<u>Hedges</u>

Now that we are heading towards September and the birds have finished nesting, Tewin Parish Council would be grateful if all residents who have hedges on their land bordering a footpath or pavement would cut them back if they are

overhanging or partially blocking the path.

Litter Bins

Please be sensible as to what you put in the litter bins. If large bags of rubbish are stuffed into them it leaves no room for genuine litter including dog poo bags and the bins overflow causing a health hazard.

If you are having a picnic, please take your rubbish home with you.

Do not put household rubbish in litter bins.

If your rubbish is going to fill the bin, then you should be taking it away with you.

Footpath Drainage Works

Works have been completed on Footpath 11, from Upper Green up to Burnham Green, to help with the drainage issues.

Pavilion Drainage Works

Works have been completed to help drain water away from the patio in front of the Pavilion.

Common Ragwort

This is a common weed found throughout the British Isles however it is very toxic to horses and other livestock and can have potentially fatal consequences if ingested either in its green or dried state.

Under the Weeds Act 1959 the Secretary of State may serve an enforcement notice on the occupier of land on which injurious weeds are growing, requiring the occupier to take action to prevent the spread of injurious weeds. The Weeds Act specifies **five** injurious weeds: Common Ragwort, Spear Thistle, Creeping or Field Thistle, Broad-Leaved Dock and Curled Dock.

By promoting good practice and good neighbourliness it is hoped that this weed can be controlled.

If you find you have it in your garden please put rubber gloves on and remove the plant and place it in the <u>black bin</u> to prevent livestock eating it. Fragments of root will remain in the ground so new growth will have to be monitored and removed year after year.

Farming Life

As I write these notes harvest is getting near. We have been building up to this for almost a year. Our Combine has been serviced and checked over by our technician with his laptop and the only thing he had to change was one main drum belt.

The last load of wheat has just left the grain store so our first job this week (10th July) is to clean down the grain store, hoover out the dust traps and fumigate the store, as we don't want any uninvited insects. I have been given the opportunity to farm an extra 75 acres of land adjoining us at Tewin on a contract farming agreement and have taken this on. Approximately 50 acres are arable and the rest is grassland. We have had to plough and sow 10 acres with AB9, a winter Bird Seed Mix. The area also has a area of AB8, which is Flower Rich Margins and the rest is GS2 which is Low input Grassland. We will have to control the thistles and nettles and be paid to do this work by the Rural Payments Agency (RPA).

Farmers are almost becoming park keepers now of the countryside. This type of farming is part of the Government's new Agricultural Policy. Just this week DEFRA published a booklet of 150 pages, called the Sustainable Farming Incentive, detailing how we are to farm in the future. The booklet contains information on looking after soil health, hedges and feeding the wildlife. It says nothing about growing food other than how we can do trade deals with other countries on the other side of the World and get food more cheaply!

It's getting very confusing. I now have to employ a Land Agent to help me in the future due to the complexity of the Sustainable Farming Incentive.

St Peter's News

A church at the heart of the village, with space for all

On the first weekend in July, we were delighted to welcome a goodly crowd of visitors to the church for our exhibition of *The Knitted Bible*. It arrived from its last staging in Beckenham a few days before, with every scene in its own box, with a proper commentary and all its figures and props. I understand that it took a long time to set up because when people opened each box they kept exclaiming over the knitted items and weren't sure how much room each was likely to take up. In the end all 35 scenes were in place spread around the church on boards and at the altars.

It is an amazing exhibition, which took 8 years to reach this size. It was started in 2008 by the congregation and friends of St George's URC in Hartlepool and if you look at their website it shows all the places it is going to around the UK this year. If you look on ours, you will see some of the scenes. People commented about the whole thing and particularly liked all the animals on Noah's ark, the feast at the Wedding at Cana and the large wine jars, all the beards of Joseph and his brothers, David and Goliath, Samson, and all the disciples and followers of Jesus. And the sheep – everyone liked the sheep.

Thank you to everyone who helped set it up and man the exhibition, the raffle, and the teas and cakes. It was a most successful venture, enjoyed by all and raising some necessary funds for the church.

While the church was full of the exhibition, on Sunday 2nd July we were delighted to see our curates in the Welwyn team, together with two others, being priested at St Mary's Welwyn. This means they are now able to give communion at services as well as preside and preach. Christie and Ryan Gilfeather are a delightful young couple who have been welcomed into the team during the past year, and we are lucky to have two such enthusiastic priests with us.

In July we also started our Messy church on the 3rd Sunday in the month at 3pm. This is particularly for young folk. I will report on this next month as I am writing this early in the month. We have also begun the Summer Evensongs across the Welwyn Team which will continue each Sunday in August. The theme this year is *Masterpieces of Religious Art*. Tewin's Summer Evensong will be on 27th August at 6.30pm and will be preceded in the morning by the Annual Joint Service with All Saints, Datchworth in the marquee on Burnham Green at 10am.

I know that many folk have lost loved ones this year; some of my acquaintances tell me they have been to a number of funerals and memorial services recently. If you are ill or recently bereaved, do get in touch with Susannah or any in the Welwyn team who are always there to give support.
