoon in Osmaston, an upstairs ring of six weighing 16cwt where the person due to meet us failed to show, but we found a phone number for the Bell Captain who let us in! Though the bells were heavy they were lovely to ring. We were allowed access to the church and the vestry was to die for ... hexagonal design with a wooden raftered ceiling and a working fireplace. Next was Brailsford, where we had an impromptu hand bell practice in the churchyard attracting an audience from the nearby fete. Inside Church, another upstairs ring of six bells with lovely kneelers including some with the bell ringing method lines on them! Last ring of the day was at Muggington on a hilltop with beautiful views, and a ground floor ring of six. Interesting features were a bell wheel and clock mechanism on view in church, outside was an extremely old, hollow yew tree.

On Sunday where else could we go but Alton Towers! We deposited the usual birthday cake in a locker while the younger generation went off together for their own rides.

The more adventurous adults went on '*Rita*', a ride that catapults you to 100 kmh in 2.5 seconds followed by the '*Rapids*', guaranteed to soak you, and it did! The average age in our '*Rapids*' boat was 55 years. The bravest went on to '*Nemesis*', the less brave on a cable car over to the '*Nemesis*' entrance where we met up. The fearless adults went on a ride called '*Air*', which gives you the feeling of flying. When we'd completed as many rides as we could manage we headed for a café but the combination of a complex order, a warped tray, milk in a jug flask and a wind blowing out the candles on the birthday cake left us in peals of laughter. We all had a lovely outing, the weather sunny but not too hot. We arrived home in good time despite the exit from the British Grand Prix at Silverstone.

Where next year you ask? Well the hotel seemed to like us as they are happy to have us



back and Alan said we can go to Alton Towers again if we like we shall have to see.

Good news! Sales of the history book, including advance sales and those made at the Book Launch on 7th December 2009, together with subsequent sales, now total 636 copies.

On behalf of the Book Group and the Editor, I should like to thank everyone for their wonderful support, especially all

those who have purchased copies for themselves and for friends and relatives. Tewin Stores Post Office has sent books all over the country and across the world and we have heard a number of stories about those who've received a copy. For example, The Reverend Blamire Brown (St Peter's Church, Tewin from 1958 - 1975), was given a copy by his daughter, Jane, for his 80+ birthday, which gave him immense pleasure. Another book was given to Stanley Darton, the Village policeman in the 1970's and 80's, by his daughter on his birthday. Stanley, now in his 80's too, was thrilled with his gift.

We owe a special 'thank you' to Tewin Stores, who have sold 55 copies of the book since the beginning of January. In addition, Tewinbury Farm has sold 3 copies, Tebbutts Stores 2, and the remainder have been sold by members of the Book Group. We still have a number of books available, so more customers are very welcome! All the profits from the sales are given to the Tewin Memorial Hall for its maintenance fund. To date, we have been able to give the Hall £4,000.

Finally, I should like to thank my fellow members of the Book Group - Linda Adams, Jean Canton, Michael Clark, Mary Gregg, Patrick Holden, John Lee, Rosemary Nodder, Ben Roberts, Lilian Southgate, and Patricia Klijn (Editor), who, from our first meeting in March 2006, gave freely of their time over the following $3\frac{1}{2}$ years to produce '*The History of Tewin*'. They were always happy and fruitful meetings - sometimes fortified by 'a little something' to celebrate a birthday (or some other excuse) - and everyone then went home to do more research and more writing for their allotted chapters. We are pleased so many folks are enjoying our efforts and that the Memorial Hall - and therefore the village - now benefits.
