Plants for Tewin Cowper School

As part of our liaison with Tewin Cowper School, we want to help them establish a new section of their garden. They want to plant-up the bare area surrounding the swimming pool fence with nectar-rich, wildlife friendly plants, shrubs and herbs. The children play right next to this area and would benefit greatly from watching all the butterflies and bees it would attract.

So this is an appeal to any of you who feel you may be able to provide them with such plants. Buddleja, lavender, teasels and herbs are just a few examples and would do very nicely. The gardeners amongst you will know of a lot more! You may have surplus plants or maybe you could grow some from cuttings.

The work is being lead and coordinated by Esther Carley (mother of a pupil), who has organised Saturday working parties. The 'Big Dig' garden working party will be on Saturday 15th February 9am-4pm. Come along anytime between these times, for however long you can manage and help us dig over the area we are going to plant-up and to dig the holes for the fruit trees. (If the weather is bad or the ground frozen solid, it will be postponed to Saturday 1st March).

Saturday 8th March 9am-4pm is the 'Big Plant-up' where all the plants will be planted out. (If the weather is bad, this will be postponed to Sat 15th March). If you would like to donate plants before then, or you need any other information about this, then please contacted Esther on 01438-717734.

The working parties have already made significant improvements, including building four more raised beds to add to the two that *THACS* donated. This means that every class has their own

raised bed and the children will be encouraged to grow their own food, which can then be cooked in the classroom. We wish to support this initiative, so we have just made a donation of $\pounds 100$ towards the cost of buying gardening tools and equipment.

Exhibitors at Spring and Autumn Shows

The Spring and Autumn shows last year were enjoyable and successful and the quality of exhibits was generally good. However, there is scope for making the shows bigger and better, with your help. For this, there needs to be more people exhibiting.

There is a trend showing that number of exhibitors has been decreasing over recent years. There were 87 exhibitors in the Spring Show in 2013, down 36% from the peak of 136 in 2011. Similarly, there were 40 exhibitors in the Autumn Show in 2013, down 64% from the peak of 111 in 2010. Some of these exhibitors have increased the number of their entries, so the decreases in the number of exhibits have not been so large. Even so, the numbers have decreased significantly. There were 243 exhibits in the Spring Show in 2013, down 35% from the peak of 371 in 2011. Similarly, there were 290 exhibits in the Autumn Show in 2013, down 45% from the peak of 528 in 2010.

These figures are for all exhibitors and exhibits, including children. If we just



focus on the adults, we see that there were only 23 adult exhibitors in the Spring Show and 26 in the Autumn Show. This represents 12% of the *THACS* membership, so there is huge scope for increase.

There are numerous factors that affect the number of exhibits at any show, such as the timing of the shows and the preceding weather. However, it is clear that there is an opportunity to make the shows bigger and better.

So, as Show Secretary, I'm appealing to you for help in adding to the number of exhibits and overall interest and diversity of the shows.

If you are a regular exhibitor, then thank you. Please continue to exhibit and if you know people who share your interest then please encourage them to enter too.

If you have not exhibited before, then please consider entering in 2014. There are classes covering flower arranging, flowers, vegetables & fruit, photography, culinary and a wide range of arts & crafts, so there is something for everyone. The shows are enjoyed by villagers and visitors, so come and meet friends and have fun. There was a first time for all of us so don't be afraid of having a go!

After the AGM, our guest speaker Dr David Butcher delivered his talk entitled *The Art of Monochrome Landscape and City Photography.* His presentation featured a collection of stunning black and white photographs from around the world to show the more artistic side of landscape and cityscape photography. It was a very enjoyable and informative presentation that was well received by the enthusiastic audience.

The Tewin Society Award

The presentation of the third annual Tewin Society Award for Heritage, Conservation and environment took place in Tewin Memorial Hall on Monday 13th January, immediately before the *THACS* AGM.

David Gregg started the presentation by announcing the winner and describing the work being recognised by the award. The winner of the 2013 Tewin Society Award is Patrick Holden.

Patrick received his award for his leadership in the 1980s and 90s of a team of more than 50 people who cleared,

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rehabilitated and mapped the footpaths of Tewin. The culmination of the project was a beautifully illustrated map, still available today from Tewin Stores, used by many walking groups around the county and from further afield. More maps have been sold than there are people in Tewin and the maps have gone across the world to Australia and beyond. A more detailed account of the work can be found on pages 242 & 243 of *"The History of Tewin by the People of Tewin"*.

In accepting the award, Patrick was careful to thank the many people who helped with this venture. He said, "Our village map is an exemplar for other community maps and has stood the test of time over several decades".

I was delighted to present the award to Patrick. The Tewin Society Award plaque had been engraved with his name and the year of the award (2013) and Patrick will have it for a year. He also received a presentation crystal bowl which comes with a separate small base inscribed with "The Tewin Society Award for Heritage, Environment and Conservation 2013".

Our congratulations go to Patrick and our thanks and gratitude to all those who helped him in this work.
