of the Councillors.

#### Notes from an Apiary

The bees are now into a critical time for their development as a species. As the sun shines, days warm up and the nectar flow starts in earnest. The workers are collecting an abundance of fuel for the colony and making their own plans for the future of the colony. These are rarely aligned with those of the beekeeper, so we need to adjust and take "counter measures".

Our inspections have a focus on the colonies making plans to "swarm", the method by which colonies increase in number and secure the future of the species. Swarming is initiated when there is too little of "Queen Substance", a pheromone produced by the Queen to keep the colony under her control. This can result from the Queen losing fertility or simply too many bees in the hive to get a share of the substance. The worker bees will decide what to do. In any event it is the starting point for swarming.



We are now looking for Queen Cells, an enlarged cell. Pictured left.

The workers will select eggs and lava to feed royal jelly, a highly nutritious fluid. The cells are elongated

sealed and the lava left to develop into queens. Once sealed the old queen will abscond, with most of the flying bees in the colony, a swarm.

We found two of the colonies making plans for swarming. Solution, make an artificial swarm by separating the queen from the brood. One colony becomes two and you keep your bees. In theory, and it seems to have worked. I am hearing a lot of comments about swarms around Tewin and indeed further afield. They can be alarming to folks, but they are not in an aggressive state, just a load of bees looking for a new home. Best advice is not to panic, give them space and if they have "settled" you can contact the BBKA via their web site or Hertfordshire Beekeepers Central and South Association on their web site or email swarms@hbcsa.uk or call 07446 171646. Keeping bees is a challenge at this time of year but rewarding when you think you have anticipated their behaviour and worked with them to help them expand. It looks like we have a good nectar flow and our bees are turning that into honey right now. Time to think about the spring harvest. Hard work but a fun time to look forward to soon.

Fun fact. Bees hum, only in the Key of C. Why do bees hum? – Because they don't remember the words. Phil

#### Esteemed International Concert Pianist to Play in St Mary's on 14 June at 12 noon

There is a real treat in store for the audience in St Mary's Welwyn on Saturday 14 June when the renowned Japanese concert pianist, Noriko Ogawa, comes to town.

Noriko (born 1962 in Kawasaki) first came to prominence as a top prizewinner in the 1987 Leeds International Piano Competition. She had been studying at the Tokyo College of Music (1977-80) and the renowned Juilliard School of Music in New York (1981-5). She has since achieved considerable renown in Europe, America and her native Japan where she is a national celebrity.

Ogawa performs regularly for the BBC as recitalist and soloist, gives chamber recitals and appears with all the major UK, European, Japanese and US orchestras. Amongst the leading conductors she has worked with are Charles Dutoit, Libor Pesek, Leonard Slatkin, Vernon Handley, Gennady Rozhdestvensky and Günther Herbig. As a recitalist and chamber musician her concerts have taken her all over the world and included a tour of Japan with the Berlin Philharmonic Wind Ensemble and the leader of the Vienna Philharmonic, violinist Rainer Honeck.

Noriko's "ravishingly poetic playing" (Daily Telegraph) sets her apart from her contemporaries; and acclaim for her complete Debussy series with BIS Records ("If you like your Debussy to sound like the musical equivalent of a chilled white wine, Noriko Ogawa is the pianist for you" Roger Vignoles, BBC Radio 3, CD Review), confirms her as a leading Debussy specialist. In addition to being a professor of piano at the Guildhall School of Music & Drama in London, Noriko is a sought-after television presenter and has appeared on the BBC as a commentator on Proms concerts, and in programmes for NHK and Nippon Television in Japan, where she is a national celebrity. As an adjudicator, she regularly judges for the BBC Young Musician Competition, Munich International Piano Competition, and the Scottish International Piano Competition.

Noriko Ogawa will play Brahms and Chopin in Welwyn on 14 June. The concert starts at 12 noon and lasts for one hour. All are welcome and the concert is free to attend, no tickets required. Don't miss it!

#### Team Vicar's Letter

When my sister was about five years old she met the to-be Archbishop of Canterbury, Robert Runcie. At this point he was Bishop of St Albans and had spent the afternoon with my grandfather who was a vicar in Barnet. My sister had been at the vicarage that day and played games with him in the garden and later sat at the table watching two men in ordinary black suits being silly and giggling with each other. A little later on she was taken to church and suddenly she was met with his transformation as he glided into the chancel in full vestments, with his crozier, mitre and golden cope, ready to conduct the confirmation service. 'My!' exclaimed my sister loudly to the delight of the congregation 'don't you look beautiful in that dress!'.

While the Catholic conclave took only 2 days to elect a new pope – the Church of England is a much slower machine. Last month we said farewell to Bishop Alan, the Bishop of St Albans as he retired from serving our diocese and the House of Lords after 16 years of ministry. The process for appointing his successor began as soon as he announced his retirement –but still the Crown Nominations Committee are not expected to interview candidates until January 2026, and the new Bishop is not expected to be in place until the late summer of that year. Thankfully we have two suffragan bishops who have supported Bishop Alan as colleagues, and who will hold the fort while we await a new Bishop of St Albans to be installed.

If you are a praying kind of person do remember our bishops in your prayers. It's not just croziers, mitres and copes they carry, but there's a lot of expectation and responsibility that sits on their shoulders – and underneath it all, they are, as my sister will tell you, only human after all.

#### **St Peter's News**

#### A church at the heart of the village, with space for all

The month of May began with our Annual Parochial Church Meeting which took place after the first service. This is an opportunity for the congregation to review the year's work in the parish and to elect its representatives on the Parochial Church Council (PCC). It is also a time to look forward to the year ahead and identify special events which are coming up. As ever, it has been a busy year for us all. In addition to our regular Sunday services and other special times in the Christian calendar, the church has been there for five families bringing their children for baptism and for six happy couples who were married at St Peter's. It has also witnessed the celebration of a number of special people who have died this year. We must also mention especially the continued success of our monthly Messy Church for families and the Poetry Pilgrimage which promises to be an even bigger event in 2025. Our contact with the wider village included organising Open Gardens and our Christmas Bazaar.

We continue to keep the state of the church building and furniture in the churchyard under review. Repairs have been carried out to the spirelet, the downpipe on the clock tower and to seats in the churchyard. We have permission to repair the damp in the north wall and this should be done during June. We have applied for permission to place a new storage shed on the existing base in the church yard. The project to add a new meeting room to the church is slowly creeping forward. More news on this next month. Thank you to those who helped with the bi-monthly working party in the churchyard, and to Becky Timson who has been watering the pot plants in the Memorial Garden during the hot weather.

Later in May we will be carrying out the Annual Spring Clean of the church in time for some summer weddings. At the time of writing this has yet to take place but I hope there will have been a good turnout. And thank you to all who have given some time to make this happen, in particular, Nicky Hadley, who is organising it this year. This is also the first time we have had no Morning Service on the  $3^{rd}$ Sunday in the month. We have just found ourselves so stretched across Morning Prayer, Messy Church and an evening service that we decided to hold only Evensong on the  $3^{rd}$  Sunday during the summer period from May – October. We will see how this goes and will review it again in a year's time.

The bellringers have been busy this month with two special peals, including one on V E Day, in addition to their usual Wednesday practice and Sunday services.

At the end of April, we thanked Pauline Spring for all she has done for the church as one of our Servers at Tewin. She has done this for over six decades since she was at university, and we much appreciate all her years of dedication.

The clocktower can be floodlit by request to commemorate a loved one at any time. We simply ask for a donation to church funds. Please let me or Graham Spring, our Stewardship Officer, know in good time when you would like this to be done and how you would like it recorded in the magazine.

We celebrated the lives of two well-known members of the village at the very end of April, Diana Saban and Ann Lee, both of whom were great characters who will be sadly missed.

It is great to be coming out of a long hard winter at last. If you need support, have lost loved ones recently, or are in poor health or spirits, please remember the Welwyn team of clergy are always there for you.

The tennis season is really upon us now. The French Open is already in swing at the Roland Garros stadium in Paris, a foretaste

of what is to come at the Wimbledon Championships at the end of the month.

Did you know that Wimbledon is almost unique for a major sporting event of any type, in that it's guaranteed that you can get tickets at the gate on the actual day? Sure, you have to be prepared to queue, perhaps for a considerable amount of time, but the LTA have the queuing system down to a fine art so it's not daunting.

That's not to say you can't get last minute tickets at Roland Garros. As a tennis fan I watch it a fair bit on TV and I am aghast at the half empty stadiums I see for top matches on the world tour, even the grand slams. I fear it's a mix of indifference from the fans (often your expensive ticket gives access to only the afternoon or evening session) and corporate hospitality guests who spend more time in the bar than courtside!

But if you want some properly entertaining tennis, with seats extremely close to the action, simply come down to the courts on Upper Green on Friday evenings for the ABC League, which started in late May and runs through to our annual party on Friday August 1. There is usually a good turn out of supports and after the matches, around 9pm, we head over to the Plume of Feathers for refreshment. Please join us. The action starts at 7pm.
