Annual General Meeting on Monday 15th January 2018

The seventeenth *THACS* AGM will take place in Tewin Memorial Hall on Monday 15th January 2018 at 7:30pm. The evening will start with the AGM and then there will be refreshments (including wine) followed by a talk from our guest speaker.

The notices for the AGM accompany this newsletter. As you can see from the agenda, the meeting will include the Chairman's and Treasurer's report for 2017, the election of the officers and other committee members for 2018, an outline of the challenges and opportunities the society faces and a preview of events for 2018.

Our guest speaker is Richard Fishbourne and the subject of his talk will be *A Worm's Eye View* of Bringing a Garden to Life. Richard runs his own natural gardening business called Bugs and Beasties.



His talk will provide an in-depth look at ways of creating space for nature in the garden. It will deal with life within the soil, the advantages of composting, sustainable means of feeding the birds, building with green materials, tending your veggies, planting for wildlife, creating habitat and refuge for bugs, birds and bees alike. This is a great opportunity for you to be entertained, enlightened and possibly even enthused by his infectious passion about bugs and beasties and their role in our gardens.

There is no admission charge for the evening and no booking is necessary. This is an important meeting for *THACS* and all members are urged to attend. Non-members are very welcome but not able to vote.

Spring 2018

1. Stitched household object (for example, tea cosy, cushion cover, draught excluder, apron.)

Autumn 2018

- 1. Object made from wood. Maximum size 30cm (12ins) in all dimensions.
- 2. Soft toy, any material
- 3. Hand knitted garment. Space allowed 60cm x 60cm (24ins x 24ins)

Please remember that these are **your** shows, so we need your guidance and feed-back to ensure that the shows reflect the interests of *THACS* members. So, if you have suggestions for any categories for future shows, we'd love to hear from you.
