<u>NEW HOUSEHOLD WASTE and RECYCLING</u> <u>**COLLECTION ARRANGEMENTS**</u>

New bins are in the process of being delivered. The new bin collection will start on 4th August.

Your **black** bin will become your mixed recycling bin incl loose plastic bags and wrapping – *Collection Every 3 Weeks*

Your **blue** lidded bin will be for cardboard and paper - *Collection Every 3 Weeks*

Your NEW **purple** lidded bin will be your non recyclable waste – *Collection Every 3 Weeks*

Your NEW 23 litre **brown** outside waste caddy for food and 5 litre inside/ kitchen waste caddy for food – *Weekly Collection*

Your existing **brown** bin for garden waste, if you have one, will stay the same – *Collection every 2 weeks*

1 week cycle - A NEW weekly food waste collection.

2 week cycle – A chargeable garden waste collection fortnightly...brown bin 3 week cycle – Your non-recyclable waste, mixed recycling and cardboard and paper bins will move to a new alternating three-week collection cycle.

Stickers will be provided for your bins along with an information leaflet and a food waste leaflet.

<u>CLEARANCE WORK ON LAND ADJACENT TO THE ROSE &</u> <u>CROWN</u>

The Parish Council has agreed to Kirkham Contracting grinding out 5 tree stumps and flail mowing the area in order to discourage the ivy and encourage grass.

Notes from an Apiary

We have been watching the weather and development of our colonies closely. Spring has come and gone with a very warm and dry March and April. The spring flowers have been exceptional, and nectar has been flowing well.

Time to collect the Spring harvest. We arrange the supers, the boxes containing the honeycomb, above a "clearing board". The idea is that bees can go down to the brood box, through "bee escapes" but not back up into the honeycomb. We use Porter bee escapes, contraptions that work a little like a lobster pot. The advantage is that when we take away the super box it has no, or very few bees in it, making handling much easier. I understand that commercial operations use leaf blowers to remove the bees from the box, but that sounds a little rough on the bees for me.

Our harvest was pleasing, and overall local beekeepers are reporting very good Spring harvests. This is quite a difference from last year when everyone reported low harvests in spring. Some are reporting huge harvests, particularly when the bee hives have been close to Oil Seed Rape, OSR. The bees go crazy for this and bring in huge amounts of nectar. Sounds great but rape nectar is very high in glucose content that creates crystalisation of the honey and a VERY hard product. So hard that it must be extracted quickly and so hard that the bees won't be able to use it later in the season.

Overall we are seeing less OSR in our fields. The UK has moved from the world's fifth largest exporter of OSR to a net importer. A major contributor to this decline is the ban on neonicotinoid seed treatments and subsequent financial risk to farmers. We now import OSR from countries still using this treatment, crazy old world!

Fun fact. Bees have five eyes, they communicate through a "waggle dance", and only female bees can sting. They are also crucial pollinators, and their buzz is the sound of their wings beating rapidly.

July: Buck Moon

Exciting Cello and Piano Duo to Perform in St Mary's on 12 July at 12 noon

Our final lunchtime recital in St Mary's before the summer break will feature **Joely Koos** on cello and **Firoze Madon** on piano in sonatas by Mendelssohn and Debussy.

Joely Koos – a Welwyn Garden City resident – is unquestionably from a family of cellists: her Hungarian father was principal cellist of the Bournemouth Symphony Orchestra, her husband, Tim, is principal cellist of the Royal Philharmonic Orchestra, and her daughter, Doraly, is studying cello at the Royal Academy of Music!

Joely herself is a versatile and compelling performer, with a varied professional career as soloist, chamber musician, orchestral player and teacher. In her younger days she was a top prizewinner in the EMI Jacqueline du Pré competition, and has been broadcast on the BBC as soloist with orchestras including the London Sinfonietta, BBC Concert Orchestra and City of London Sinfonia. She is principal cellist with the English Symphony Orchestra, professor of cello at Trinity Laban Conservatoire and teaches at Eton College.

Joely has invited the 'rising star' young pianist Firoze Madon to partner her in this recital. Firoze studied at the prestigious Purcell School for young musicians, during which time he was a finalist in the BBC Young Musician Competition 2022 with his performance broadcast on BBC Four and Radio 3. Firoze has already made concert appearances at notable venues including the Wigmore Hall, Cadogan Hall, the Southbank Centre, Saffron Hall and the Philharmonie de Paris. He currently studies at the Royal College of Music in London, under the tutelage of Professors Dmitri Alexeev and Vitaly Pisarenko.

The concert is FREE to attend, with a retiring collection for artists' fees and church funds.

I go to a lot of weddings. You won't be surprised. St Peter's News

A church at the heart of the village, with space for all

There was I looking at the grass outside the north side of the church covered with daisies, just thinking, 'I hope Stuart Kirkham comes to cut the grass soon', when lo!, a few days later, he had indeed done so. Many thanks to him for tidying up many of the grassed areas to make the churchvard look presentable in time for the vicar's daughter's wedding on the first weekend in June. It also looked a picture when a young man came and took photos for the Lotus car company by the war memorial. Fancy choosing St Peter's, but he said it was a lovely peaceful setting! Which it is of course. We normally have a dog bowl near the outside tap by the vestry door for passing dog owners to give their dogs a drink, but this has mysteriously disappeared. If you have removed the bowl, please bring it back. We have many dogs passing through the churchyard and in hot weather they welcome a little drink. This month I have had the Annual Archdeacon's inspection carried out by Father Darren Collins. The focus for these inspections changes every year. Last year I had to show that we were looking after the church silver, with up to date records of weights and sizes of items, photos of each and how we keep them safely locked away. This year the emphasis is on safeguarding in the church and care of the buildings and churchyard. I had to demonstrate that all those who should have had training in safeguarding matters had done so and that all relevant documents were on display in the church and on our website. Safeguarding has been an enormous issue in the Church of England this year, as you will know. There is a document about the issues written by our Team Ministry earlier in the year, still available to pick up at the back of the church.

Towards the end of 2024 we had the trees around the churchyard Inspected, looking for where we had dead or dying trees, or hanging branches that were dangerous. Chris Eales, our tree specialist, gave us an estimate for the work but then the winter weather prevented him from coming until this month. So this month you may have noticed piles of wood around the churchyard from his labours. The churchyard often costs us over £1,000 a year to keep safe for visitors and this bill came to £1,150, of which £1,000 came from the share out of funds from THACS. So thank you to all former members in the village who have contributed to that. We are also very grateful to Hilary and David Armstrong who, with Andrew Swift, have very kindly repaired the circular seat in the churchyard, placed there many years ago to celebrate the life of Hilary and David's daughter. This seat is often where people come to sit and drink their flasks of coffee or watch their children playing nearby. It is a peaceful spot. Please note that the next working party in the churchyard will be on Saturday 12 July from 9 until 11am. Please let Gerry or David know if you are able to help gerry.murphyjag@btinternet.com or rawlins31@btinternet.com. Are you a keen flower arranger or would you like to learn how to do this? If so, we would love to encourage you to arrange church flowers. No formal training is required and there will be lots of help available from more experienced arrangers. Contact Elaine Fowler if you can help please at elaineandkeith@sky.com. I would also like to make a plea to all for donations towards the costs for church flowers, especially for the festivals of Harvest, Christmas and Easter. The work on the damp in the north wall should be in progress when you get to read this. Every effort will be made to keep visitors to the church safe while this is in progress but please take care when walking nearby. We made certain that work did not start until after the school had been to celebrate Pentecost on the 12 June, and a large funeral, in memory of Paul Mc Laughlin, formerly a much-appreciated teacher at Tewin Cowper School took place on 19 June.

The Annual Summer Evensongs across the Welwyn Team begin on the last Sunday in July and continue every Sunday at a different church in the team until the end of August. At the time of writing I do not know the order in which these will take place so please see the website www.tewinvillage.co.uk.

Finally if you need support, have lost loved ones recently, or are in poor health or spirits, please remember the Welwyn team of clergy are always there for you.

ROAD SAFETY IN TEWIN

I think it was Bertie Wooster who alluded to bending over to pick daisies on a quiet and peaceful railway bank, only to receive the down express from Edinburgh in the small of the back! I for one am becoming increasingly concerned about the standard of driving in Tewin.

Having recently had the privilege of opening the church in the mornings, I have been astounded at the poor driving through Churchfield Road. Not only are people speeding (often doing 40mph), but they are totally oblivious to the pedestrians (including me!), dogs, cyclists, horses, pheasants and other road users they are likely to encounter. I would remind both white van drivers and those in 4x4's alike that the law insists one should drive according to the conditions; in Churchfield Road (as elsewhere in the village) with bends, width constrictions, high banks and other "line of sight" complications, this should be under 20mph. It's no use saying "but I was only doing 30mph, my Lord" when you've just run down PGW's favourite character and he's lying dead in a ditch!

Going down Churchfield Road to the river, there is a one way bridge. I was driving down to the bridge the other day and a woman steamed through doing about 40mph, again totally oblivious to my presence and to the fact that we were both under an obligation to give way and take it slowly. Newcomers to the village may not be aware that a director of ICI was killed in just that circumstance. It only takes a little mutual respect to avoid disaster.

You may be amused to learn that, as residents of Churchfield Road, we have a magnificent collection of car paraphernalia; number plates, mud guards, hub caps, front wings etc which have all been donated by certain individuals (who shall remain nameless) who take our bends far too fast and come to grief in the hedges, banks and kerbs which are cunningly designed to trap the hapless motorist. I could list at least ten incidents over the years, some of which could've been quite serious.

Upper Green/Orchard Road, Hertford Road, Lower Green, School Lane and others are all as vulnerable to poor driving as is Churchfield Road. I was driving through Codicote the other day and noticed they have a 20mph speed limit through the village. This limit applies now to many London boroughs. Would a 20mph limit throughout the village give the relevant signal to those that should never have been given a licence to drive in the first place? John Holding
