The 23rd of February is the anniversary of the death, in 1633, of George Herbert, priest and poet. Herbert bequeathed to the world a substantial number of poems, some of which have been set to music, subsequently becoming well known hymns e.g. "Teach me my God and king" and "Let all the world in every corner sing".

Herbert was born in 1593 into a wealthy and artistic family. He went to Trinity College Cambridge where he excelled in languages and music. His intention was to become a priest but he came to the attention of James 1 who saw his potential as a politician. He served in Parliament for two years but after that his sense of vocation to the priesthood was renewed and in 1630 he took holy orders in the Church of England, serving as the Rector of the parish of Fuggleston St Peter with Bemerton St Andrew near Salisbury. Although Herbert's time as a priest was short, he was an exemplary pastor and was noted for his unfailing care for his parishioners, bringing them the sacraments when ill and providing food and clothing for those in need.

In addition to his religious poetry, which was published as "The Temple, or sacred poems and private ejaculations", he wrote a manual of practical advice to the clergy which was entitled "A Priest to the Temple or The Country Parson". In it, he advises that "things of ordinary use" such as ploughs, leaven, or dances, could be made to "serve for lights even of Heavenly Truths". He also published a collection of proverbs of his own devising, some of which are still repeated today such as "his bark is worse than his bite".

By the time this edition of the Parish News is published, our much loved friend and vicar, Coralie, will have left for pastures new. As far as I know she hasn't written poetry or published manuals of advice for clergy, but I'm sure you'll agree that she is an exemplary pastor and tireless proclaimer of the gospel of the good news of Jesus Christ, able to see Heaven in the ordinary things of life. She will be sorely missed.

Annual Report about the Tewin website 2010/11.



The Website group has met six times this year in January, March, May, July, September and November to review the website. Overall there has been an average of 600 hits per month during the year and we continue to get odd compliments from people outside the village for the range of material and the fact that it is regularly up to date.

Up to now the website has been financed by village organisations – Friends of Tewin, THACS, the Church, Parish Council, Memorial Hall and this year, Tewin Stores. But from now on the costs will be even less than the £70+ per annum we have been paying. This is because early in 2010 Felix Green, our Technical Advisor, found that there was a government-sponsored server "e-voice", which was developed by the previous administration, especially for community websites such as ours. This is free of charge, so from now on, we shall simply have to pay a nominal fee for the domain name "tewinvillage.co.uk" every two years and no server charges will apply. Any business in the village may still have an entry free of charge on the Business page. Further new entries have been added this year.

We have been preparing to migrate to the new server, and its much simpler methods of updating the site, during the second half of 2010. The changeover finally occurred in November. I hope that people have had an opportunity to see the new-look Tewin website. During the year there have been improvements made to a number of the existing pages, plus the addition of a new page for Where to stay in Tewin, also one for Tewin Stores and the Art Gallery/Coffee shop. This page will have further enhancements in 2011. The new software for the site has enabled us to add a new page for the Pavilion with an on-line calendar to aid booking the hall. We intend to do the same thing in 2011 for the Memorial Hall bookings. Rod Frayne and Julia Tizzard may get involved in this, taking over the Memorial Hall pages from Lynn Farr.

I am sure you will all want to join with me in thanking the volunteers who continue to give their time to updating and improving the website:

Derek Adams who normally keeps the home page up to date and is our minute secretary but has also been working on his PhD thesis this year.

Felix Green our Technical Advisor has redesigned the site and many pages this year. Doreen Lloyd, our Parish Council rep, who also works on the Friends of Tewin page, the new Pavilion page and with Alf Fulford on the THACS pages. John Ling has recently joined the team to support Alf and Doreen and produce more photos for the site. Lia Parkinson who this year has particularly worked on bringing the Church pages up to date. Nicky Hadley now edits the Parish News and Caroline McFarlane who does the same for the Parish Council and Teen pages, and has done some work on the Pavilion project pages. Christine Spendley for Tewin Stores and Art Gallery/Coffee shop, Liz Goscomb for the Tewin Under Fives and finally Lynn Farr for the Memorial Hall. **Do take a look at the new-look site and give us feedback**

PRESCRIPTIONS

Bridge Cottage GP surgery in Old Welwyn offer a service where you can leave your prescriptions and any money in a special locked letter box in the Rose & Crown Pub, Tewin. Prescriptions will be taken to the surgery on Tuesdays and Thursdays by 1.30pm. The completed prescription will then be collected from the GP surgery on Tuesdays & Thursdays and returned to a locked safe at the Rose & Crown. Please ask at the bar to collect the drugs after 3pm.

POTHOLES

If you need to report a defect/pothole in the road or pavement you can either:-

1. Ring the Highways fault line 01438-737321 and provide them with details of where the defect is, its size, the road name and a house number can help find the exact location.

2. Go online to www.hertsdirect.org and click on "Highways Fault Reporting" on the right hand side of the screen and follow the instructions. You can search for the location by address and will be asked to mark the exact location of the pothole on a map.

In both cases you will receive a reference number to track the pothole repairs.
