## The Revd Stephen Fielding, Curate in the Welwyn Team, writes:

'One of the great pleasures of being attached to St Peter's Church Tewin is that it gives me weekly contact with the school. I can't tell you how terrific it is to take the regular assembly every Wednesday morning, to see the children and to learn with them, to sing together and to say our prayers, to hear the great stories from the Scriptures, and to meet the staff and the head teacher who together are doing such great things for the children in our community.

In addition to the head teacher, I want to say a special word of thanks to Ruth Kearns, who has been instrumental in deepening the links between the church and the school, and therefore the whole community of Tewin.

Please take advantage of the open invitation to come to the Wednesday morning assembly in the school. It is at 10.25, after the break, and lasts for 15 to 20 minutes. We sing a song or a hymn, a pupil will read from the Bible and we say our prayers. You will be impressed by the attentiveness of the children, and I hope will gain something, as I do, from this shared act of worship.

# Churchwardens' Notes

20<sup>th</sup> March at 7.30pm, we have our Annual Meeting of Parishioners, followed by our Annual Parochial Church Meeting (APCM) at St Peter's. This is your opportunity to elect new Churchwardens and members of the PCC. Sidesmen are appointed at this meeting. We rarely have a flood of nominations for the post of Churchwarden. In the absence of any volunteers, you may like to consider becoming a 'Deputy Warden' for a year in order to obtain a better understanding of what is involved. Failing this, we would welcome volunteers to look after specific items such as archives; building extension; maintenance and repairs; the redesign of the Parish News; and a number of other items. Please do talk to either of the Churchwardens if you think that you may be able to help.

Progress continues towards the recruitment of a new Team Vicar. The 'Profile', giving a "person specification", together with details of the Team Ministry and churches within Team, has been approved by the PCCs in the Team. The advertisement for the post has been published in the Church Times and on the Diocesan website, with a response date of 7<sup>th</sup> March. Short-listing is scheduled for 17<sup>th</sup> March.

Lent begins with Ash Wednesday on 9 March. Once again there will be Lent Groups meeting across the Welwyn Team. Please see the separate booklet in the church for full details. This also includes details of Easter Services. As many of you will know, we have struggled with the problem of the need for extra space at St Peter's since at least the 1980's. A number of schemes have been developed but have not progressed for various reasons. A group from the Diocesan Advisory Committee visited in 2008 and recommended an extension in the area of the south porch. In February we had a long site meeting with a prospective new architect. It is clear that we will need archaeological and conservation reports in addition to all the normal planning and faculty procedures. For a modest, timber framed extension it appears the cost would be in the area of at least £150,000, a massive sum for a small village church, but without which it seems we will continue to fail to attract families looking for Sunday School and crèche facilities. This will be a major topic for the new PCC to handle after the AGM.

Finally, we were very pleased to welcome Paul, Bishop of Hertford, to our service on 20<sup>th</sup> February. It was his first visit, and indeed our first since Christopher, Bishop of St Albans, visited in 2003. Despite it being a half term weekend, there were around 90 in church, including 15 children and with the Brownies and Rainbows 'on parade'!

### Friends of Danesbury & The Queen Victoria Memorial Hospital

As reported earlier this year, The Friends were selected by Waitrose in Welwyn Garden City as one of three local charities to be supported in their "Community Matters" collection for January. Thanks to their generosity, and to their customers who chose to give us their tokens, we will receive a marvellous donation of  $\pounds$ 454! We could not be more delighted.

The newly completed Day Room at Danesbury Neurological Centre required major funding but this has not stopped The Friends from funding a number of new purchases to benefit patients and their carers. Notable items include a state-of-the-art electronic Standing Frame and new Exercise machines for the Physio-therapy department. We have also bought video equipment for use in patient assessment.

The Friends are also providing finance for a six month trial in the Psychiatric unit which will be of immediate help to both patients and their nursing staff.

The Day Room is now in full use and the Trustees have agreed to fund the refurbishment of the existing kitchen next to this area. This, together with improvements currently being undertaken by the NHS, will mean that the whole of the ground floor patient facility will be purpose built and up to date in every way.

Each year a group of amateur players based at *The Goat* in Codicote put on a pantomime at the Civic Centre in Welwyn Garden City. Led by Johnny Tait, this year it was their own very particular version of *Robin Hood.* As always it was a runaway success, playing to full houses, and raised proceeds exceeding £4,000. Johnny and his colleagues have donated this money to the Friends. We are enormously grateful for their generosity - and cannot wait for this year's production.
