Gardens in the north part of Tewin were open on Sunday 16<sup>th</sup> May, with refreshments available from Dawley Cottage. This approach ensured that there

were not too many gardens to visit in one day.

The gardens represented a great diversity in location, size and style. There were enough Open Gardens to make up two full days out and enough variety to give all of the visitors plenty to see.

Programmes were excellent value for money, since they were only £2 per adult (with accompanied children free) and enabled visitors to see all of the gardens over the two days. ## **Gardening Tips**

#### Vegetable growing and showing

There has been a re-awaking of interest in vegetable growing, no doubt due to the ever-rising cost of vegetables.

Vegetable growing will appeal to those who want an outdoor life, to keep fit and their minds occupied and active. But, most of all, you will be able to enjoy vegetables that will be 100% fresh and to hand when needed. Do not let anyone tell you that vegetable growing is difficult or laborious, it is not! If Alan Titchmarsh can do it, so can you!

For those of you who are more adventurous and want to go beyond growing for culinary use, I have selected a few vegetables which can be grown for your *THACS* Autumn Show. Good luck, one and all!

Vegetable variety	When to sow or plant for the show
BEETROOT	Sow during the second week of June
Boltardy	
CABBAGE	Sow seeds during first or second week of May.
Go for medium-sized ballheads.	
CARROTS – Long	Must be sown during the second or third week
New Red Intermediate	of April.
James Scarlet Intermediate	
CARROTS – Short	Must be sown during the second or third week
Chantenay Red-cored	of April.
Early Market	
CAULIFLOWER	Sow seeds during first or second week of May.
Dok, Snowball	(Only try to grow cauliflowers for the show if your soil is very good)
CELERY	Sow seeds in March or April, preferably in a
Go for any self-blanching variety	propagator, keeping the temperature even day and night.

### Recipe

#### **Fisherman's Chowder**

Here's a recipe for fisherman's chowder that we recently enjoyed. It is ideal for entertaining friends for lunch on the patio in the summer sunshine. Serve with nice crusty bread and a glass of well-chilled white wine.

#### **Ingredients**

Serves 6-8 50g butter 1 large onion, thinly sliced 125g bacon, de-rinded and chopped 4 sticks celery chopped 1 small red or green pepper, de-seeded and diced 280 ml fish or chicken stock 675g smoked and white fish 280 ml milk 1 heaped tablespoon cornflour Salt and freshly ground pepper

#### Method

Melt the butter in a large saucepan. Fry the onion, bacon, celery, pepper and potato for 5 minutes. Add the stock and simmer until the potatoes are just tender. Skin the fish and cut into cubes, add to the pan. Blend the milk and the cornflour, stir into the pan. Bring to the boil stirring occasionally and simmer for five minutes. Season to taste.
