The big - and very sad - news in the last month came in the announcement on October 31st that our Team Vicar, Coralie, would be leaving us in the New Year. From our experience over the past six years we know that she is well suited to the task and we wish her all the very best in her new post. Meanwhile Coralie will be with us for another two months and we intend to take full advantage of having her still with us.

The new Team Vicar selection process is getting under way and the Archdeacon has called a meeting for December 7th to outline the programme to the PCCs of both Tewin and Datchworth.

Once again we had a good attendance for our Remembrance Service with 110 people stood at the War Memorial followed by around 85 in church. With the current situation in Afghanistan more and more people are appreciating the relevance of Remembrance.

It was a shame that the school were unable to undertake the walk to St.Peter's for their Remembrance Service due to the severe weather conditions, but obviously their safety was of paramount importance. We look forward to seeing them in church for their school Christingle Service in December.

After our comments last month regarding the trees, the PCC has agreed to further work on the trees in the churchyard.

Dear Tewin neighbours and villagers

Lia Parkinson and Diane Meeson would like to thank all those of you who have supported us this year to raise funds to enable us to travel to Tanzania and help 500 primary school children there have a better place to learn.

Now safely back home, it's quite hard to find words to describe the trip in a few sentences, but we can honestly say that it was one of the most worthwhile and rewarding things we've ever done. Lia has merged the best of everyone's photos of the trip into an album, which we think probably tells the story best, and we hope to get the opportunity to show you sometime.

Our group of 12 volunteers collectively exceeded the fundraising target, raising a fantastic £30,000, enabling us to provide the children of Uwa School with a playground, as well as renovate two classrooms and a nursery block, inside and out. We were all particularly proud of our brightly coloured murals, from numbers and jungle animals in the nursery, to educational diagrams and illustrations in the older children's classes. Completing these ahead of schedule, we also painted other exterior areas, windows, doors, desks and benches, to transform the school, much to the delight of the teachers, children, parents and villagers. For a week we were part of this welcoming, grateful, happy (and impoverished) community. We witnessed a totally different culture, visited a beautiful part of the world and experienced a way of life that we could never before have imagined. Yes, it was hard work (but not all the time), and facilities were definitely basic, but our temporary 'hardships' were nothing in comparison – water is Tanzania's most precious commodity. Many of the group (13 including our inspiring Childreach International UK representative) were virtual strangers at the outset, but returned ten days later as firm friends and new Ambassadors for Childreach International, humbled and enriched by our life-changing experience.

We couldn't have done this without your help. Thank you from the bottom of our hearts.

The History of Tewin by the People of Tewin'

As previously reported in the Parish News, *The History of Tewin* book has already raised £4000 for Tewin Memorial Hall having now sold 659 copies. We have learnt much from the memories and documents which continue to be given to us to copy and record. Nor does oral history ever rest: when Sir Norman Wisdom died this autumn, someone who has lived in the village for most

of her long life mentioned in church that he used to visit the cottage at Tewin Orchard when she helped Howard and Janet (possibly Carter) who lived there in the 1950s.

Howard was connected with the film industry, possibly working at studios in the county, and Sir Norman probably visited Tewin as guests during filming. *The Welwyn & Hatfield Times* featured 'Norman Wisdom's Hatfield years' in their October obituary to him and she added: 'He insisted on doing one of his trade-mark falls down the stairs even though we warned him it was made of concrete, not wood!'

Our local resident, who wishes to remain anonymous, said that he stayed in the cottage and she met him several times when she was doing the daily chores and when she helped with their dinner parties. She recalled the stairs incident vividly, when he stood on the top step, looked at her and said, 'Do you dare me to roll down these stairs?' She told him: 'It's your own business if go ahead and break your b***** neck!'

When the cottage was added at a right angle to the original 1931 Orchard House in 1946 there was a shortage of building materials, particularly timber, after WW2 and red tiles were laid on a cement base instead of wood on the stairs. Later, presumably because the tiles proved slippery, a concrete scree was laid across them. The stairs are now covered in wall-to-wall carpets, but the stone-finish was when the Clarks first moved to the cottage from Cuffley in 1969.

The delightful account has perfect provenance, therefore, and one hopes that the actor did not suffer any lasting injury. From his great success and numerous falls on film, it seems unlikely.

Our thanks for this story which has given us yet more local history we did not know about before!

We also know from a *THACS* nostalgia competition entry that Linda Crawford once met Sir Norman, too, (in Stevenage) and she has kindly given us permission to reproduce a detail from the photograph here.

Tewin Pavilion

Tewin Stores Bike Stand

The Parish Council gave Tewin Stores permission to put a bicycle stand on the Village Green opposite the shop selecting the specific location where it would not be a trip hazard or impede grass cutting.

Tewin Christmas Tree & Carols

The Parish Council gave permission for a Christmas tree on Lower Green over the Christmas period and a £150 donation towards the purchase of the tree. Carols on the Green will be on Monday, 20th December 2010 from 6pm.

Salting/Gritting of Tewin

Hertfordshire Highways has advised that Orchard Road, Upper Green, Upper Green Road, Lower Green, School Lane & Churchfield Road are back on the usual precautionary salting route and will be salted when required with the rest of the network.

Upper Green Road Verge from Godfries Close to Entrance to Footpath 26

The Parish Council agreed to clear the scrub up to the hedge on the verge north of Godfries Close towards the entrance to FP26 with a view to make it available for pedestrians.

The Parish Council will also consider a better surface for walking along the verge. Residents on the opposite side of the road and the owners of the fields adjacent to the verge will also be notified.

Temporary Closure of Hertford Road, Tewin

This will be up to 3 days, between 13th—17th December 2010, with signs in place and an alternative signed route provided for traffic. This is due to the new water main installation and electricity service.

Development Control

The Parish Council does not check for every minor infringement of planning permission, but if you are worried about any development, you can contact us. If we cannot answer the query, we can refer it to East Herts Planning Enforcement.
