For ease of reference, here are the dates and titles of our events.

THACS Spring Show on Saturday 5th April 2014

Well done to all who took part in the THACS Spring Show.

It was probably the largest spring show so far! It was certainly the largest since detailed recording started in 2007. There was a total of 161 exhibitors, which is 85% more than last year. The number of children exhibitors was 130 and this was more than double last year's number. The number of adult exhibitors was 31, which compares well with the 23 exhibitors we had last year. It is particularly encouraging to see several new adult exhibitors entering the show and I hope that their experience will encourage them to enter subsequent shows too. The total number of exhibits was 364, which is 50% more than last year. Several of the judges commented on the high standards of the exhibits, so the increased size of the show seems to have had no adverse impact on the quality of entries.

The children provided lovely displays to decorate the hall. Tiny Tots and the Under-Five's preschool group provided friezes to brighten up the walls whilst Tewin Cowper School provided a "mood board" showing their ideas for gardening at the school, which went well with the display of photographs from the planting day. The children were also well represented among the exhibits, especially with their lovely fingerprint / handprint paintings of spring flowers, collages of an Easter egg design and photographs of spring flowers.

The adult classes were equally well represented. Filling the centre of the main hall were the displays of spring flowers to welcome the visitors who visited the hall in the afternoon. This was complemented by the exhibits in the Flower Arranging class, which were beautiful.

In addition to the Flower Arranging and Horticulture, there were several tables full of culinary exhibits and beautifully made hand-crafted items, together with displays of poetry, prose, illustrations, calligraphy and photographs.

The adult trophy winners were Susan Whitbourn for Flower Arranging, Ray Keppler for Horticulture, Shirley Ashby for Arts & Crafts, Jules Bridgman for Photography, and Roe Hill for Culinary. Amelia Bennett won the Les Borg Cup for Children's Photography whilst her sister Lydia Bennett won the Tewin Cowper School Award for the highest number of points in the children's classes for horticulture, arts & crafts and culinary. Art workshop on Thursday 1st May 2014

The next art workshop will take place on Thursday 1st May in Bramfield Village Hall from 10:00am to 4:00pm. Like the previous workshops, it will be run by Jude O'Sullivan. The theme will be "**What to draw?**" and the workshop is suitable for experienced and novice artists.

Choosing what to draw or paint is the most important first step, to allow you to express a personal opinion about the subject matter. Jude will ask you all to bring an object that is personal to you. This can be man- made, for example a piece of clothing, an accessory, a pair of shoes, a piece of jewellery, an ornament or a natural form such as a shell or stone found on the beach. We will start by drawing from this object with a variety of materials using line and tone and scale. Then we will take these drawings through the other formal elements using just line, then pattern and colour. Jude will provide a variety of papers, materials and tools for you



to use, but do please bring your own art boxes with materials as well. If the weather allows we will be going outside to draw and paint from natural forms. Please bring something to share for lunch.

The gardens vary greatly and you'll have the opportunity to see small gardens, large gardens, different planting styles, interesting features and unusual plants.

Entrance to gardens is by programme, which will include a map showing the locations of the open gardens and the opening times for individual gardens. The programme costs £2.50 per adult, (accompanied children are free) and you can buy them at Tewin Village Stores and Tebbutts from Monday 28 April. If you wish to buy your programme on the day, then you can get them from Tewin Stores until 12:00, or from 15 Upper Green Road or from any of the other Open Gardens.

Visit to RHS Wisley on Wednesday 30th July 2014

If you would like a summer's day out to lift the spirits, then join us on a coach trip to a day at RHS Wisley. Wisley is the flagship garden of the Royal Horticultural Society and was voted Britain's Favourite Garden in the BBC Countryfile Magazine Awards in 2013. Set in 240 acres of beautiful grounds, visitors can experience different styles of planting and garden design in a variety of lovely settings and all cared for to perfection. The famous mixed borders are glorious in July and they are full of colour, form and texture.

If you make your way to the top of the magnificent Rock Garden, you'll also see the amazing view down onto the majestic glasshouse and lake. This glasshouse is a showcase for a worldclass plant collection, including rare and endangered species. The huge cathedral-like structure has three climatic zones, recreating tropical, moist temperate and dry temperate habitats. THACS is engraved on one of the glass panels in recognition of the donation given towards the glasshouse in 2004. The glasshouse boarders should be looking wonderful. They're full of agastaches, grasses, heleniums, echinaceas and eryngiums. There are some stunning plant combinations to see in detail and a glorious view en masse.

In the trials field, the finest flowers and vegetables are identified from the countless new introductions. You'll be able to see stunning and scented sweet peas, delphiniums, blackberries, hybrid berries and maybe even some Dahlias.

There is a Plant Centre with a wide



variety of hardy plants for sale, the Wisley Shop for inspirational gifts and a choice of five different refreshment options, from a three-course meal in the Restaurant to an ice cream in the Orchard Café. There are many facilities for disabled, including push wheelchairs, a mobility scooter and an electric mobility vehicle which drives around the gardens for those who cannot walk too far.

Since this trip will be during the school holidays, parents may wish to bring their children along. There are several suitable trails in the garden and you can get free garden trail leaflets at the Garden Entrance. Each trail gives children things to spot, ideas of great places to explore and fun things to do in the garden. Also, young would-be jungle explorers will love the Tropical Zone in the glasshouse.

As *THACS* is affiliated to the RHS, there will be no entry charge for us. The adult price for the coach is £10 for *THACS* members and £12 for non-members. The children's price for the coach is £5 if at least one parent / carer is a *THACS* member and £6 otherwise.

The coach will leave Tewin (opposite the Rose and Crown) at 9.00am promptly and leave Wisley at 3.30pm. An optional walking guided tour of the gardens is available to for an additional cost of £3. The tour guides are knowledgeable and helpful, so the tour is particularly recommended if you have not visited Wisley before. The tour will last about 90 minutes and is scheduled to start at 11:30.
