December 4th: Cold Moon

The December Full Moon, known as the Cold Moon, will occur on 4th December 2025. It is the third consecutive Supermoon and the most extreme Full Moon until 2042.

To get a good view of a Supermoon a clear sky is preferable and you can just use your eyes, though a telescope or binoculars will help.

If you want to take a picture make sure you turn off the flash on your phone, activate night mode and use ambient light.



Until August 2015 Tewin had a regular bus service which ran from Hertford to Welwyn Garden City, including to the local stations, five or six times Monday to Saturday. The new service runs to Welwyn Garden City, via Welwyn North, and back five times daily, Monday to Friday. It is understood that the 204 and 378 will continue to run.

Team Vicar's Letter

Sometimes it strikes me as odd that many of us spend so much time preparing to be as ready as possible for a 'perfect Christmas'. Why is it that out of all the seasons we celebrate somehow we think this one should have the perfect meal, the perfect presents, the perfect family with which to enjoy it – because the story at the heart of it all is far from that kind of idea of perfection.

When Jesus was born it seems few of those involved were perfect or prepared! We have the unmarried, heavily pregnant teenager, Mary, carrying a baby which is not Joseph's, travelling miles from home to be counted for the Roman census. There is no booking.com or Trivago, all the places to stay are full and, as we know, baby Jesus, the King of Kings, is born not in luxury but in dirt and straw. As Jews living under occupation this young family knows what it is to be an outcast in society, indeed will soon find themselves as refugees fleeing the wrath of Herod.

The first Christmas was raw - not perfect. It may be that circumstances this year mean that 'raw' is closer to how you feel, if so, God meets you there. It may be that circumstances mean this is a particularly special Christmas filled with the joy of angels, if so, God meets you there.

God was incarnate in Jesus (that is, God came to us in pinchable, touchable flesh and blood) to meet us: whatever our circumstances, however prepared or unprepared we are, however raw or joyous we feel.

The Christmas message is this; that despite the messiness of the world and of our own lives God loves us, he came to us, and comes to us still.

And that is a good reason to celebrate whether or not the turkey arrives in time.

Wishing you and your families all the love of the Christ child this Christmas, Susannah

St Peter's News

A church at the heart of the village, with space for all

There were over 80 people, including youngsters, present at the War Memorial on Remembrance Sunday to commemorate the 80th Anniversary of the end of the Second World War, which somehow seemed appropriate. It was a mild, sunny day, and many folk stayed for the service inside the church, which this year was conducted by Catherine Jupp. Gerry Ruddock played the trumpet beautifully (with apologies to him for getting his name wrong in the last magazine).

The churchyard working party had cleaned off some of the moss on the War Memorial and swept the area free of leaves.

Leaves have stayed on the trees for longer than in the past few years and suddenly there has been a huge leaf drop. This has resulted in the Memorial Garden and some graves being covered in leaves. This may appear unsightly to some and make things difficult for people coming to the graves of loved ones. Please bear with us. Members of the churchyard working party will be going down every week at least, from now until the middle of January to try to keep the area tidy. We are always looking for help here. Most of the working party are over 70, very active, still playing tennis, walking, and so on, but we could do with some help from younger people where possible please. Let Gerry or David know if you can help.

(gerry.murphyjag@btinternet.com or rawlins31@btinternet.com). For the rest of the year, a bi-monthly tidy up works well and we receive many compliments on the state of our churchyard and indeed the church itself.

I have been reading my parents' wartime correspondence. They wrote to each other from the beginning of 1941 until my father was demobbed in March 1946. I have recently read about the autumn of 1944. My father is in Belgium, billeted in a café/restaurant run by Maurice, his wife and mother-in-law. I think the writers of 'Allo 'Allo must have been there. They described life under the Nazis to my Dad. They listened to the BBC news every night at 9 o'clock with the Germans carousing in the rooms below. The thing is the Belgians and the French have been liberated. My mother sees newsreels of British soldiers marching through Brussels on Armistice Day. In London that

year not a single wreath was laid at the Cenotaph. We were still at war and my grandparents' house was severely damaged that November by a V2 flying bomb. All the windows were blown out and there was a big hole in the roof. And it was bitterly cold. We must always be thankful for those who fought for the Allies and who finally brought peace to the world 80 years ago.

Our All Souls service in early November brought people together who have lost loved ones. It is a time for reflection and giving thanks for lives well-lived.

The PCC met in November and approved the appointment of a new architect to take forward our project for a new meeting room. Mark Eddison is now going ahead with finding a surveyor for the trees in the churchyard and for a topographical survey to identify any hidden graves. His company will then draw some designs for us to consider. Looking forward to the Christmas period, we are bringing back the Tewin Nativity at 4pm on 14th December when, like a Medieval Mystery play, we shall process around the churchyard to see a dramatization of the Christmas story. Our Annual Carol Service is on Sunday 21st December at 6.30pm. On Christmas Eve we have the popular Crib Service at 3pm, followed by Midnight Mass at 11.30pm. Christmas morning there will be an All-age Communion service at 10am. These are all times when it is good to bring the village together to celebrate a time of peace and joy. All are welcome.





News from Danesbury and the Queen Victoria Memorial Hospitals

Here we are once again nearly at Christmas, a season of mixed emotions – beloved by children of all ages but perhaps not always quite so much by the adults on whom all the expense and hard work falls. As you can imagine no one likes to be in hospital for Christmas but for some it will happen and this is one season when our charity, the Friends of Danesbury and the Queen Victoria Memorial Hospitals, can be really effective, providing parties at both hospitals and small gifts and other treats for the patients.

In my last newsletter I wrote about the tournament at Welwyn Tennis Club on 5 October and the generosity of the Club in choosing the Friends as their charity. I am now very happy to report that the event raised £6,300 for which we are truly grateful.

I also spoke a little about the Annual General Meeting of our charity which was held in the Danesbury hospital on 23 October. It was well attended this year. Marianne Hawes, our then chairman, gave a report on the activity of the charity throughout the year. She explained that the Danesbury hospital is now a specialist Neurological Centre providing a wide variety of rehabilitation treatments for both in and out-patients, with a variety of neurological problems. Treatment options are designed around individual patient needs. The hospital receives good support from the NHS Trust and there is a continuing determination to establish it as the centre of excellence for Hertfordshire.

The Queen Victoria hospital has a broader remit and caters for patients who have had a stroke or other medical, surgical or orthopaedic illness and who need rehabilitation after being in the Lister or another acute hospital. Staff at the QVM strive to help patients reach their full potential and maximise their

independence. They have also recently introduced a 4-chair bay Community Treatment Clinic where patients can receive various treatments such as intravenous antibiotics, wound dressings and blood tests on an outpatient basis.

This year the profit from our shop in Welwyn High Street and eBay sales has been such that the Friends charity has been able as usual to fund arts and crafts clubs, a gardening club and beauty therapy. They are also, for the first time, funding holistic therapy for patients at both hospitals. This has been found to be therapeutic to both their physical and emotional wellbeing.

Marianne has now retired as chairman of the charity after five very successful years. The Friends are most grateful for all her hard work and inspirational leadership. Her place has now been taken by Tony Stowe, a very experienced trustee, so the charity is again in safe hands.

May I wish everyone a very happy Christmas. Thank you all for taking an interest in the Friends charity and visiting our charity shop. We still have cards and gifts if you are short of last minute ideas.
