Forthcoming Events

Photography workshop *"The Judge's Eye"* on Monday 2nd March

A photography workshop will take place at Tewin Memorial Hall on Monday 2nd March, starting at 7:30pm. The presenter will be Bob Norris, who judges the photographic entries at the *THACS* autumn shows. Bob had a long and distinguished career as a professional photographer and has remained active in the world of photography in his retirement. For many years he has lectured on photography and judged competitions. He has also entered national and international photography competitions and won numerous medals and awards.

Bob aims to show those wishing to enter competitions, particularly the *THACS* photography section, what judges are looking for and how we may improve our photography. To do this, he will use some of his images that have been successful in national and international exhibitions or done well in competitions at his own photographic society. Bob invites us to bring one of our prints if we would like his comments and advice on it. It could be an image we have entered in a previous show and not done as well as we hoped, or one that we would like to enter in a future competition. Bob will also give guidance on mounting prints for competitions. Most of all he wants to encourage us to go out and enjoy photography, to enter competitions and, perhaps, to win.

After the AGM and a break for refreshments, our guest speaker Kate Harwood delivered her talk entitled *The Evolving Landscape of Panshanger Park - Past and Future?* Her presentation covered the history of the site and gave us a glimpse of possible future developments, highlighting the three main requirements of public access, preservation of wildlife habitat and respect for the history (including preservation of the key views). It was an informative presentation on a topic of considerable local interest and it was well received by the attentive audience.



Appeal for helpers for 2015

We put an appeal in the September newsletter for a new secretary but it did not generate any interest. Jim Hall has saved the day by volunteering to take the role for the time being. He is also retaining most of his previous responsibilities, so has a lot to do.

These changes mean that your *THACS* committee only has five people. This is the lowest it's ever been and we are unsure that we can continue much longer at this level. We do not have any spare capacity, so we are very vulnerable. If any committee member leaves, for whatever reason, then we would not be able to function for very long.

We five remaining committee members are all passionate about *THACS* and want it to continue to thrive. Also, we are fortunate to have a large number of supporters and helpers. Consequently, the committee has decided to carry on through 2015 at only five members and we will run the usual program of events. We'll then see how feasible it will be to continue like this. We would be delighted if we could have more members on the committee to share in the running of *THACS*. If you are interested, then please talk to any of the committee members (whose names and contact details are given above). If you are interested but unsure about what is involved, then you could join without any particular responsibilities and later find your niche once you see how it all works.

There is also plenty of scope to help without being on the committee. Some *THACS* members already help with a wide variety of tasks and their support is greatly appreciated by all of us. We do, however, require specific help in the following areas:-

a) **Poster duties**

As you know, we use posters to advertise many of our events. These all have to be designed, printed and most of them get laminated. Terry Brand does an excellent job with this and we pride ourselves in having eye-catching posters that are put up at the right time and quickly removed after the event. We could do with some extra help with this please. We use about 40 poster locations and currently this job is done by only three people. Three more people kindly volunteered at the AGM but we'd still be interested in hearing from anyone else willing to help with this.

b) Event organisers

Some of our members already support us by organising events:- Hilary Tipping organises the Arts & Craft Fair, Joanne Allen organises creative writing and art workshops and Anna Clark has organised calligraphy and jewellery workshops. However, now that the committee is down to five, we would like to focus our efforts on organising the shows and AGM by getting more helpers to organise other events. This could include:-

- a visit to a garden, such as the one to RHS Wisley
- a visit to an art exhibitions, such as the one to the National Gallery
- talks, demonstrations and workshops in the village, such as the flower arranging evening.

c) Catering organiser

Thank you to all the many good cake makers and volunteers who help with serving refreshments and doing the washing up. We would like someone to go further than this and organise the catering for specific events. This involves contacting helpers, compiling a rota of helpers and ensuring that all necessary crockery, cutlery, tablecloths, napkins and food and drinks are supplied.

d) Manpower for setting-up and taking-down

The events held here in the Memorial Hall usually require a couple of hours of work in setting up before the event and clearing away immediately afterwards. We would appreciate some more able-bodied volunteers to help with this.

The Tewin Society Award

The presentation of the forth annual Tewin Society Award for Heritage, Conservation and Environment took place in Tewin Memorial Hall on Monday 12th January, immediately before the *THACS* AGM.

The winner of the 2014 Tewin Society Award was Michael Clark.

Elizabeth Wilson (who won the 2012 award) announced the winner and presented Michael with his prizes. The Tewin Society Award plaque had been engraved with his name and the year of

the award (2014) and Michael will have it for a year. He also received a presentation crystal vase inscribed with "Tewin Society Award 2014".

Michael received his award for his wide range of relevant work that he has done over a long period, using his extensive knowledge and skills for the benefit of Tewin and its residents. He has used his links with Herts & Middlesex Wildlife, the RSPB and the Badger Trust to give the people of Tewin a special facility at Tewin Orchard, used for apple picking and badger watching. His extensive knowledge of apple trees was also put to good use when he led the planting of the millennium orchards.

Michael was a vital participant in the project to produce and publish The *History of Tewin by the People of Tewin* book. He utilised his extensive writing and publishing skills to good effect and he also had the book published through the Tewin Orchard. He also gave us a wonderful pictorial representation of Tewin by designing the village sign on Lower Green and he helped to plan its production and installation. (*The History of Tewin by* the People of Tewin contains a more detailed account of the orchards on pages 158-164 and information about the village sign on page 247.)



Since the Tewin Society Award is for contributions to the Heritage, Environment and Conservation of Tewin made by volunteers, the nominations fitted very well, making him a clear winner.

Our congratulations go to Michael and our thanks and gratitude to all those who helped and supported him in this work.
