Recent Events

Visit to see *The Tutankhamun & Golden Age of Pharaohs Exhibition* at the O2 Dome, London on Wednesday 14th May 2008.

This was a popular event, with 45 people travelling by coach to see the exhibition at the O2 Dome. Everything went smoothly and everyone enjoyed the day.

The exhibition includes approximately 130 objects from the tomb of Tutankhamun and other Valley of the Kings Ancestors. Most of these objects have never been seen in the UK before. Featured treasures in the exhibit, which are all between 3,300 and 3,500 years old, include Tutankhamun's royal diadem - the gold crown discovered encircling the head of the king's mummified body that he possibly wore while living - and one of the gold and precious stone inlaid coffinettes that contained his mummified internal organs.

The exhibition is expertly staged, in a series of interlinked halls. It takes full advantage of the considerable available space making easy viewing of the exhibits, despite the high number of visitors. Lighting is used to great effect. A particularly useful feature is the way in which the information panels are arranged at each exhibit. The panels are placed close to the exhibit, so that the information could be read in context when standing close by. However, a larger version of the panel is also positioned above the exhibit – frequently on several sides – so that they can be read from further away, over the heads of other visitors.

We had plenty of time available for our visit, giving us an opportunity to have lunch in one of the many restaurants before viewing the exhibition. Once in the exhibition, it was quite easy to lose your sense of time, but the $2^{1}/_{2}$ hours we allocated for this was sufficient.

If you have not yet visited this extremely popular exhibition, then there is still time since it will run to 30th August 2008.

Open Gardens throughout Tewin on Sunday 15th June 2008

More than 250 people took advantage of the **THACS** Open Gardens day and visited some of the Open Gardens in and around Tewin. Thanks to Tewin Stores and Tebbutts for selling tickets so efficiently.

Fifteen gardens opened this year, six of them for the first time. They represented a great diversity in location, size and style. There was something of interest for everyone and it all made an enjoyable day out. Many of the visitors talked about the gardens with their owners and many (visitors and owners!) found the day to be very informative, as well as enjoyable. There were welcome refreshments at Tewin Orchard, Dawley Cottage and Digswell Water House and there were plants for sale at some of the gardens and booklets about the history of Queen Hoo Hall were on sale there.

The high number of open gardens, combined with their dispersed locations, caused most visitors to be selective about which gardens they visited. Most favoured the gardens that were opening for the first time and it was no surprise that Queen Hoo Hall had the highest number of visitors (nearly 200). Consequently, visitor numbers were lower than last time at some of the other gardens but they were still high enough to make them worthwhile opening.

Guided Walk in St Albans on Sunday 12th October 2008

As a change from a church visit, **THACS** is proposing a visit to St Albans to take an organised and guided walk on Sunday, 12th October starting at 2pm. The walk we have chosen is from Fishpool Street to St Michaels Village. This is an old route that follows George Street, Romeland and Fishpool Street to picturesque St Michael's Village, with its elegant houses, Saxon church and the superb Verulamium Roman Museum.

The walk will start outside the Old Town Hall in Market Street and will take about 1hour 30 mins. As St Albans is nearby, we will not be organising a coach but car sharing is an option you may wish to consider. Parking is available in the town centre or at the Verulamium.

You will be able to purchase Afternoon Tea (which will not be pre-booked) after the walk in any of a number of local inns or cafes. In close proximity are The Six Bells, The Rose and Crown and the Waffle House. The Inn on the Park, which is close to the Museum, is recommended for cream teas.

Matthew lives in Hertfordshire and so is a local gardening celebrity. He has been a professional gardener for over 25 years and has achieved considerable success as a gardener, horticultural judge, lecturer, TV presenter, radio presenter and author.

A plant enthusiast, Matthew has travelled extensively, leading gardening tours and cruises in Europe, the Mediterranean, south east Asia, South America, Australasia and Africa where he is a lecturer and host.

Currently Matthew is a regular panellist on BBC Radio 4's *Gardeners Question Time* and writes regularly for several gardening magazines. In addition, he has written several gardening books which he will bring to the talk, giving us an opportunity to purchase signed copies.

The lecture is based on visits to over 150 different locations. It will introduce you to some of the fascinating characters who have created their dreams, from suburban back gardens to allotments and inner city roof gardens.

The lecture aims to enlighten you to the treasures to be found in the back gardens of Britain and discover what lessons that can be learned from the passions of their owners for plant collecting, vegetable growing and design. Let their enthusiasm encourage and inspire you to continue developing your own garden and increase your enjoyment of the greatest hobby in the world!

Recipe

Sausage and Lentil Stew

This recipe is from Tewin stores who stock most of the necessary ingredients.

Time: 1hr

Serves 4

Ingredients 2 Packs Braughing sausages 2x400g cans chopped tomatoes 100g green lentils 185ml red wine 1 onion, chopped 3 cloves garlic, crushed 3 tbsp oil 1 bay leaf 1 dried chilli crushed Pinch grated nutmeg Salt & pepper Rosemary (optional)

Method

- 1. Heat the oil in a large saucepan and cook the sausages for 5-10mins or until browned. Remove from the pan and reduce the heat. Add the onion and garlic and cook gently until the onion is soft.
- 2. Add the tomatoes and chopped rosemary (if using) and cook gently until reduced to a thick sauce. Add the nutmeg, bay leaf, chill, wine and 420ml of water. Bring to the boil and then add the lentils and sausages. Give the stew a good stir and simmer gently for 40mins, or until the lentils are soft, stirring occasionally to prevent the lentils sticking.
- 3. Serve with a fresh side salad of mixed leaves and cherry tomatoes, garnished with a lemon and olive oil dressing.
