On The Farm

Where do I stand with my farm today, the 12th of May. We are so lucky the we have no cereal crops this spring, only peas sown on the 13th of April. We are also so lucky that all cereal crops were sown in September & October. Little did we know Storm Barbet would hit us with almost 6 months of rain. The farm crops did not look well in February & March, the rain having washed all the nutrients out of the soil and the crops just looked water logged. Not a good prospect for Harvest.

It seems as if Mother Nature has taken a hand since the beginning of April. The earlier drilled crops on free draining soil, look fantastic, they have had their T0 and T1 sprays on time and now about to get their T2 spray, at Flag Leaf emergence, to keep the wheat clean of diseases. Martyn has travelled over the wheat crops several times with a little dose of Nitrogen every time, just like I have been doing with my Sprayer, with the T0 / T1 and T2, these are growth stages of the growing crop. With this wet weather our main fungal disease is Septoria, which must be kept at bay. Every time I travel through the crops a trace element spray is done with Magnesium, Sulphur, Boron, Potassium & Calcium.

Our peas, now sown a month ago, are nicely showing in their rows, the soil is nicely moist after some more rain, the soil temperatures are rising and the crop should take off. But we will have to control those pigeons, our biggest pest.

Notes from an Apiary

May already. Our colonies are expanding and healthy. Bees have been flying and foraging but then wet, cold weather and a warning from the British Beekeepers Association of colony starvation. Do we feed them? Well, no, we think our colonies have sufficient stores, but the honey yield looks low. Not to worry, it won't help.

Honeybees are a "super organism", they only survive as a group. Population is expanded or in effect maintained by natural splitting of the colony and flying away to a new home and splitting again and again. Net effect, you have no bees left in your apiary. Not the plan! A couple of our colonies prepared to swarm, so we have taken preventative measures and now have three new colonies in the apiary. We hope these new colonies will thrive and become mature colonies or that we can merge back into the parent colony.

In my last notes I mentioned the Asian Hornet. This creature is now moving into the UK. It is thought to be permanent in France and is estimated to have caused a loss of up to 50% of Honeybee colonies. Yes, half of the Honeybee population of France has succumbed to this ravenous insect. Ravenous it is, once it has cleared out the insect population in an area it will go for European Hornets and Honeybees. DEFRA and BBKA are on the case to control and destroy any colonies found but they need our help. There is a poster in Tewin Stores with more information and an "app" available, "Asian Hornet Watch". You can download the app to help identify and report sightings. PLEASE look at the information and help control this non-native species. Phil

St Peter's News

A New Meeting Room for St Peter's

This month I have decided to concentrate on giving you an update on where we are with the project to provide improved facilities for St Peter's to provide a warm, welcoming, safe place for Messy Church and to visitors to the church for Sunday worship and Special events such as Weddings and Funerals.

We showed the village a first design with a separate toilet block to the east of the South Porch, a meeting room, toilets, and separate kitchen to the southwest linked to the South Porch by a long corridor, at the 2nd Open Meeting on 1 April 2023.

The team then produced a revised set of plans which included everything in one building to the southwest of the South Porch, which. were submitted to the East Herts planning authority as a Pre-App, and to the Herts Conservation Officer, for comment and advice. We obtained the support of local District and County Councillors, and the Parish Council for the project proposal in principle. We then arranged for a feasibility study to be done to see if we could raise the necessary funds and we requested a Written Scheme of Investigation to be outlined by a local archaeology company. The Diocesan Advisory Committee (DAC) visited us on 20 November, to see our ideas and to give their comments.

Our church is a Grade 1 listed building and is of interest to many heritage groups, who along with the DAC, and local people gave their comments on the design and site proposal. A model of the design was on show at the Christmas Bazaar and in the church in December and January. The DAC members agree we have made a convincing case for the need for improved facilities. We recognise that the building design we produced last year was larger than we need and that we must find the ideal site for any new meeting room.

With advice from the DAC we have produced an appraisal of all the possible places for a new meeting room, both inside and outside the church, a timeline of all the changes that have occurred at St Peter's in

the past ten centuries and an audit of how we currently use the church and will want to use it in future. We also met an Inspector from Historic England in early March to talk through all the options and ways to move forward.

We want our church to continue to hold a special place in our village, to be a welcoming hub for the community we serve. We do not want it to become one of those 3,500 odd which have closed during the past ten years and now have no-one to ensure the upkeep of the building. The church has welcomed people here to worship for over 1,000 years. Our regular congregation needs more young people to survive. Our view is that we must have a meeting space and better facilities to enable this to happen. We must adapt and be flexible and come to a reasonable compromise both with the community we serve and the heritage groups who want to protect our church.

This project has never been seen as separate from the overall mission of the church to be *at the heart of the village with space for all*, nor from our focus on the Church of England's aim to become Net Zero carbon by 2030. It has to be viewed as working towards all those aims.

Thank you to the team which has worked hard on this project so far and an enormous thank you to all those who turned up to help with the Spring Cleaning in the church this month to make it look bright and sparkling for the summer wedding season.

Please support Tewin Open Gardens at Petertide on Saturday 29th and Sunday 30th June, which this year will be in aid of church funds.

Citizens Advice East Herts Forced To Reduce Service Due To Funding Shortfall

People often don't realise that Citizens Advice East Herts is an independent, local charity. While we are a member of National Citizens Advice, we receive no funding from them or from central government. We are able to run our free advice service thanks to local authority grants, applications to trusts and foundations, community fundraising and other donations.

The cost of living crisis means funding is now much harder to come by. Client need has also grown, costing us more time and money to resolve. At the same time, inflation means our running costs have increased significantly. We are not alone in facing these challenges.

This means we at Citizens Advice East Herts have had to make a number of difficult decisions over the last few months. We have come to a point where we cannot do more for less.

Due to the funding shortfall, from the first week in May 2024, our **advice** service will be closed on Fridays.

From Thursday 1st May, our Message Line will be open from midnight every Sunday to midnight the following Thursday and be closed to messages the rest of the time.

If clients call outside those times, they will be directed to the Citizens Advice National Adviceline.

Our opening hours for responding to client messages will be Monday to Thursday, 10 am to 4 pm.

In the meantime, we are looking for community champions who can support our fundraising efforts by putting us in touch with associates and contacts in the corporate world or keeping us abreast of other fundraising events or opportunities. Take A Sec To Check Your Blood Pressure

The NHS in Hertfordshire and West Essex is urging people aged 40 and over to come forward for a potentially life-saving blood pressure check.

Around one in four adults in the UK have high blood pressure, but only half of those are aware of it. High blood pressure (hypertension) doesn't usually have any obvious symptoms, making it an invisible threat to many. If left untreated, high blood pressure can lead to a heart attack or stroke.

People who are Black or South Asian are more likely to be at risk from high blood pressure, so if this applies to you or your family members, it's even more important for you to come forward for a check.
