The field is located at the Burnham Green end of Orchard Road, on the west side of Orchard Road between 40 Orchard Road and the playground opposite Tewin Close.

On The Farm

Wet, Wet, Wet, and I don't mean the pop group.

That's the state of my fields and crops. They are showing yellowing due to wet roots, but now we have had the shortest day and we are getting more light than darkness, crops will start to green up a little. It's been over 2 months since we have done any tractor work on the fields, but luckily there has not been anything to do.

It could be another 2 months before we are able to travel on any land with tractor or sprayer. The fields are pretty water logged and most of the crop trace elements will be washed away with the endless rain. As we work up to our Christmas break, Martyn washes all machines down, lets them dry, then checks for any worn parts, and replaces if needed. He then sprays the machines, with a light covering of oil and they will be packed neatly away in the machinery store, away from the rain, snow and wind.

There are several machines we do not wash, like the combine. After harvest it has a good blow down, and mainly a good hand clean, as it has lots of electronics and wiring looms, no water to get near those parts. Our drill is another machine which has electronics parts, like the tramline kit and the variable sowing rate's kit.

Late November we started to put up the framework of our new barn and have just ordered 40mm composite roof panels and side cladding. Ivor Williams.

Deepening the Mystery

One thing I love about the Christian faith is its rich heritage of imaginative creativity. The story of Jesus has inspired some of the world's most treasured music, literature and art. The Christian God is a creative God - creating the world in its variety and colour, creating human beings in His own image and bringing about a new creation through the perfecting power of Christ.

And so for Christians, the creative arts are a reflection of the creativity of God. This Lent we are enormously fortunate to have some of the world's best contemporary Christian art coming to the Focolare Centre in Welwyn Garden City for a special exhibition. 'Deepening the Mystery' is an exhibition of art from the Methodist contemporary art collection, deemed second only to that owned by the Vatican, and for six weeks the parishes of the Welwyn Team of churches will run a weekly study group reflecting on a different painting from this collection each time. In March we will visit the exhibition and maybe some of us will be inspired to produce our own images as well.

St Peter's News

A church at the heart of the village, with space for all

What an awful time we have been having with almost continuous rain for days on end. Our hearts go out to all affected by the floods across the UK. What a terrible way to start the new year. At the same time we cannot forget the sight of destruction in the Middle East and I am pleased to report that a collection taken at the Tewin Nativity raised over £230 for the UNICEF Gaza appeal fund.

The Tewin Nativity was well attended on 10 December with teenagers and young people taking the parts of Mary, Joseph, the Angel Gabriel, and some of the shepherds. As usual, Susannah found a new baby, only six weeks old to play baby Jesus, who happily slept through the whole event with the real mum close by! In the pictures we saw what appeared to be a beam of light come down from heaven to the Angel Gabriel speaking to the shepherds. And there really was a star in the East for the Kings to follow! This is a lovely event for the whole village with young and old taking part. Thank you to the Carley family for hosting this celebration and to Emma Owen for once again gathering, producing costumes, and directing the cast.

The SAVoce choir who practise at St Peter's gave a most enjoyable concert of Christmassy songs at the beginning of December, with piano and cello accompaniment. The church was full, and thanks to the generosity of visitors, received over £300 in donations. We also welcomed a goodly crowd for our Annual Carol Service on 18^{th} December. Due to illness, we had a smaller choir than usual, but people sang the familiar carols and heard the story of Christ's birth in the candlelit church.

This year Christmas Eve fell on a Sunday when we held three services. In the morning older members of the congregation came to give thanks at Holy Communion. A huge crowd of children with friends and family came to the Crib service in the afternoon, whilst we welcomed other visitors, who had the energy to stay awake, to candlelit Midnight Mass at 11.30pm. For those who had sensibly gone to bed early there was a service on Christmas Day in the morning . We raised £581 at all the Christmas services which will be split between our chosen Christmas charities - Crisis, and The Children's Society. Thank you to our flower arrangers who once again decorated the church so beautifully and especially to the Williams family who donate the Christmas tree every year, and Clare Rawlins who decorates it. Thank you to our bellringers who have turned out through all weathers and at many unsocial hours to ring the bells for our ancient church.

January brings Epiphany – when the gentile magi visited the baby Jesus, and the family were forced to flee into Egypt from the wrath of Herod. We also celebrate the baptism of Christ at this time. In the church we leave the Nativity Scene on the South Aisle altar until Candlemas at the end of January which celebrates the presentation of Christ in the temple.

We have been enormously pleased to see the growth in the number of children with parents and friends who have been attending Messy Church. This began as an experiment but will continue now as a regular feature of our pattern of services each month.

In February we shall be looking forward to Lent with a special service on Ash Wednesday (14 February) at 10am. Our Lent Course will start on Friday 23 February at noon at my house, 30 Godfries Close, when we shall share a soup lunch and then spend time studying a short passage of the bible. Please let me know if you would like to come. All are welcome.

The project for our new meeting room at the church continues to make slow but steady progress. We received positive feedback from our meeting with the Diocesan Advisory Committee who are supporting us to continue developing our plans. We shall need to start fund raising for this project this year. One of the events planned is for the church to take over running an Open Gardens weekend for the village now that THACS is in mothballs for the time being. If you would like to offer your garden for such an event, I would love to hear from you.

Guide to Chimney Safety and Creating the Perfect, Secure Blaze

As winter settles in, there's something magical about gathering around a crackling fire. To make sure your cosy moments are also safe, we've put together a helpful guide to chimney safety and creating the perfect, secure blaze.

Let's start by looking after your chimney. Think of it as the heart of your fireplace. It needs a little TLC to keep things running smoothly. Schedule a visit from a chimney sweep before the winter chill sets in. They'll remove any buildup, especially creosote, a fire risk.

Don't forget the basics. A good chimney cowling keeps out unwanted guests like debris and critters, reducing the chance of blockages. Give your chimney a visual once-over, fixing any wear and tear pronto.

Think of an open fire like an open window, you'll soon notice the cold air when your fire isn't lit. This is the reason why many people choose to go for a log burner, you take your efficiency from 10% to 85%. If you're not using it, it's well worth capping the chimney at the top.

Now, let's talk about building the perfect fire. It's an art, not a science!

Choose Dry Wood:

Opt for seasoned hardwoods like oak or maple. Dry wood burns cleaner, making less smoke and reducing the risk of creosote buildup.

Start Small:

Begin with small, dry kindling before adding bigger logs. It's like giving your fire a warm-up, ensuring a steady burn without a smoky start.

Leave Some Ash:

A little ash between uses (about an inch) acts as insulation, helping the fire maintain its warmth and radiate heat into your space.

Add Detectors:

Install carbon monoxide detectors. While it's uncommon, blockages can lead to this odourless gas. Safety first!

All our Christmas and New Year celebrations are sadly now behind us, there is probably winter still to come, but the beginnings of Spring and snowdrops cannot be far off so we can perhaps look forward hopefully.

Thanks to your generous donations and the hard work of all our staff and volunteers the festive period in the Danesbury shop in Welwyn was particularly successful. We had a beautiful window display from our talented shop manager Georgia, trading was very good and the raffle raised £1,191 for our charitable funds.

The Friends of Danesbury and QVM Hospitals made various small contributions to the Christmas celebrations at the two hospitals including paying for parties with an entertainer. No one wishes to be in hospital at Christmas but the staff in both units work very hard and do their very best to provide as much festive cheer as possible.

At the end of last year the Friends were very pleased to be able to make a much more long term significant contribution to the two hospitals when the charity's trustees agreed to fund a four year lease purchase by the NHS of a new Renault Trafic minibus for use by the patients. For some years patients have enjoyed dedicated transport in the form of a mini bus originally purchased outright by the Friends. Paul Risley, the lead physiotherapist at Danesbury described the patient vehicle as probably the most useful item that the charity had ever purchased. He described it as hugely beneficial for the patients in both hospitals giving the therapy teams flexibility and enabling them to conduct properly organized visits to patients in the community. The existing vehicle, although serviceable, is beginning to age and wheelchairs and specialist seating have been getting bigger. The agreement the Friends have entered into is to fund a four-year lease of the mini-bus at approximately £10,000 per year. The fact that we are able agree to this financial commitment really demonstrates the level of generosity of everyone who contributes to the Danesbury Friends Charity – so again a big thank you to you all.

Walking in the Dark

In these dark nights it is challenging to walk through the village safely after dark. The ROSPA (Royal Society for Prevention of Accidents) gives the following advice:

When walking at night:

1. **Stay alert**: Stay aware of your surroundings and avoid being distracted by your phone or other devices.

2. Walk facing oncoming traffic: This will allow you to see any approaching vehicles and give you more time to react.

3. Wear bright or reflective clothing or use a flashlight or headlamp to increase your visibility to other road users: This will make it easier for drivers to see you and help you stay visible in low-light conditions.

4. **Stay on the pavement**: If no pavement is available, walk as close to the side of the road as possible, facing oncoming traffic.

5. Avoid wearing headphones: Wearing headphones can make it harder for you to hear what's happening around you.
