PUBLIC LITTER BINS

Please be sensible as to what you put in the public litter bins otherwise they overflow and cause a health hazard:

Do not stuff large bags of rubbish in them as it leaves no room for genuine litter including dog poo bags

Do not put waste food in the bins - foxes will dig it out and spread litter all over the ground

Do not put household rubbish in public litter bins.

If you are having a picnic, please take your rubbish home with you.

NB: If your rubbish is going to fill the bin, then you should be taking it away with you.

HOME SECURITY

Tips to help prevent burglary:

- a. Check downstairs windows and doors are securely locked before you leave or go to bed.
- b. Secure UPVC doors by lifting the handle and locking it to engage the security features.
- c. Don't leave keys, phones or other valuables on window sills or in any other visible place.
- d. Securely lock rear gates, sheds and garages.

- e. Keep tools and ladders locked away, as they could be used to break into your home.
- f. Use laminate glass where possible for any rear doors or windows. If this is not practicable, consider the use of security film over existing windows.
- g. Use a "Fake TV" or timer switches on lamps to give the impression someone is at home.
- h. Consider using a doorbell camera, interior camera, or a monitored burglar alarm.

Notes from an Apiary

August sees the end of significant nectar flow and we need to decide when to take the summer honey harvest. Do we crop now and leave any late forage from ivy for the bees or delay and look for a bigger harvest? We are in favour of cropping mid-August, with any late honey going directly to the bees for winter.

Just as we are debating plans, in comes a message to my mailbox - "The National Bee Unit has issued a starvation alert. Colonies are running short of food following the early end of this year's nectar flow". The long, hot and particularly dry weeks have caused flowering plants to reduce nectar flow. The message goes on to suggest inspection of colonies and feeding if needed. We regularly inspect and a couple of days ago there were no signs of stress or shortage of supplies. So on with the plan, crop before end of August then start preparations for over-wintering.

Our colonies look strong so no need to do any further manipulation to join colonies. So far this year we have seen very little sign of the Varroa mite. We will continue with our Integrated Pest Management IPM programme. At this time of year, we will apply a proprietary treatment based on thymol, a natural active ingredient. This takes about 4 weeks, knocking down the mites but has no effect on the bees. Following this treatment, we will start to feed sugar syrup to the colonies to help them get through winter. We do not take any honey after we start this regimen as the honey could be tainted with the thymol treatment or contaminated by the sugar feed.

We have seen a massive number of wasps this year. Troublesome to bees but not overly concerning as colonies can defend themselves against wasps. We did have one worrying moment when we were doing our last inspection, one huge insect, a Hornet, taking a bee as it returned to the hive. Quick work swatted the insect that turned out to be a European Hornet. This was a great relief as we would not have wanted to see an Asian Hornet in our apiary, or indeed anywhere in several hundred miles of Tewin. No need to alert the UK National Bee Unit and BBKA.

Bees, they're the bee's knees! You know the phrase 'the bee's knees' but did you know that bees don't have knees as we know them? Bees have an exoskeleton, a hard covering that supports and protects their bodies. They don't have kneecaps, but they do have leg joints between the femur and tibia.



Team Vicar's Letter

This year the BBC marked 40 years since the Live Aid concerts. In 1985 they were watched globally by an estimated 2 billion people from over 100 countries – and raised the profile of the suffering of those caught up in Ethiopia's famine at that time. Forty years on our news screens are still showing pictures of starving children. The combination of a war which has ended the means to farm, a ban on Palestinians fishing in the sea, and the blockade of food aid has meant Gazan families are facing days at a time without any food at all. Many people in Haiti, Syria, Sudan, the DRC and Afghanistan also suffer from food shortages – largely because of ongoing conflicts combined with a changing climate. It is an evil that in a world where there is such abundance, so many people still die of hunger.

Harvest festival can sometimes feel like an old fashioned and maybe childish affair. A quaint service where the church is filled with flowers and marrows and children sing of farmers and cauliflowers fluffy. Yet actually there is a theology behind Harvest which, if we engage with it seriously, should impact our contemporary understanding of ecology, food production and global politics.

Firstly, we thank God for our farmers. In doing so we recognise there is a partnership between God and human beings. Genesis tells us that God gave people a special place in creation to tend and care for the land and animals. If we do this well, then we and all creation thrive. If we fail to take our responsibility of the care of the planet seriously, then we and all creation suffer. Secondly, we thank God for his generosity and for all the good things we enjoy. It may not be such a tradition now in family households to say grace before a meal, but some kind of daily practice of thankfulness for the food that sustains us might still be good for our souls as well as the world. Thirdly, in response to God's generosity we are reminded to share what we have with others. Food from the congregation and children at our school will be collected for our local foodbanks. This year we are also supporting the Bishop of St Albans' Harvest Appeal Rewrite their Future which aims to improve access to education to 2,000 children in Uganda and Zambia. Harvest is both a joyful and serious business, not just for farmers, but for us all. It would be wonderful to welcome you at our Harvest Festival service this year, Sunday 28th September 9:30am. The church will be beautiful, we will sing all the traditional harvest hymns – and enjoy together a bring and share harvest lunch, with music and a quiz. But in coming together, we will also in our small way, help change the world for the better.

The blackberries are ripening in the hedgerows and the apples are falling over the fence from next door's heavily laden Bramley apple tree. Ivor's team have been busy harvesting across the fields around the village. So I guess it's harvest time. Harvest seems to come earlier and earlier each year, and our Harvest Festival is late this year, on Sunday 28th September. Nevertheless – all are welcome. Please bring tinned or dry goods for the Food Shed at Stevenage or make a donation to the Bishop's Harvest Appeal this year helping to build schools and improve education in Uganda and Zambia through Mission Direct. Edward Cardale will be leading our service that day, when we will also be celebrating the 50th anniversary of his priesting.

The Summer Evensongs have continued throughout August at each of the Welwyn Team churches in turn, on the theme of "Animals in the Bible". At the time of writing we have had John Burnapp preaching about whales in lovely Ayot St Peter's, and a lively sermon from Christie Gilfeather at St Giles' Codicote about snakes. Incidentally, Christie is being inducted as Priest-in-charge at St Giles, where she has been the curate for the past year, on Tuesday 23rd September at 7.30pm, (and her husband Ryan's induction is on 8th October 7.30pm at Hatfield Hyde). Please go along to support Christie as she continues her Christian fellowship in this way.

The other Evensongs are about oxen (St Mary's Welwyn), a leviathan (Woolmer Green), eagles at Datchworth and donkeys here in Tewin on Sunday 31 August. All services are traditionally followed by drinks and nibbles and an opportunity to meet old friends from other parishes.

In September we shall continue to have Morning Prayer at 9.30am on the 3rd Sunday in the month, followed by Messy Church in the afternoon at 3pm. Evening Services will continue to be held for All Souls and Christmas services.

St Peter's held FOUR Baptisms in six weeks from the end of June until the beginning of August. It is always good to welcome a child into the church accompanied by their families and friends. The church has been packed for such events. It was also packed for the Memorial Service for Geoff Searle (Uncle Geoff) on 14 July, a much loved local character who had lived in the village for nigh on fifty years. And for the equally huge funeral on 7th August of Hilary Armstrong, who touched so many lives in and around Tewin. May they rest in peace.

At the end of July Susannah and the staff said goodbye to those students from Tewin Cowper School who have left this term. Good luck to them in their new schools in September!

Thank you to the churchyard working party who are keeping things tidy for us all. They meet again on Saturday 13th September. If you can help with general maintenance in the churchyard, please let Gerry or David know, (gerry.murphyjag@btinternet.com or drawlins31@gmail.com). The wall and new drainage system in front of the church are now completely finished. Thank you to Friends of Tewin who have helped pay for the costs of this work, together with a donation from the Parish Council. These two donations have enabled us to secure a grant from the National Churches Trust towards the costs also. The total cost was £8,700.00 plus VAT. We hope to reclaim the VAT under the Listed Places At Worship Scheme, as this is a Grade 1 listed church.

Susannah led a very successful Poetry Pilgrimage from Datchworth church to Tewin on 2 August when the weather remained charming! She will be continuing her ministry in the diocese by leading a Diocesan Retreat from $8-11^{th}$ September.

Finally if you need support, have lost loved ones recently, or are in poor health or spirits, please remember the Welwyn team of clergy are always there for you.



A New Meeting Room for St Peter's Tewin

Many of you will remember that we have been trying to obtain permission to build a new meeting room at our lovely village church, to include accessible toilets and a kitchenette, plus some extra storage. Last summer, June 2024, we produced the documents requested by the diocese to support this – these are on display at the back of the church. They include Statements of the Significance and Needs of the church, together with an appraisal of the options for where a new building might be situated.

We had a huge round the table discussion with all the stakeholders - the DAC, local councillors, local authority planner and conservation officer in September 2024. We also enlisted further advice from the Enhanced Advisory Service of Historic England. Consequently, it has taken a long time for all stakeholders and the Diocesan Advisory Committee (DAC) to reach consensus on the size and location of the building. The DAC were very complimentary about our documentation. The new building is now likely to be beside the south east corner of the chancel, beyond where the south porch stands at present, on the site where a vestry stood until 1903. It might be accessed via a door in the chancel which was blocked up when the vestry was moved to the front (north) of the church at that time, but could also easily be reached from the south porch during services. Nothing is yet agreed.

Meanwhile our architect, Yasmin Shariff, who has given us enormous help up to now, is retiring and probably moving out of the area. We are looking to engage a new architect to take the project forward by producing some outline designs for the building. Once we have an agreed design and an idea of costs, we will start fund raising in earnest.

We are also applying for planning permission and a faculty from the church to replace the shed which once stood on the base in a corner of the eastern part of the churchyard, which we will use for extra storage.

It should be a joy to be adding a necessary building and facilities to our Grade 1 listed village church but it is hard going and we need immense patience!! We hope the village will continue to give us support for this important project which should ensure we continue to have a place of worship with suitable facilities for future generations in Tewin.

News from Danesbury and the Queen Victoria Memorial Hospitals

As I sit writing at the beginning of August it is a grey, gloomy day – nothing like our earlier heatwave – and as you read this it will already be September. It may be glorious but it will be the beginning of Autumn, holidays will be coming to an end and children will be going back to school.

The Charity Shop in Welwyn High Street run by Friends of the Danesbury and Queen Victoria hospitals has been busy over the summer – sales have been excellent so thank you to all of you who have both donated items for us to sell and to those of you who have come and bought items from us. We are most grateful and as always have been using those funds for the benefit of the patients of the two hospitals.

A holistic therapist, who had been recommended as a person to support the wellbeing of patients, recently completed a 12 week trial and, as the feedback from both patients and staff had been very positive, the Friends have agreed to fund treatment for a further 12 weeks. The provision of this therapy will again be assessed and may be renewed at the end of this new period.

The flower beds at the two hospitals have been glorious and the Friends have now provided a new shed so that our hospital grounds volunteer can store his tools. I am very pleased to be able to report that he has completely refurbished the benches in the grounds which are much appreciated by those patients who go outside as well as by the staff.

This month the Friends have also agreed to a request by the neurological outpatients and community stroke nurse for a set of Lejrelet support cushions. This set includes a long, cylindrical support cushion, designed for full body positioning to help patients with Multiple Sclerosis. Unlike other body pillows, it is filled with foam granulate, which means that it is pressure-relieving while also providing tactile stimuli and stability.

Just a reminder if you need any school uniform for St Mary's Primary School, we often have new and almost new items of uniform in the Danesbury shop.
