TREE WORKS IN THE PARISH

A quote for various tree works has been accepted by the Parish Council following a survey of land at Tewin Hill and Upper Green in the responsibility of Tewin Parish Council. Rob Cooper will be carrying out these works in due course.

Chamber Choir to Perform in Welwyn on Saturday 9 November at 12 noon

For the *Second Saturday Recital* in St Mary's Welwyn in November we shall be welcoming the Positif Chamber Choir.

The choir was formed in 2000 and about half of their original singers are still members. In 2010, Positif was "highly commended" in the BBC Choir of the Year competition for their performance of '*If ye love me*' by Thomas Tallis.

Positif's concerts locally alternate with services in cathedrals as a visiting choir. In 2024 they have sung at Southwark and Rochester Cathedrals and are looking forward to singing at Knebworth House in a performance of 'A Christmas Carol' by Charles Dickens.

Founder Jill Knight is a choir director, pianist and organist, with over 40 years experience in music education. She has led church and community choirs in the UK, Hamburg and Vancouver, and for five years she was Education and Outreach Manager for Hatfield House Chamber Music Festival.

Among the instrumentalists taking part on 9 November are Chris Muhley, Parish Organist at St Albans Cathedral; Tom Semple (trumpet), a consultant radiologist; and Rebekah Knight (violin and soprano soloist) and Josh Winter (cello), who are both surgeons at the Royal Vet College in Brookmans Park.

The programme for the concert is designed to tie in with Remembrance Weekend with music by Bruckner, Stanford, James Macmillan and the *'Pie Jesu'* and *'In Paradisum'* from Fauré's Requiem.

This concert is free to attend, with a collection afterwards to support the church's work to introduce youngsters to singing and music generally.

Team Vicar's Letter

On a hillside, not far from Bethlehem, is a small farm on contested land. For several generations it has been in the possession of the Nasaars, a Christian-Palestinian family. For the last 30 years however that ownership has been challenged by the Israeli authorities which has resulted in expensive court proceedings, and all too regular acts of destruction designed to hamper the Nasaar's livelihood. When a group of us from Tewin and Datchworth paid a visit to them some 12 years ago, the family's water supply had been cut off, large boulders had been placed across the road to hinder access to their land and whole groves of olive trees had been hacked to the ground. Facebook tells me that the family are still fighting to stay in the only place they have lived.

Yet outside of their farm, painted on a large boulder in English and Arabic are these words: 'We refuse to be enemies'

Watching the escalating conflict in the Middle East, the memory of people such as the Nasaars, place both sorrow and hope within my heart. Sorrow - because the cost of this conflict weighs heavily on very ordinary families, just like theirs and yours and mine. Hope because despite the hate that has caused immense suffering for both Israeli and Arab, there are still many people who refuse to give in to that.

The two world wars of the last century are fading from living memories, but the gathering for a collective remembrance continues to be both an act of sorrow and of hope. Come and join us as we stand together and pledge that we will play our part to pursue all that makes for peace in this most fractured world.

St Peter's News

A church at the heart of the village, with space for all

The PCC met at the beginning of October, where there was much to discuss. It has been a busy summer in the church, with the Summer Evensongs, the Poetry Pilgrimage, our joint service with All Saints' Datchworth on Burnham Green in addition to the regular services on Sundays and Monday prayers. We said "goodbye" to Pete, had inspections for Fire safety, electrics, and guttering, and the trees were surveyed. During October we have celebrated the life of the late Elke Lonergan, a long term resident of Tewin, and then, at the end of the month we bid a fond, sad farewell to Linda Williams. Linda has been a stalwart of our church, taking various roles as a talented flower arranger, Sidesman, cleaner, and, of course, attender beside Ivor. We shall miss her unfailing optimism in the face of her ill health, her smile, and cheerfulness, and her beautiful landscapes. Rest in peace. Due to concern over Linda's state of health, for only the second time in the past fifty years, Ivor did not read the lesson in church for Harvest Festival. He did, as ever, deliver sheaves of wheat as part of the decoration of the church, for which many thanks. The flowers, bread and mice looked wonderful - thank you to all who decorated the church and to those who donated goods for the Food Shed in Stevenage. We also collected almost £260 for the Bishop's Harvest Appeal for the Leprosy Mission.

Now the days are chilly again, the heating is back on in church and we have been trying to ensure there are fewer draughts for the events to come. The month kicked off with a Bellringing extravaganza on the first Saturday, with training at Tewin carried out by the County Association. Messy Church began again in September with the celebration of harvest, and met again on the third Sunday in October, followed by Evensong at 6.30pm. The school normally comes for Harvest Festival also, but this year the weather was too wet for the pupils to walk over to the church, and so the service took place at Tewin Cowper. The project team for the new meeting room had a site visit at St Peter's with representatives from the Diocesan Advisory committee, local councillors, Historic England, Conservation and Planning Officers from East Herts. The good news is that we have moved the

project forward by agreeing to a possible site of the new building alongside the south chancel, where there was a vestry until 1903. We shall now put forward some designs for this building, which we will share with the congregation and village in due course.

Your church needs you! Sadly we have gaps now in our rotas for cleaning, flower arrangers and keeping the churchyard tidy. Please see the advertisement elsewhere in the magazine (p27).

Looking forward to November, we shall commemorate those whom we have loved and lost at All Souls on Sunday evening 3rd November at 6.30pm. All are welcome to come to this peaceful, loving service to remember and light a candle. Our service of Remembrance will begin as usual at 10.50am around the War Memorial outside the church, on Sunday 10th November, with the children coming from school for their own service the following day – Armistice Day. Messy Church will be on Sunday 17th November. The following Sunday 24th – there will be a special service at St Mary's, Welwyn to celebrate the beginning of Advent at 6.30pm which is candlelit.

Finally, please don't forget to come to this year's Christmas Bazaar at Tewin Memorial Hall from 1 - 4pm on Saturday 30^{th} November. A full page advertisement, elsewhere in the magazine, tells you all about this year's event, which will be a bit different from previous years with lots of things for families. Please contribute items for sale – gifts, cakes, plants, jewellery. There will be many of the usual stalls plus much more. Please do support this event which is the biggest fund raiser for the church during the year. Bring all your friends!

Autumn was well and truly with us by October, which means we have to redouble our efforts to keep the courts

clear of leaves.

Our efforts had a false start or two since the Tiger Turf was laid eighteen months ago. Perhaps it was the contractors' over-enthusiastic use of the sand that keeps the turf bedded in, but our roller brushing system seemed to bog down with sand more quickly than leaves.

But we are close to being there, with a recently-acquired decent handheld, rechargeable leaf blower that clears the court reasonably quickly. It's a two-person job once a week, so please be generous when you're asked to put in an hour once or twice a year.

It's almost ten years since the club set up a working party to dig and plant a hedge in front of Mr Loughrey's wall at the end of our courts. 70 or so hedge saplings – hornbeam, hazel, field maple, guelder rose and a few other varieties – were planted. At the time they looked slightly lost against the new brick wall, but now we have a truly splendid hedge that maybe, before long, will need a bit of trimming. Those who hoped the hedge would provide a screen against the sun while serving, however, may have to wait rather longer!

We look forward to seeing members at the Tewin Pavilion for our Autumn Quiz night on Friday 1st November, kindly hosted again by Gerry and Chris. Doors open 6.30pm for 7pm start.

Teams consist of eight people – you can either arrange your own team or we will find random people for you to quiz with. To avoid a squash we are only inviting tennis club members and their spouses this time. We will also be having fewer rounds to facilitate more chat and hopefully sourcing a microphone.
