## THACS Autumn Show on Saturday 7th September 2013

Congratulations to all the exhibitors at the Autumn Show this year. This was the 12<sup>th</sup> annual Autumn Show and it attracted 40 exhibitors who entered 290 exhibits. Although the number of exhibitors was lower than at last year's autumn show, the number of exhibits was up, mainly due to a significant increase in the number of exhibits in the vegetables & fruit class.

Adult entries in the main hall included an array of lovely flowers and arrangements, an impressive range of fruit and vegetables, knitting, pottery, jewellery and a mouth-watering display of culinary delights. The Parish Room housed a full display of photographs and art work so I hope that you got to see that too.

Entries from children also covered a wide range of skills. Their horticultural class included collages of leaves, miniature gardens and flower arrangements whilst their arts and crafts involved painting and model-making. Culinary exhibits included chocolate cornflake cakes, decorated cup cakes and sausage rolls and there were also photographs of flowers, creepy-crawlies and grandparents.

Our thanks go to Tewin Cowper School (Summer Club), Tewin Under 5's Pre-School and Tewin Tiny-Tots Pre-School for making three lovely friezes which we used to decorate the hall.

## Visit to Wrest Park House and Gardens on Wednesday 31<sup>st</sup> July 2013

The visit to Wrest Park was very interesting and everything went smoothly. The group of 38 people left Tewin at 9:30 with eager anticipation about the visit but apprehension about the dubious weather. The weather forecast was for persistent rain but we were lucky enough to just experience occasional light drizzle (and one heavy shower when most of the group were inside having lunch!).

Twenty-nine people had opted to go on the guided tour of the gardens in the morning, so they were split into two groups with their own guides. The two tours set off at the same time, taking different routes to avoid delays and crowding. The tours were relaxed, informal and interesting. The tour guides were very knowledgable and they illustrated some of their historical comments with displays from their extensive folder of photographs.

After lunch, some of the group accepted the invitation to go on a brief tour of the stores and archives. This is a new venture for Wrest Park. English Heritage have accumulated and catalogued an extensive collection of historical artefacts in the controlled-environment store so now want to enable visitors to have the chance to see some of it. They have developed a tour but wanted to trial it and get feedback from suitable groups first, before offering it to all visitors. The *THACS* group was privileged to be invited to try this tour. The number and variety of artefacts was amazing and it was good to be able to handle and closely inspect some of them. The free tour took about half an hour and most visitors helped by completing feed-back forms at the end.

The staff at Wrest Park did a great job in looking after us. The welcome was warm, the staff at reception were efficient with the payments and tickets and they also ensured that the two ladies who wanted electric buggies were not disappointed. The tour guides were excellent and the food in the restaurant was very tasty. Chambers Coaches provided their usual excellent service, ensuring that everyone had a safe and comfortable ride. It all made for an enjoyable day out.
