Visit to Queen's House, Greenwich on Tuesday 27th November 2012

The Tewin Society Award

The presentation of the Tewin Society Award took place in Tewin Memorial Hall on Monday 14th January, immediately before the *THACS* AGM.

Mavis Haggar started the presentation by putting the Tewin Society Award into its full context.

She described the formation, achievement and ultimate demise of the Tewin Society and explained that a modest amount of money was passed to *THACS* by the Tewin Society when it closed. This was for the purpose of honouring one local resident a year for continuing to uphold the ideals of the original society.

A new Tewin Society Award (TSA) committee was formed to manage this, consisting of Mavis Haggar, Linda Adams and David Gregg, under the chairmanship of Ray Keppler. This committee established the rules governing the award (essentially referring to the Tewin Society principles) and drew up ten criteria for evaluating a nomination based on the aims of Tewin Society. These criteria include:- unpaid work done to preserve our local heritage, to enhance the environment, to conserve Tewin's natural resources; unpaid work that is an inspiration to others and involves others, with lasting effects.

Once this groundwork was done, nominations could be invited from anyone (except the committee) and marking would follow a set formula. Of course the greater the proof, the more marks gained. Based on these criteria, selection can be made, impersonally and fairly.

This process was used for the first award in 2011, leading to Margaret Knight's name being the first on the Tewin Society Award plaque. The same approach was followed for the 2012 award and, as a result, the winner of the Tewin Society Award for 2012 is Elizabeth Wilson. She was nominated for the award based on her excellent work leading the production of the book *A History of Tewin by the People of Tewin*.

To commemorate VE day in 1995, Elizabeth and Ben Roberts shared with the village a collection of facts and details about Tewin, which made a fascinating and eye-opening display. The display was further developed for the Millennium celebrations and was again a huge success. An archive of material became safely housed in Tewin Memorial Hall and was added to over time by residents and others, ready for further viewings.

The village residents gave these displays such a positive reception that this led to a desire to record the history of Tewin in hard copy. Elizabeth and Ben recruited eight other Tewinites, who shared the writing, compilation, checking, etc and who tirelessly steered the project over three years to its conclusion.

The rest as they say is history ... OUR history. The History of Tewin by the People of Tewin.

Elizabeth's talent and determination have inspired many, and the book has a world wide circulation. It is enjoyed by residents, ex-residents, children and grandchildren and probably great grand children!

In this book, we have a lasting reminder of our local heritage. To quote from one of her proposers:-

"Elizabeth, as dynamic leader, is to be applauded for this project...a project that a large town would be proud of producing. Its worth will endure for decades."

I was delighted to present the award to Elizabeth. The Tewin Society Award plaque had been engraved with her name and the year of the award (2012) and Elizabeth will have it for a year. She also received a presentation crystal vase which comes with a separate small base inscribed with "The Tewin Society Award 2012".

Our congratulations go to Elizabeth and our thanks to all those who helped her in this work.
