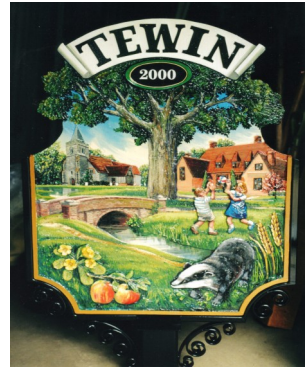

At the Annual Parish Council meeting on 11th May 2026 Cllr Keith St Pier and Cllr Adrian Hill were elected as Chairman and Vice Chairman respectively with the unanimous support of the Councillors.

Notes From An Apiary

We have had some mixed weather over the last few weeks with some quite cold days but largely dry. Looks like we are set for a glorious May Bank Holiday weekend. I'll be enjoying the sunshine and warmth, as will our bees.

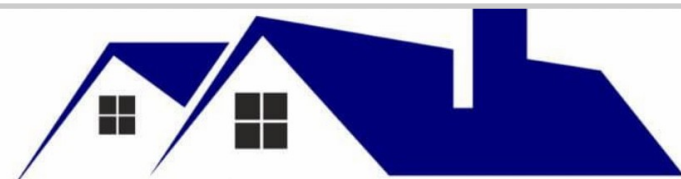
Bees need a regular supply of water, but it has been very dry. You may have seen them around water in your gardens, taking a cheeky drink. We have seen them around our water butts and ensure they have a supply close to the hives. Must keep it topped up in the hot spell.

The rape seed finished flowering last week. Just as it was coming to its end, we harvested our first crop of honey. Honey from Rape presents bees and beekeepers with problems. While rape generally provides a good nectar flow, the sugars in rape nectar result in a honey that goes hard very quickly. So hard that it is almost impossible to extract from frames and indeed so hard that the bees are unable to use it as a source of energy when needed.

We are approaching June and the fabled June gap, a period between spring and summer flowering. Spring is hectic, colonies expanding nectar flow, swarming and cropping the Rape honey. In June activity in the hives slows down and some colonies look like they are regressing. It could be that the gap has arrived early this year, possibly the dry spell reducing nectar flows. We need to watch out for lack of forage and potential starvation in the hives. Experts now believe the June gap is not a fixed point but dependant on several environmental factors.

When bees have a restricted diet, feeding on a narrow range of floral sources show a decline in their immune function and resistance to stress and disease. This means they may be surrounded by bounty but if it's only one type of flower they will not do so well. A bit like humans only eating hamburgers and beer. Not that I have anything against hamburgers and a nice pint of IPA.

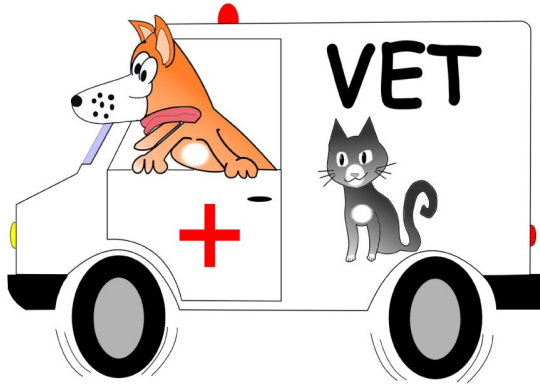

One Hundred Years Of Welwyn Garden City Station

In October this year, Welwyn Garden City railway station will be 100 years old. The first phase of artwork to mark the centenary has been delivered across the station campus subway, the bridge, and the platform shelters, and was officially unveiled on 14 May 2026.

The project was developed in close partnership with the All Aboarders, the station's volunteer adoption group. Most of the historic photographs came from Hertfordshire Archives and Library Services, who were enormously helpful with sourcing and permissions, and a few were provided directly by the original photographers with their permission. New photographs, including drone shots, sit alongside the historic ones, and the flower images on the platform shelters were co-ordinated by the All Aboarders.

The artwork tells the story of the station through the decades, including the early days when commuters would walk to the station in wellington boots — the town was still a building site — and leave their wellies at the station before catching the train. A row of art deco-style paintings runs along the platform, showing the stations between London Kings Cross and Cambridge, and what visitors can see in Welwyn Garden City when they arrive.

Students at Oaklands College contributed lino-printed images of the station and further panels were created with local schools, local artists and photographers, and the Welwyn Hatfield Business Improvement District.

A second phase will follow later in the year, a rail-themed book trail for children, a display in the Howard Centre about the history of the station, and information panels created with Siemens, who have been upgrading the signalling, highlighting past, present and future careers in the rail industry. Young people don't always realise the opportunities the rail industry offers, and the panels are designed to change that.

Team Vicar's Letter

I have met with a number of people recently who are sensing that they are being called to a new thing. Sometimes it's because of circumstance – an upcoming move, or new stage of life, and sometimes it has been an inner stirring that is drawing them to a particular task, role or vocation.

In the bible there are a multitude of stories where God calls people (children and adults), inviting them into unexpected paths and deeper faith. Sometimes a call from God can be a gentle nudge, towards kindness, service or prayer. At other times it arrives more clearly inviting us into new roles and responsibilities and can involve courage as we step into the unknown.

This season, the life of our churches remind us particularly of that theme of responding to God's call. Currently adults and young people are meeting in preparation for their confirmation service, where they will publicly affirm the promises on their behalf at baptism.

Confirmation is an important milestone in the Christian journey, not an ending but a beginning; an affirmation of being prepared to step into the path of faith that lies ahead.

We also look forward with great joy to the ordination of our new curate, Sulu Pike. Ordination is itself a profound response to God's calling – one that involves prayer, discernment, sacrifice and stepping into the unknown. If you are a praying type do keep Sulu and her family in your prayers at this time.

Of course there are a multitude of tasks that people are called to – caring for family, supporting neighbours, volunteering in the community, encouraging others – each of us is called to serve in our own unique way. If you have a sense that God might be calling you to something new and would like a conversation to help think that through, then please do get in touch.

Sulu's ordination is at St Albans's cathedral on Sunday 5th July 4pm. The confirmation service will take place on Sunday 26th July 6:30pm St Mary's Welwyn. All are welcome.

Tewin Cricket Club

The 2026 season has got underway and already Tewin Cricket Club have won an award! Albeit for a 2025 achievement. The Hertfordshire Cricket Grounds Association in association with the Hertfordshire Premier Cricket League have awarded us with the “IN CRICKET SURFACE PROVISION” certificate of excellence.

This is an award that is down to one person, Gareth “Shep” Shepard, our groundskeeper. He can often be seen come rain or shine working away on the “square” or marking out the boundary. Well done Shep! It’s richly deserved and all who play at Tewin appreciate all the effort that goes into producing such a wonderful place to play cricket.

As promised, I recently managed to catch up with our very own county cricketer. We are very proud of Eva Cullen. I hope you enjoy our little chat as much as I did.

How long have you lived in Tewin?

All my life! But I’ve lived in both Grass Warren and Harwood Close. We had to move out of our old house due to it being tiny. My room spilled over into a clothes cupboard, that I would sit in so I could have more space to play.

What schools did you go to?

I went to Tewin Cowper primary school which was lovely- nice and small, nice and close to home. I attended Presdales in Ware, an all-girls secondary school. Cricket wasn’t a priority at either school, understandably so, therefore I settled for rounders and football.

When did you make your Tewin debut?

I think it was in 2021, so I was 14 years old. It was a historic day because I played in the same team as my older brother Lewis and my dad. I didn’t bat but I bowled six overs for 43 runs, so at least the opposition didn’t go easy on me. I genuinely appreciated that because there’s nothing worse than playing against men who profusely praise you just for being able to bowl straight.

Would you describe yourself as a cricket allrounder?

Absolutely! More of a batting all-rounder though nowadays, as I have been opening the batting for Hertfordshire for the last two seasons. My bowling has been neglected a bit recently, but I can always count on a few overs at Tewin which is great!

When did you make your Herts senior debut?

It was on the 30th of June 2024 away against Berkshire. I was so thrilled to get a chance in the women’s team, especially as the standard was so high. In fact, many from that team play professionally in Hundred competition. At

the time, I felt like the best way I could contribute and make a positive impact was with my fielding. I took two great catches and volunteered excitedly to put a helmet on and field at short leg. I did my best to show my skills, and it paid off as I've been in the county team ever since.

Has any person or event influenced your approach to cricket?

Anya Shrubsole! I attended the Women's World Cup final at Lord's in 2017. I was 10, a little overwhelmed as it was my first major experience with live sport. The whole day was incredible. We had an amazing view from the media stand, and it remains as the best game of cricket I have ever watched live. Anya stepped up and single-handedly won the world cup for England, it will always be special to me. A left-arm swing bowler performing so excellently was inspiring and encouraged me to take pride in being a female cricketer. I think her performance motivated me to work hard, I wanted to experience the pride she must've felt on that amazing day. I think I have, a few times now, which feels wonderful and I am grateful to have been taken seriously as a cricketer which I don't think would've happened so naturally without the success of the England cricket team that day. The impact their win had on women's cricket is something I've seen and felt first hand.

Who are the most influential people in your life?

I'm afraid it is the most obvious and predictable answer: my parents, who influenced everything about me like my sense of humour and my love for sport. My parents, Liz and Mark, have devoted so much time to watching me play cricket, since I was 7. It means so much as I wouldn't be where I am without their support. They've driven me to beautiful cricket grounds, to training (often multiple times a week) to help me get better year by year, and I've met people who are very important to me through cricket. So, I'm extremely grateful for their help and encouragement. One of the biggest ways my dad has influenced me is by instilling a love for catching and diving in me from a young age. As long ago as I can remember, we would play catch together except he would purposely throw the ball 5 feet away from me. I didn't understand and just thought he wasn't very good, but eventually I learned how to dive and catch a cricket ball. It's an amazing skill that I have so much fun with nowadays so I'm thankful for his influence in making me a 'natural' at a skill I love so much.

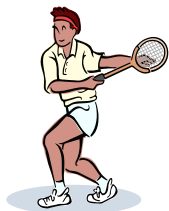

Friends of Danesbury and QVM

As I write at the end of April, gardens are looking beautiful with all the blossom and new leaves but there has been very little rain and everything is beginning to dry out. As you read at the beginning of June it may still be glorious and even drier or it may be cold and wet in the way of many English summers.

The Friends of Danesbury have been continuing to support the patients and staff of both the Welwyn hospitals with funds raised by our marvellous shop in Welwyn High Street. I know I am always singing its praises but unless you have visited you can have no idea of the extraordinary variety of goods we are kindly donated and are able to sell. The majority of what we are offering is good quality women's clothing and shoes, some new still with the original shop labels, others good quality nearly new. We also sell men's and children's clothes, curtains and bedding, household china and cutlery, ornaments and books as well as jewellery – from costume items to delicate pieces in gold, silver and precious stones. Everything is clean and very reasonably priced.

Recently we have been able to provide both hospitals with summer bedding plants for their gardens. The hospitals are in such a lovely spot at the end of the village looking out over gorgeous countryside and it is clear that those patients who are able to go outside really appreciate these gardens. As well as the plants we have also been able to provide the Danesbury hospital with various items to add to the enjoyment of their grounds – hedgehog houses, a ladybird box and an insect hotel as well as a bird nesting box. These items all came in kit form and were made up by patients with the assistance of staff, providing a little physiotherapy and extra interest to patients with disabling conditions.

I am also happy to report that the Friends have had a special donation enabling them to order Blaze Pods and Cones which are used by patients to promote hand and leg function, balance and general mobility.

On a less happy note, I am very sad to tell you that our charity shop in the village was broken into recently. The door and the window in it were both broken, some items of jewellery were stolen and the charity collection box was smashed. In contrast the generosity of various businesses in the village has been quite amazing, offering help and providing funds to pay for the damage to the shop. Thank you to everyone.
