



BIN COLLECTION CHANGES from 4 August 2025

There will be a change to the frequency of bin collections: mixed recycling, cardboard and paper, and non-recyclable waste will be collected on a three-weekly cycle.

Your bin collection days may change, and East Herts Council will send out more information nearer the time.

The changes to your bins will be:

- A new, weekly, food waste collection. You will have a brown outside food waste caddy and a kitchen food waste caddy.
- You will have a new purple-lidded bin for non-recyclable waste.
- Your black-lidded general waste bin will become your mixed recycling bin.
- Your blue-lidded bin will become your cardboard and paper bin. The new bins will be delivered from May; the food waste caddies will be inside the purple-lidded bin. Please do not use the bins until we have communicated details on when to switch as they won't be collected.
- You will be able to put plastic bags and plastic wrappings loose into your black-lidded, mixed recycling bin.

The service changes will:

- Make it easier for residents to recycle
- Help East Herts Council achieve government targets to recycle 60% of our household waste
- Help East Herts Council meet new government requirements to collect and recycle food waste and cardboard and paper separately
- Deliver a more efficient and sustainable service

Churchyard Workparty Report


Six people got to work on a sunny Saturday in St Peter's churchyard.

Notes from an Apiary

I am sitting here, overlooking a foreign city in a very different world to Tewin, wondering how our bees cope with harsh winters? Wondering how they are doing just now? How was the weather this week in Tewin? Will they be out foraging the early spring flowers? Snowdrops in sheltered sunny spots in the garden have been in flower for some time and the Witch-hazel seems to have come and gone. Both species are a joy to see and provide early pollen. Pollen is an important source of protein for honeybees, essential for feeding and rearing broods at this time of year.

Spring is on its way. It is moving South West to North East at an average rate of 1.8 mph. So Tewin is some two days ahead of Norwich.

This is faster than 125 years ago when the rate of spring arrival was estimated at 1.2mph. Some species have faster or slower spring arrival rates than others. Overall, we can say Spring is arriving faster these days. Bees are aware of the changing season, with longer days, responding accordingly. Bees have an internal clock, just like us. They have a circadian rhythm. Interestingly, just like humans, they also get jet lag. Bees flown from New York to San Francisco will continue to forage on New York time until they re-set their internal clocks.

We need to think about our plans for March. Looking for a fine warm day to have a first look at the colonies. That first inspection is always tinged with a little anxiety. Do we have a strong colony - then the joy of seeing the bees happy and thriving, or we hope not, but the sadness of a weak or perished colony. In preparation we will remove the protective nets over the hives and the mouse guards. We will start to think about changing the brood boxes, the part of the hive the bees build their nests in. We swap out the "old" box for one that has been fully cleaned down. This is a way of keeping infestation and disease at bay. Start the season with a spring clean!

Fun fact, did you know honey bees can count to four!

As we move into Spring there will be plenty for the beekeeper to do as the bees get busy. I hope you have enjoyed reading this and if you like honey then Tewin Stores still has supplies of local Tewin Honey from last summer. Buy some and enjoy the taste of a summer day.

As I said in last month's magazine, February was a busy month for us with the Seniors' lunch - some of you may well have seen your picture in the Welwyn Hatfield Times – and our AGM. I am pleased to report that, following our AGM, our Friends of Tewin Committee remains almost the same. Sadly, we lost our Hon President but, happily, gained another. Anne Hall, who has been a stalwart of the Committee, our Chair for many years, and Hon President since 2023 had previously advised us of her intention to stand down at the meeting. Her advice and knowledge will be missed but I know that Anne will still be there at our side to help us through our forthcoming events. We are, though, delighted to say that Roe Hill has accepted our offer to stand as our new Hon President and she was appointed to that position at the meeting. Again, as many of you will know, Roe was a member of the Committee for many years, only standing down in 2023, so it's lovely to welcome her back.



**Cambridge Chamber Ensemble to perform exquisite
Bach and Mozart in
St Mary's Welwyn
on Saturday 12 April**

The **Cambridge Chamber Ensemble** return to Welwyn on Saturday 12 April for a '*Second Saturday Recital*', with Alice Dilley on clarinet, Anastasia Matkovskaia on piano and Stephen Foster playing viola. The programme opens with Bach's Cello Suite No 3, performed on viola. The six Suites for solo cello by Bach have, since they were composed three hundred years ago, remained at the summit of the cello repertoire as sublime works. Some will recall the performances of these works by Yo Yo Ma at the Proms – one man and his cello mesmerising an audience of 5,000 over two consecutive evenings.

After the Bach there will be two lesser known pieces: Glinka's Viola Sonata in a single movement, and Widor's 'Introduction & Rondo' for clarinet and piano.

The concert ends with Mozart's '*Kegelstatt Trio*' for clarinet, viola and piano. 'Kegelstatt' is German for skittle alley and the story goes that Mozart composed this 20-minute work in his head while playing skittles. He was the first to use the mellifluous combination of clarinet/viola/piano and this has, for 240 years, remained the finest work written for this combination.

Stephen Foster, as violinist and viola player, is well known to Welwyn audiences as the organiser of the '*Second Saturday Recitals*' which he initiated three years ago.

Alice Dilley graduated with a First from the Royal College of Music in 2024, having studied with the esteemed clarinettist Richard Hosford. Since then she has been teaching, and playing in the orchestras of the English National Opera and English National Ballet.

Anastasia Matkovskaia has been a member of the Cambridge Chamber Ensemble since she graduated from the Royal Academy of Music three years ago. She is of Ukrainian-Russian heritage (three grandparents from Odessa) and, before settling in London, studied at the Junior Department of the Moscow Conservatoire.

The concert starts at 12 noon and lasts for one hour. All are welcome and the concert is free to attend, no tickets required. There will be a retiring collection afterwards to cover artists' fees and support the church's work to introduce youngsters to singing and music generally.

Team Vicar's Letter

One of Tilly the Rectory dog's favourite and most irritating games is sneaking into the hen coop, when I am cleaning it out, and removing an egg. At first she would carefully carry these eggs in her soft muzzle and deposit them in hard-to-be-found parts of the garden. More recently she has learned that if the egg is dropped, or perhaps if she clamps her jaws a little harder, then out pours the delicious golden goo that is just waiting to be lapped up.

Eggs will be in abundance this month, largely of the chocolate variety, also deposited in gardens for the excitement of a hunt. The tradition of decorated eggs predates Easter and in many cultures represents the coming of Spring. An egg, as a symbol of new life, then became an obvious symbol for Christians to adopt for the celebration of Easter.

But Tilly is correct. The egg is to be broken. Whether it is a new chick cracking the shell so that life can begin, or the smashing open of a chocolate egg on Easter day so the sweetness of celebration can be tasted and consumed, the symbolism is of a breaking.

During Lent we may have considered certain habits or behaviours that would best be broken. Some of us may have succeeded in this discipline, others of us will just have been reminded that there are things in our lives that we still need to crack. Sometimes things do need to be broken in order that new ways of living may begin.

But the good news of Easter is that, despite our efforts, it is the risen Christ who has done the ultimate breaking; bursting open the tomb, revealing a love of God that is uncontainable, unstoppable and everlasting.

So parents, I'm on the side of your children. Don't keep those eggs sensibly wrapped and rationed in the hope of saving teeth and healthy diets. Smash them open. Eat the lot. Celebrate the feast that has broken death. Taste just how good it is!

St Peter's News

A church at the heart of the village, with space for all

At last some beautiful spring weather! The winter has been grim with overcast skies and it's been so cold. It really is joyful when the sun shines and the sky is blue. Once again thank you to the working party who have tidied the churchyard this month, including cleaning up the railings around Lady Anne Grimston's grave. It was Jumble Sale day in the village but they still managed a couple of hours in the churchyard which is great.

I am pleased to report that contractors repaired the downpipe on the clock tower and the leaks in the spirelet on the roof during February, and the PCC accepted an estimate from another contractor to tackle the damp in the north wall. Hopefully this will be done soon. We have permission from the Archdeacon of St Albans for this work to be carried out, and both the Parish council and the Friends of Tewin have kindly agreed to support this financially. We also have Dorothy Swann to thank for enabling us to obtain the offer of a grant to help pay for these essential repairs from the National Churches Trust.

In February we celebrated the life of Christine Sharpe who, with her sunny smile and quiet ways, was a regular member of the congregation at St Peter's for many years. We also welcomed children from Tewin Cowper School for a service on Valentine's Day, postponed from earlier in the term. On Sunday 23rd February, Anthony Williams came with his whole family from the charity *Christians Against Poverty* to address the congregation about the valuable work that this organisation does across the UK to help people coping with all kinds of issues related to financial hardship.

The Bellringers have been hard at work training new ringers during the past month and were particularly in evidence at the funeral of Audrey Walters on 4 March. Audrey and her husband Peter were both keen bellringers. Audrey did so much in the church and the village, having lived here since 1959. The church was packed for the celebration of her life, the flowers, arranged by our own flower arrangers, were truly magnificent, the congregation sang lustily, especially *Jerusalem* as she was a dedicated WI member and the bells rang out.

Sadly the same week, the funeral of Ian Newton was also held at St Peter's. Ian also lived into his 90s and a full church spoke volumes of the affection he was held in by his family and friends.

Lent began the previous day with the service for the imposition of the ashes led by Susannah. We have followed the Lent course across the Welwyn team at various locations each week, including here in Tewin. We also had the benefit of a booklet from the Church of England called *Living Hope* for further study during this 40 day period of reflection. The final service in the month was for Mothering Sunday, more of this next time.

Now we look forward to Easter in the church with the start of **Passiontide on Sunday 6th April. Palm Sunday service follows on 13th April. 
It has been a long hard winter; many of us have had viral infections which seem to have gone on forever. We have lost others in the village than those I have mentioned above.

Devolution And Local Government Reorganisation In Hertfordshire

In December 2024, the government published the English Devolution White Paper which sets out proposals for major changes to the way local government is structured and run.

The ambition is for:

- all areas of the country to be covered by an elected Mayor – [devolution](#)
- all 2-tier areas, like Hertfordshire, to be reorganised into single tier unitary authorities – [local government reorganisation](#).

Our priority is to ensure that any changes benefit Hertfordshire’s residents and businesses, and maintain our excellent local government services.

Local government reorganisation in Hertfordshire

Hertfordshire currently has a 2-tier system of local government with:

[Hertfordshire County Council](#) providing countywide services such as social care, highways, and education.

[10 district and borough councils](#) delivering local services such as planning, leisure, housing, and waste collection.

Government has asked all 2-tier areas to submit interim proposals for how the reorganisation could work by 21 March 2025 – and full proposals by 28 November 2025. [Letter to Hertfordshire \(GOV.UK\)](#)

Hertfordshire also has 124 parish and town councils. The government is not currently proposing any changes to these.

Next steps

All 11 councils in Hertfordshire, with the Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner, are working together to develop our response. This is at an early stage and it will be essential to get the views of residents, businesses, local government partners, colleagues, and other stakeholders across the public and private sectors.

Whilst proposals are developed, there won't be any immediate changes to services provided by Hertfordshire County Council or the district and borough councils.

Impact on County Council elections

[Hertfordshire County Council elections](#) are going ahead on 1 May 2025.

Unlike some areas, Hertfordshire County Council did not ask government to delay this year’s elections, nor apply for a fast-track devolution priority programme. We decided this would:

- allow as much time as possible to gather information to develop proposals.
- ensure that the local democratic cycle was not interrupted.

News from Danesbury and the Queen Victoria Memorial Hospitals

By the time you read this article spring will be with us and after a long and dreary winter we should have fresh leaves and spring flowers and with luck some sunshine.

The Friends of Danesbury charity has been particularly active since I last wrote. The beautiful electric piano has been installed and is proving very popular as it is fully automated and does not need a pianist to play it although it also works in the traditional way.

We have also been able to authorise the purchase of an expensive and very worthwhile piece of equipment for the physiotherapy department which would not have been available from the NHS. This is an Xcite 2 electrical stimulation device which cost nearly £32,000, all paid for by the Friends. This device provides electrical stimulation to help patients practice the repeated movements which are key to recovery for many spinal cord injury patients as well as stroke patients and those with other neurological diagnoses. It will stimulate many different movements and can for example encourage patients to stand from sitting, reach and grasp and feed themselves. The device is simple to use and can do much more than the existing electrical equipment available to the physiotherapists.

I am sure you will agree that we are very fortunate to be able to fund support on this scale and this is of course entirely due to the generosity of all those who support us. Thank you to our shop manager and staff and our volunteers and of course to all those who generously donate their pre-loved clothes and other items and those who buy them.

Finally could I put in an urgent plea for more volunteers. As I have said before our High Street shop is a really friendly place to be and we would be most grateful for some more help.
