Spring Show on Saturday 1st April

The Spring Show in Tewin Memorial Hall displayed a wide range of exhibits of flower arranging, horticulture, arts & crafts, photography and culinary from adults and children.

In the Main Hall were beautiful flower arrangements, a delightful display of horticulture exhibits, mouth-watering culinary exhibits and a selection of arts & craft exhibits. This was enhanced by decorative friezes from Tewin Under-Fives Pre-school and Tewin Tots Pre-school. who also provided the daffodil pictures used to make the bunting. The photography, painting, calligraphy and prose exhibits were shown in the Parish Room, along with a display of photographs and text of project work from Tewin Cowper School. In the corridor were more of the children's art exhibits together with further displays from the children of Tewin Cowper School in the form of Easter Art and novel "moving pictures".

The Show Schedule gave the younger exhibitors a chance to do the same (or similar) as the adults in some cases. This enabled us to display their exhibits along side the corresponding adult ones, which made for interesting comparisons! We do this regularly for the photography (where the children share three subjects with the adults) but this time we extended the concept to other subjects, such as flower arrangements in an egg cup, and an Easter Greetings card. I hope that this inspired the children (but I don't know what effect it had on the adult exhibitors). It seems to be difficult to attract teenagers to enter the show, so maybe this approach might encourage them to participate more.

The adult trophy winners were Sue Whitbourn for Flower Arranging, Marie St Pier for Horticulture, Melanie Goodison for Culinary and Terry Brand for Arts & Crafts and also for Photography. Lauren Cates won the Les Borg Cup for Children's Photography and Peter Goodison won the Tewin Cowper School Award for the highest number of points in the children's classes for horticulture, arts & crafts and culinary. Visit to Anglesey Abbey on Wednesday 12th July 2017

For our summer outing this year, we have arranged a visit to Anglesey Abbey, Gardens and Lode Mill in Cambridgeshire. We had a group visit there before, to see the lovely winter gardens back in February 2012, so a return visit in summer is over-due. This time, there will be the opportunity to explore the house and mill as well as the extensive grounds. There is something there for everyone, so come along and join us for a great day out!

Anglesey Abbey is believed to have been founded by Henry 1 in 1135 as the hospital of St Mary, but it had become a run-down country house in a desolate landscape by the time Lord Fairhaven bought it in 1926. Lord Fairhaven wanted to inspire and surprise visitors, so he created a spectacular garden with planting for all seasons, together with a cosy house in which to entertain. He gifted the estate to the National Trust upon his death in 1966 and we now have the opportunity to explore and enjoy his legacy.

In the house there are fine furnishings, books, paintings, silver and rare clocks:- all giving a feeling of opulence, reflecting the luxurious lifestyle. The grounds of the property are extensive (114 acres) and offer vibrant colour and the simple pleasures of nature. Since our visit will be in July, we should be able to fully enjoy the magnificent sweeping herbaceous border packed with colour and also the heady scent of the Rose Garden. Only a relatively small portion of the estate

is so intensely cultivated but there are plenty of other things to explore in the grounds, including one of the finest collections of garden statuary in the country.



Lode Mill will be open and worth visiting. A watermill probably stood on the site of Lode Mill at the time of the Domesday survey in 1086, but the Mill which stands today is likely to have been built in the eighteenth century. You'll be able to step inside and (hopefully) watch grain turn into wholesome wholemeal flour before your eyes.

Visitor facilities include a restaurant, gift shop, book shop and a plant centre. Redwoods Restaurant is a selfservice licensed restaurant which offers light refreshments and hot or cold lunches, made with fresh local ingredients. It is open from 10:30am to 5:30pm, and lunches are served between 12:00 noon and 2:30pm. Alternatively, there is a picnic area adjacent to the restaurant and picnics may also be eaten in most parts of the garden.

There are wheelchairs and mobility scooters for the less mobile, but these must be booked in advance. The mobility scooters are only usable for up to 2 hours and they are not allowed

out in the rain. The house is about 600 metres from reception and for visitors with mobility problems there is a five-seater buggy, driven by a member of staff, which runs between reception and the house on request.

More information can be found in the guidebooks for the house and the gardens, which will be available for purchase on the day at Reception, House and Shop. We will be travelling by coach, which will leave Tewin (from the bus stop opposite the Rose & Crown) at 9:30am and will leave Anglesey Abbey for the return journey at 3:30pm.

If you are a member of the National Trust then you are entitled to free entry to the whole property but you must bring your membership card with you, so that it can be scanned.

If you are not a member of the National Trust, you have two access options:- if you would like to visit the house, choose the "Whole property" option, which will give you access to everything. Otherwise, choose the "Garden & Mill only" option, which will give you access to everything except the house.
