A Letter from Mick Simmons

I don't know if it's just my imagination, but Spring seems to have begun very early this year. Daffodils have been blooming in my garden since the end of February and everywhere I look I see trees and hedgerows coming into bud and in some instances even into blossom and, as I write, it's only the middle of March. The people in the know have been telling us for a while that Spring is now starting a couple of weeks earlier in the year, but this year it seems that it's almost a month early! Perhaps those who talk of climate change have got it right.

But if Spring is early, Easter this year is as late as it can be with Easter Day falling on the 24th April. This of course has nothing to do with climate change but is due to the way the Church calendar operates. However, for most of this month in the run-up to Easter we are still in the season of Lent and our Lent courses are in full swing across the Welwyn Team. This year's course has been devised by the bishops and follows the theme of "Living God's Love". It's an excellent course covering six weeks and it's full of meaty topics for discussion and provides much food for mental and spiritual sustenance. Ted Sharp and Stephen Fielding are leading the Tewin course on Fridays at 7.30 pm at Ted's home, 60, Orchard Road.

Incidentally, in case you were wondering about the origins of the words Lent and Easter, Lent is the Old English word for spring and is derived from the Germanic word for "long" because in the Spring, days visibly lengthen. Easter derives from the name of an Anglo-Saxon pagan goddess Eostre, whose month was April but whose worship was replaced by the Christian "Paschal" season, a term which refers to the suffering, death, resurrection and glorification of Jesus Christ.

I hope you have a happy and blessed Easter.

Churchwardens' Notes



March began with a visit from U3A (University of the Third Age) of Ware. Over twenty members came and we provided coffee and biscuits and a short talk. They appeared to enjoy their visit and made an unsolicited donation. We also received an offer of a return visit to St Peter's later in the year to demonstrate brass-rubbing.

The next day was even livelier when thirty children from Honeybees class visited from the school, accompanied by five staff. Stephen and seven of our congregation were 'in attendance'. This enabled the children to be split into groups and rotate around items of interest, such as the organ (three playing at the same time!); the bells; flower arranging and decoration; the altar and vessels; ideas of activities, such as teddy bear parachuting; and the churchyard. In all, a very enjoyable occasion!

Early in March, there was a meeting of the Team Council. This is a forum, with four meetings a year, which promotes an exchange of ideas, particularly related to matters which we might find difficult to arrange on our own but which work well with five churches involved. An example is the themed series of Summer Evensongs which have become a regular feature. This year we are hoping to once again have a team cathedral visit. Norwich is our choice for this visit and David has achieved the agreement of Bishop Alan Winton to show us around. This is scheduled for Saturday, 10 September. Put it in your diary now! Our PCC met on 14th March, when the accounts and annual reports were approved for submission to the Annual Parochial Church Meeting on 20th March. We once again made a reserve to our fabric fund but still managed to break-even. If we proceed with an extension in the area of the South Porch, we will clearly need more funds. For the present, we have agreed to proceed in phases, the first being consideration of moving the Sabine Memorial. As churchwardens are elected at the Annual Meeting, there is a possibility that this will be our last notes. Thank you for reading them!

The process of finding a new Team Vicar has made good progress. At the time of writing, a number of applications have been received and short-listing has taken place. Interviews are scheduled for the end of March. Thus, very shortly, we should have more definite news.

The cotton holding the gold thread on the altar frontal continues to deteriorate. We are most grateful to Elizabeth Buchanan who has again been busy with repairs. It seems that there is now more to do! Thank you Elizabeth!

With Spring just around the corner, we find that we have seventeen weddings booked for this year. So, a busy time ahead.

'The aim of the Men's Breakfast is both to enable fellowship amongst the men of the congregations which comprise the Welwyn Team and to enable friends to have contact and enjoy fellowship with the Church community.

John Lee

It was with great sadness that the village heard the news of the death of John Lee.

As many people know, John had lived in the village since the early 1960's and had been involved in much of the life of the village.

Always prepared to help out in any capacity, he had much to do with Tewin [Wood] Players, perhaps only treading the boards on a couple of occasions but mainly back stage building the sets and filling in whenever needed.

It was John and Peter Briggs who worked tirelessly for the Village Hall when times were hard and things such as rewiring, installing new central heating and a permanent stage were needed.

John served on the Parish Council and was a founder member of the Tewin Society. He soon became Chairman and later, President. It was his idea to have evening classes that are held in Burnham Green Village Hall. He has even been known to help out at P.A. jumble sales and fetes.

He and Ann, along with Christine and Arthur Edwards, were perhaps the instigators of *'The History of Tewin'*, when they put together a talk on the subject at the Village Hall. When the book was first mooted John therefore had already done much of the spadework for his chapters on geology and archaeology.

John, a graduate of UCL, went first to De Havilland Propellers, working on *Bluestreak* and *Firestreak* air to air missiles, then to becoming Managing Director of Hawker Siddeley Dynamics Engineering.

In a lighter vein, John was always keen to enthuse his own and other people's grandchildren with his loves of archaeology and aircraft, organising trips to places such as Duxford and various museums.

TEWIN MEMORIAL HALL FUNDING and AGM (27th April, at 8pm)

- 1. The Tewin Memorial Hall Committee is delighted to report that its application to the Community Capital Grants Scheme has been successful and the Hall has been granted the maximum amount of £8,000 towards refurbishment of the kitchen and bar area. This sum has to be matched by Hall funds to the tune of £8,500. We are now preparing the necessary specification for the area and will commence work as soon as practicable.
- 2. The Committee is once again indebted to the members of the Tewin History Book Group, who have donated a further £500 to the Memorial Hall, bringing their total donations up to the magnificent sum of £5,000. All proceeds from the sale of *'The History of Tewin by the People of Tewin'* are given to the Hall and we are extremely grateful to the Group for their continued generosity. Although the above figures may seem large, it's worth noting that the Hall needs to spend about $\pounds40,000$ on repairs and improvements in the foreseeable future. The rental income exceeds day to day expenditure by only a small amount, and in the current financial climate it would not be prudent to increase our rental charges. Our fund raising events only produce about $\pounds7,500$ per year, which means that any grants and donations are vitally important in continuing to improve and maintain the facilities. Please support the Memorial Hall whenever possible by hiring it, by becoming members of the Supporters Club, or by attending fund raising events, thereby ensuring that it continues as an important part of Tewin life.

<u>The Hall AGM will be held on Wednesday, 27th April at 8pm</u>. Please come along to the meeting to hear the outline details of our planned improvements – we should be delighted to see as many villagers as possible so everyone is fully aware of our on-going proposals.

Wednesday 8th June 2011 - Visit to Margaret Easter's garden, Harpenden You may remember Margaret Easter's talk entitled "The garden in Autumn and Winter", which she presented to us last November. Many of the *THACS* members who attended that talk expressed interest in visiting her garden and that has now been arranged for the afternoon of Wednesday 8th June.



This is a plantsman's garden planted for year round interest and for wildlife. Margaret Easter has been gardening organically for about 25 years and has not used peat since 2002. The borders are closely planted with as many plants as possible crammed in and underplanted with bulbs. The garden contains national collections of Thymus, Hyssopus and Satureja and this visit has been timed to enable us to see the Thymus collection at its best. Margaret Easter will give us a guided tour which will start at 2.30pm and last about two hours. The garden is in Harpenden and, since that is so close to Tewin, we will not be providing a coach. LOCAL COUNCIL ELECTIONS - 5th May 2011

The next election for the whole of East Herts Council (50 members) is scheduled for the above date. The election of District Councillors will be combined with those for the District's Town and Parish councils. These local council elections will in turn be combined with the referendum on the voting system for the UK Parliament. A poll on 5th May 2011 will only take place if there are more candidates than vacancies in each ward.

VACANCY FOR PARISH COUNCILLOR

A vacancy has arisen in the north ward of the parish of Tewin. If you wish to stand for election please contact the Parish Clerk or Chairman of the Parish Council (contact details below) for further information and a nomination paper. *Please note that the deadline for nomination papers to be received is noon on* 4^{th} April 2011.

The job of the Parish Councillor is voluntary and non -political. The Parish Council meets on the evening of the first non-bank holiday Monday of each month except January and August, but Councillors can expect to volunteer more of their time between meetings. The use of email plays a significant part in the day-to-day operation of the Parish Council.

The Parish Council's work includes the following:

Setting a budget each year, from which we set the precept to obtain funds via the Council Tax. All expenditure and income is monitored against the budget.

Upkeep of both village greens, various pieces of common land, and 100 Year Wood. It also owns the Pavilion and playground on Upper Green, phone box opposite the Rose & Crown, bus shelters, flagpole on Lower Green, and most of the benches in the Parish.

Examination of all planning applications in the Parish and commenting to EHC as necessary.

Projects, ie provision of a playground on Upper Green in 2007 and refurbishing of the Pavilion on Upper Green in 2010.

Close liaison with Hertfordshire Highways ensuring any problems with the roads are addressed.

Shared responsibility with Herts CC for the maintenance of footpaths and bridleways.

Input as necessary to various consultation documents issued by other authorities.
