## Recipes

Courgettes are in season now, so here are a couple of recipes that use them in unusual ways.

#### Cheese and Courgette Muffins - Makes 12 muffins

<u>Ingredients</u> 300g self-raising floor 3 tsp baking powder 1 courgette [approx 200g] 3 tbsp olive oil 3 tbsp milk

Salt and pepper 75g grated Parmesan cheese 150ml pot natural yoghurt 3 eggs

#### Method

Set the oven to 200°C/Gas Mark 6 [adjust for fan oven]. Line a 12-bun muffin tin with muffin - paper cases. Put the flour, salt, pepper, baking powder, and Parmesan cheese into a large mixing bowl. Cut the stalk off the courgette, and then coarsely grate it. Add the courgette to the bowl with the yoghurt, eggs and milk. Fork together until just mixed. Spoon the muffin mixture into the muffin cases, filling each case two-thirds full. Bake them in the centre of the oven for 18-20 minutes until well risen and golden brown. Serve warm or cold with hot soup or a little butter for a snack.

#### Pitaroudia (Courgette Fritters) - Makes 18-20 fritters

| 2 large finely chopped, ripe tomatoes |
|---------------------------------------|
| 1 tbsp of dried mint                  |
| 1 egg                                 |
| Sunflower oil                         |
|                                       |

#### Method

1. Mix the courgettes, tomatoes, onion and mint in a bowl. Add the egg and stir the mixture until all the ingredients have combined.

2. Add enough flour to bind the mixture together (add more flour if the mixture is still runny). Season to taste.

3. Heat 3cm of sunflower oil in a shallow frying pan until very hot.

4. Spoon dollops of the mixture into the oil and turn the heat right down. Cook for 2-3 minutes on each side, until golden.

5. Leave to cool on some kitchen roll and serve hot with tzatziki (a refreshing and versatile Greek condiment made with yoghurt and cucumber).
