PUBLIC LITTER BINS

Please be sensible as to what you put in the public litter bins otherwise they overflow and cause a health hazard:

- · Do not stuff large bags of rubbish in them as it leaves no room for genuine litter including dog poo bags
- Do not put waste food in the bins foxes will dig it out and spread litter all over the ground
- · Do not put household rubbish in public litter bins.
- · If you are having a picnic, please take your rubbish home with you.

NB: If your rubbish is going to fill the bin, then you should be taking it away with you.

HEDGES

Now that the birds have finished nesting, Tewin Parish Council would be grateful if all residents who have hedges on their land bordering a footpath or pavement would cut them back if they are overhanging or partially blocking the path.

COMMON RAGWORT

This is a common weed found throughout the British Isles however it is very toxic to horses and other livestock and can have potentially fatal consequences if ingested either in its green or dried state.

Under the Weeds Act 1959 the Secretary of State may serve an enforcement notice on the occupier of land on which injurious weeds are growing, requiring

the occupier to take action to prevent the spread of injurious weeds. The Weeds Act specifies five injurious weeds: Common Ragwort, Spear Thistle, Creeping or Field Thistle, Broad Leaved Dock and Curled Dock.

By promoting good practice and good neighbourliness it is hoped that this weed can be controlled.

If you find you have it in your garden please put rubber gloves on and remove the plant and place it in the <u>blue-lidded bin</u> to prevent livestock eating it. Fragments of root will remain in the ground so new growth will have to be monitored and removed year after year.

Notes from an Apiary

We lost the summer at the end of August with the official start of autumn on 1st September. We were a little late taking the crop of honey from our bees, so winter preparations have continued through September. A little late but all seems well. We have treated the colonies with "Apiguard", a miticide designed to reduce the Varroa mite population, endemic in home bee colonies. Following this process we have fed the bees with a 2 to 1 solution of sugar. The bees will take this solution and convert to pseudo honey that will sustain them through the winter.

The colonies are now ready to be tucked up for winter. Mouse guards are placed over the entrance spaces. These perforated metal strips prevent mice and other small mammals getting into the hive, a nice warm place to hibernate but not the right place for them. The holes are large enough to allow the bees to pass through. Finally, we place nets over the hives to deter Woodpeckers from trying to bore through the hives and feast on the contents. A simple plastic garden net is great as the birds don't like getting their feet tangled in them, but it won't hurt the birds.

All the equipment and hive parts not in use over winter are now in storage and will need to be cleaned. Soonest best so they are ready for next season. This is my least favourite job, but it is essential to ensure good hygiene and keep the bees healthy through next season.

Fun fact. Bees sleep. Young bees have a poorly structured sleep pattern while older worker bees follow a day/night sleep cycle. During sleep bees have still antenna, a tucked in posture and fold in their legs. It is said very tired bees will fall over sideways. A bit like humans really. I have to admit, I have never seen a sleeping bee, probably because I am asleep when they are.

November 5th: Beaver or Frost Moon

Why full Moons happen

A full Moon is a big bright, beautiful Moon in the night sky, when the whole of the Earth-facing side of the Moon is illuminated.

This happens as a result of Earth orbiting the Sun and the Moon in turn orbiting Earth.

During a full Moon, the Moon is on the opposite side of the Earth from the Sun, allowing its entire Earth-facing side to be illuminated.

Think of it like this: we're standing on Earth, looking up at the Moon. The Sun is directly behind us, and shining directly on to the Moon, which is in front of us. That's why a full Moon happens.

Screen On The Green

On Monday 17th November we are showing *JoJo Rabbit* (2019), a black comedy lampooning the Nazi regime in the last few weeks of the Second World War. It stars Scarlett Johanssen, Ronan Griffin Davis, Sam Rockwell and Rebel Wilson and was directed by Taika Waititi.

There are several poignant scenes of the times but mostly it is a tale of ordinary German people trying to cope with the world around them. It is told through the eyes of Jojo, a ten year old boy eager to join the Hitler Youth, only to discover that his mother is sheltering a young Jewish girl in the loft of their house. The film derides the Nazi propaganda about Jews by taking it to ridiculous levels. Like many children, Jojo has an imaginary friend, who in this case, manifests himself as Hitler.

Jojo Rabbit won various accolades including Oscar and Golden Globe nominations and the score is an interesting mix of classical and popular musical themes.

On the 8th December in the run-up to Christmas it's the musical *Cabaret* (1972). Looking further ahead, the provisional programme for 2026 includes *Dirty Dancing, The Ballad of Wallis Island,* and *The Death of Stalin*.



Team Vicar's Letter

In the English translations, the Hebrew and Arabic words for peace are strikingly similar: shalom and salam. Both are used for greetings, a familiar way of saying hello, and in doing so wishing your neighbour one of the most basic desires of human lives – peace.

I am writing this letter on the day that hostages are being released from Gazan tunnels and captives from Israeli jails. The events we have witnessed over the last two years in that small but long-troubled region have been horrifying and heartbreaking in equal measure. It is a particular sadness that in a year where we have celebrated 80 years since peace in Europe, the ramifications of legislation that was put in place in Israel as a result of the events of atrocities of that war have done little to secure peace for the current people who live in that land.

Both shalom and salam in their meanings go deeper than a simple absence of conflict. Both also express something of a person's oneness and wellbeing within themselves, with those around them, with the whole of creation and with God. It is only through this deeper inner peace that humans will finally be able to enjoy a lasting peace with neighbours near and far.

November is traditionally a time where we give space to reflecting on that deeper sense of peace. The services we hold this month reflect on peace with our neighbours (Remembrance Sunday) and peace for the departed (All Souls). All Saints Datchworth are also holding this year a special healing service with prayers for God's peace within our own lives and the lives of those we love. You would be most welcome to attend.

Finally if you need support, have lost loved ones recently, or are in poor health or spirits, please remember the Welwyn team of clergy are always there for you.


