PRECEPT

At their meeting on 2^{nd} December 2024 the Parish Council reviewed the precept options for the Financial Year Ending 31.3.2026 and in accordance with the Financial Regulations of the Council they unanimously agreed to increase the precept from £38,000 to £43,500 to accommodate inflation rises and contingency against ongoing annual parish tree works.

On Monday 17th February we will be showing *East of Eden (1955)* starring the legendary James Dean in his first starring performance.

Directed by Elia Kazan this is one of the great film classics, based on the second half of John Steinbeck's novel of the same name. Dean plays Cal Trask, a mixed-up kid who, while trying to find his identity, seeks approval from his father against his favoured brother, thereby retelling the story of Cain and Abel. Julie Harris, Raymond Massey, Burl Ives and Jo Van Fleet provide a great supporting cast with Jo Van Fleet winning an Oscar for Best Supporting Actress.

Dean's Method acting techniques and uninhibited performance made him controversial to the old guard and a beloved idol to the younger generation of his time. Seven months after the film opened James Dean died in that fateful automobile accident.

The doctor can see you on Saturday 8 February at 12 noon in St Mary's church

.... But he probably will not be bringing his stethoscope since he retired from being a GP in St Albans more than five years ago! But that's no reason for YOU not to get along to see HIM!

Dr Julian Godlee, the bass-baritone, will give a recital with his pianist partner Brenda Blewett in St Mary's, Welwyn on 8 February as part of St Mary's *Second Saturday Recitals* series.

As a youngster Julian was head chorister at King's College Cambridge under Sir David Willcocks. During this time he took part in tours of Europe and Africa, and, of course, featured in the famous broadcasts of the Christmas Nine Lessons and Carols from King's.

He studied singing with Sir Peter Pears, and sang with The Taverner Consort under Andrew Parrott, and The Academy of St Martin in the Fields with Sir Neville Mariner.

After a long career in medicine Julian retired to concentrate once more on his first love – singing. Since then he has performed as soloist on Classic FM and BBC Radio 3, and his many CD recordings for Cambridge Records include Schumann's *Dichterliebe* and Schubert's cycle *Schwanengesang*.

Julian will be partnered for this recital by the pianist Brenda Blewett. Until September 2019 Brenda was Head of Accompaniment at Chetham's School of Music in Manchester, alongside an active performing career. As a recitalist, her performances have taken her to major venues and festivals throughout the UK, Europe, Los Angeles and New York; and she has given live broadcasts on BBC Radio 3 and Classic FM.

The main work in their programme will be Robert Schumann's great song cycle *'Liederkreis'* Op 24. Intriguingly, their programme will end with songs by Schubert, Eva Cassidy and Sting.

The concert starts at 12 noon and lasts for one hour. All are welcome and the concert is free to attend, no tickets required. There will be a retiring collection afterwards to cover artists' fees and support the church's work to introduce youngsters to singing and music generally.

Team Vicar's Letter

A few years ago the Cabinet Office did some research into job satisfaction. Being a vicar came out top! I'm not surprised. Not only do I get to be part of loving church communities I also get to journey with members of the wider community in key moments of their lives. Over the last thirteen years in these parishes, this has provided some of the most uplifting, privileged and thought-provoking parts of my ministry.

There's the joy of meeting with parents who would like their children baptised and having conversations about the reasons why raising their children with a knowledge of God's love is important to them.

There is the utter delight in helping those getting married plan for their wedding day. The wedding itself is always an occasion of great joy, but also I just love hearing about their lives and helping them think a little about how taking vows in a sacred place might add a deeper dimension to the love and commitment they already share together.

Then there is the part of my ministry where I am asked to journey alongside those coming to terms with the loss of a loved one, and help them plan a fitting tribute to say goodbye. Funerals are by their nature a sad event, but also in these moments of sitting with families or individuals there is often deep thanksgiving and laughter amidst the tears. Hearing whole life stories and sitting with families where love is palpable is the most extraordinary privilege.

In all of these encounters I get to see how the Christian story of new beginnings and an eternal love speaks into lives today as much as it always has. It is in these conversations, as much as it is in church, that I sense God to be very close indeed.

A church at the heart of the village, with space for all

February already! The year is rushing by. Looking back at Christmas, the church was full for all the Christmas activities. On Saturday 21st we welcomed the Hertford Chamber Choir for a delightful candlelit concert at St Peter's. This is the first time they have given a concert here and it was extremely well supported and much enjoyed. Thank you to Sabine Stanley for organising this event.

The following morning we were much entertained by children from Messy Church and Tewin Cowper School as they performed a Nativity play for the congregation. I am awarding special praise to the inn keeper whose sleep kept being disturbed, and to the young lady who was the star in the east who kept her arms aloft for minutes on end to enable the shepherds and kings to find the baby Jesus and Mary and Joseph. It is so important for our young people to know the story of the birth of Jesus and to be involved in the life of the church.

Our other Christmas services - the candlelit Carol Service, the Crib service, the Midnight Mass on Christmas Eve and the family service on Christmas morning - were all well attended, and it was also good to see old friends who were visiting Tewin at this time. Our collections at the main Christmas Services, totalling £522.00, will be split equally between two charities – *The Children's Society* and *Embrace the Mid-dle East*.

Despite the dreadful high winds on New Year's Eve, if you opened the door for a short while, it was possible to hear the bells ringing out the old year and ringing in the new.

Storm Darragh also brought down a part of the drainpipe on the church tower. Hopefully this will be repaired soon. Our services in February have returned to normal with Messy Church taking place on 16th February. You may notice that we keep the crib and the Christmas tree in the church throughout January, until Candlemas. This is traditionally the time when we celebrate the presentation of Christ in the temple, which this year is on the first Sunday in February.

Now a word about the churchyard. We no longer have Pete Johnson who was our Verger and who came almost daily to keep the churchyard spick and span. So please, if you come to care for a grave, will you take any dead flowers or other material away with you. If you walk your dog in the churchyard please remember that you should keep it on a lead and respect the graves of those who lie here. If you stop to enjoy a coffee and sandwiches, please take your rubbish home with you. And if you can help with tidying the churchyard, we have a regular working party from 9am on a Saturday morning every couple of months. I hope this year will be a happy, healthy one for us all but we all know that realistically that cannot be. The winter can be hard for many of us. Safeguarding in the Church of England and in the Welwyn Team Ministry A statement from the clergy of the Welwyn Team

You will have heard in recent weeks of major failings within the Church of England, with regard to safeguarding practice and the care of victims after disclosures of abuse. It has been a time of deep shame and sorrow, and although painful to face, we hope will be a catalyst for greater transparency and accountability in the future. Our prayers are particularly with those who have suffered abuse at the hands of those who were trusted.

As clergy in this Welwyn Team of churches we want to pay tribute to the diligent and energetic work of our Parish Safeguarding Officers (PSOs), PCCs and the Diocesan Safeguarding Team who support us in our commitment to ensure that these churches are places of safety and accountability. We realise that much of their work is unseen and thought at this time it might be useful to outline to you, our congregation and wider community, some of the procedures we have in place to help protect those in our care.

- We have five Parish Safeguarding Officers and three Safer Recruiters who, with the clergy, share the responsibility of the oversight that safeguarding procedures, training and DBS checks are up to date.
- Safeguarding training is compulsory for clergy, Readers, churchwardens, PCC members and those who work/volunteer with activities with children and vulnerable adults.
- Every PCC has a Safeguarding policy that is displayed in our churches and on our websites, along with contact details of the Incumbents, PSO and the Diocesan Safeguarding Team. Safeguarding is a standing item at all of our PCC, Team Council and Ministry Team meetings.
- We follow the national church guidelines with regard to safe practice.
- Volunteers are provided with a Code of Conduct of expected behaviour whilst working with children and vulnerable adults, as well as clear details of how to report concerns about a child or the behaviour of another volunteer or member of the clergy.

Policies and procedures have their place, but most importantly, we believe, is the building of a culture in all our churches where every person feels an equal responsibility to ensure the safekeeping of others and can share concerns with the knowledge they will be handled appropriately. We are committed in promoting this.

Finally, we want to say thank you to all who take an active role on behalf of the church in caring for children, young people, the frail and housebound and those vulnerable in other ways. Theirs is good and valuable work. We are grateful for every ounce of their care and commitment.

Despite the increasing use of social media, the website's statistics for 2024 show that the site is well used and busier than ever.
