#### A Letter from Susannah, our new Vicar



It is a somewhat cringe-worthy process having to write an introduction to ourselves in a way in which a) those of you who don't know us find remotely interesting and appealing b) those of you who do know us don't snigger as the 'polished' version of the Underwood's is presented. I'll leave you to surmise which version I've opted for.

Bob and I are both locally raised and have lived, in the main, in Welwyn for most of our childhood and adult lives. Bob attended Oakland's School and then Sir

Fred's. I went to Welwyn St Mary's and Bishop's Hatfield Girls' School. A certain Mrs Jupp taught me for my 'A' level RE (warning: look where that can lead...)

Bob and I met whilst members of 2nd Welwyn Venture Scouts. Bob is a hardy outdoor type, having walked the coast of Britain in his younger days – and now a man in love with his mountain bike. I was a reluctant Venture and still moan if it rains.

Bob is a cabinetmaker and works in Harpenden in a workshop, which is well placed behind a pub: a great position to be in those winters where they have been snowed in. We have two daughters, Rebecca 18 and Annabel 13.

Before ordination I juggled raising children whilst studying for a Theology degree, child-minding and working at St Mary's school as a teaching assistant. I continued my work with children as I studied part time for ordination with the Eastern Region Ministry Course, starting an MA through that and undertaking my practical training with Alan Winton at St Mary's. For me this was a really good way to train; it rooted my studies in practical issues and helped cement my belief that faith is and must be relevant to 'real' life. Young people and children have remained central in my ministry. I was ordained with Diane Whittaker at St. Albans Cathedral in 2008.

Since Ordination I have served my curacy in the parish of Holy Trinity, Stevenage, where the churches work really hard to serve their communities. During this time I also acted as Chaplain to the UK fundraising office of Mercy Ships which provides free surgery to people on the West coast of Africa. Last year I was privileged enough to visit the charity in Togo and see the ship, crew and patients first-hand. It was amazing - maybe some of you might like to join me in visiting it again in the future - it really is good news to the poor.

We are so very excited about beginning the next phase of ministry in Tewin and Datchworth and the wider Team.

We come with one cat (Mr Bigglesworth) and the promise of a dog for Annabel (we're still open to suggestions of breeds – medium sized, not too smelly or barky). I am looking forward to immersing myself in village life once more: Bob is looking forward to sunny summer afternoons watching cricket on one of the greens: Annabel is looking forward to a bigger bedroom: Rebecca is looking forward to a utility room (yes that is truly what she said).
