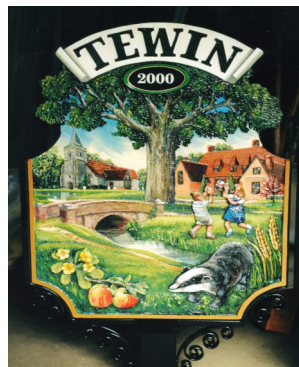

LOCAL GOVERNMENT REORGANISATION

The Government has now set out its decision regarding the future structure of local government in Hertfordshire. The Government's preferred model is for 4 unitary councils to be established across the county. This means that the services currently delivered by East Herts Council along with those of Hertfordshire County Council, will transfer to Eastern Hertfordshire Council on 1 April 2028. This marks a significant step forward in the reorganisation process and provides a clear framework on which the next phase of planning can proceed. Transition plans are already in development across the county to ensure that services continue without disruption throughout this period. There will be further updates and opportunities to engage as more detailed proposals are developed.

GREY BELT IN TEWIN - Report on the proposed Grey Belt, showing how it affects Tewin.

The government recently introduced the concept of Grey Belt and instructed local authorities to conduct an assessment of which parts of the Green Belt can be regarded as Grey Belt. East Herts Council instructed an external consultancy to carry out this assessment. You can read the pdf of "Green Belt Assessment" on the Tewin Village website.

The Campaign for the Protection of Rural England ("CPRE") has issued a report explaining Grey Belt and its impact. The link to this can also be found on Tewin Village website "Devastating 'grey belt' impact revealed in our new report".

Please note that this is not an East Herts Council initiative. They are just following instructions from central government.

CONSULTATION : FUTURE OF PANSHANGER GOLF COURSE

Welwyn Hatfield Council is consulting on whether the Panshanger site could help meet future leisure, health and wellbeing needs in Welwyn Garden City. Early feasibility work suggests the site could have the potential to deliver a new swimming pool and leisure centre, community uses, health and wellbeing provision, walking routes, play space, accessible green space, homes and wider public benefits. At this stage, the master plan is indicative, no decisions have been made and any proposal would need further consultation, technical work and future decision-making.

There are several in person engagement events in July, and a short online survey, the consultation period ends on Friday 31 July. The link is on the Tewin village website.

NEW EAST HERTS LOCAL PLAN – New Scoping Consultation

Tewin Parish Council has submitted a response to this and their comments echo comments made by the comprehensive submission CPRE which Tewin Parish Council fully support.

Beekeeping in Tewin

There have been beekeepers in Tewin for generations. In the 1880s Thomas Blow established a beehive factory in Welwyn which became EH Taylor Ltd. It proved to be very successful, selling beehives all over the country. People from Tewin were amongst its employees. In the 1980s it was acquired by EH Thorne (Beehives) of Lincolnshire and subsequently the land was sold for housing.

During the Second World War many people in Tewin kept bees and were given a special sugar allowance by the Ministry of Food and Agriculture. The tradition continues today, with Paul Ugo keeping bees at Tewin Mill House, while Mike Brady and Phil Raine do so in the village. Both supply honey to Tewin Stores.

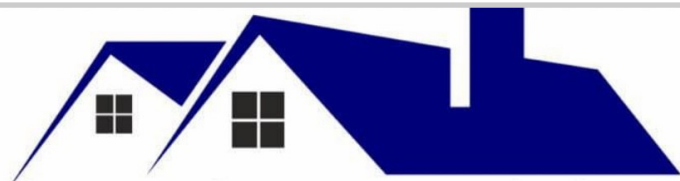
First Manned Balloon Flight in England

On September 15th 1784 Vincent Lunardi of Lucca, Tuscany took off in a hot air balloon from The Honourable Artillery Company grounds at Moorfields in London. He landed 2 hours and 15 mins later at Standon Green End in Hertfordshire. The balloon flight was sighted over Bacon's Farm by John Carrington who noted in his diary:

'....Lunarday assended in a Boolone at the artillery ground London to a great hithe over Barnat, North Hall, then went for St Albans, then took his Course East over Codicote, Wellin, Tewin, Bengoe & Landed him self in a Little Meadow at Standon Green End, he Throwd his line out and was pulld down by a young woman in the meadow who was fritned at first and runaway, thought it the Devill, till he made her sencable and gave her 5 Guineas, it was a very fine hot day, I saw him plane as he came over Bacons, he was at a great Hight for his Boloone was 30 feet round but appeared no bigger than a Boys Kite....

Wm Baker Esqre of Bayfordbury took him home.... & Baker had a great pibble Stone.... Remooved to the place he fell & a Brass plate put thereon with the account'.

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A new countywide support service for survivors of violence against women and girls (VAWG) was launched in Hertfordshire on Wednesday 1 July, bringing together specialist organisations to deliver a more accessible, consistent, and joined-up approach to support.

The Mimram service will act as a single ‘One Front Door’ for all VAWG referrals across the county, ensuring that survivors can access the help they need quickly and efficiently, regardless of their level of risk or circumstances.

The service, which symbolically draws its name from a Hertfordshire River, has been designed to:

- Simplify access to support, making it easier for survivors to get help
- Provide advocacy across all risk levels, from early intervention through to high-risk cases
- Deliver consistent, countywide provision, reducing variation between local areas
- Offer joined-up support for individuals experiencing multiple forms of abuse.

The service will be delivered by Refuge, in partnership with, Safer Places, St Albans and Hertsmer Women’s Refuge and Asian Women’s Resource Centre. Together, these organisations bring a wide range of expertise, enabling tailored support for individuals experiencing different forms of abuse.

To strengthen support for marginalised communities, the Asian Women’s Resource Centre will provide specialist support for women and children from Black and Minority Ethnic (BME) communities, including those affected by harmful practices.

The Mimram Gender Based Abuse Support Service is jointly funded by Hertfordshire County Council, Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner and NHS Central East Integrated Care Board and this collaborative investment reflects a shared commitment to improving outcomes for survivors and ensuring equitable access to support across Hertfordshire. For Hertfordshire, this is an important service. For survivors, it can be a lifeline. Leaving abuse is hard enough without having to navigate multiple systems while trying to recover and pick up the pieces.

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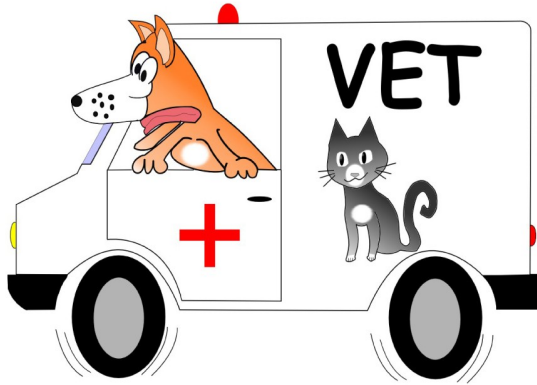

Team Vicar's Letter

At first I thought it was a squirrel, snoring. I know that sounds ridiculous, but late one balmy evening in early summer I became aware of a rather strange noise from halfway up a tree. It was like slow and snoozy breathing and all rather odd. Wracking my (clearly limited) brain for possible explanations a particularly sleepy squirrel was the best guess I could make. Curiosity drew me nearer, until to my amazement I realised the sound was coming from the ivy clad and long forgotten barn owl box that we had erected on an ash tree some thirteen years ago. Finally we had our first tenants!

The warm and dry evenings in June and July have meant there has been much opportunity for getting to know this new little family. The snorey sounds are actually the noise young barn owls make to hurry their parents up on their search for voles and shrews. Soon three beautiful, fully feathered young, came out of hiding and would sit on the top of their new home as we watched the parents fly back and forth across the field with food. Exhausting work for a while.

However that season has soon passed. The owl box lies empty again. If we are lucky we do still see an owl or two sitting in the ash tree above our heads on a warm night. Soon, I know, they will find properly hidden roosting spots and we will see them less and less.

This summer many parents will be preparing for the new academic year and praying that their children will find their wings and fly. In this there is both beauty and loss, but Jesus has promised that just as God knows every bird of the air, so too his care is over all his children.

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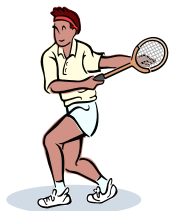

Tewin Cricket Club

It is with some regret that my catch up with the club captain has not yet taken place. To be fair to Luke Wilde, his spare time is very scarce, in fact, as I write this, he is currently playing for a representative team at the beautiful county ground of Devon cricket in Sidmouth. I might save this piece with him till the season's end.

On the field, it has been a very productive time for the first team. Since my last instalment they have raced to the top of the league having played ten games losing only one. The second team are comfortably mid-table in their league and with a push could make a run for promotion. The third team are seeing some very positive performances from the junior element. Being a development team, this is very good news for the future of our Tewin Cricket Club. Our Sunday side are currently second in the North Herts league, just two points behind and very much in striking distance of leaders of the well-resourced Stevenage first team.

Although cricket is a team game, it's worth noting some individual performances. Dennis (Den) Hill (our professional Yorkshireman) at the age of 73 years young, taking 5 wickets against Letchworth and Luke Wilde hitting several centuries. He has already amassed 1,200 runs so far this season.

The rest of the season, like the weather seems set fair, sunny and bright without a cloud on the horizon.

I'm sure it hasn't escaped anyone's notice, how parched Upper Green and the cricket pitch looks during this hot, dry spell. It is universally welcomed by cricketers however, it does throw up a few issues. The safety and wellbeing of those participating and spectating is our primary concern. Hydration is the main one. During games in hot weather, regular breaks for drinks are taken, hats (although not mandatory) are encouraged as is sunscreen. A hard "outfield" makes the ball bobble and bounce which makes it difficult to judge when heading towards you. An overly dry "wicket" can make the bounce of the ball very irregular which is a concern and can be dangerous to batters. This is why we sparingly water the wicket to ensure a flat, safe environment for all.

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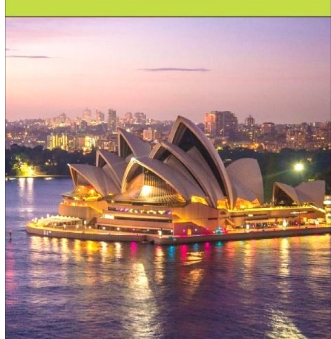
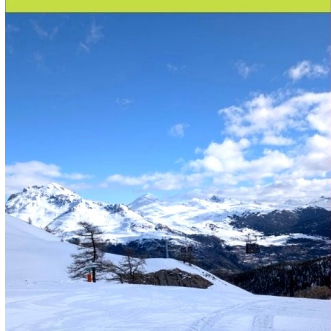

The Beds, Herts and Essex Junction Railway of 1845

In 1845 a new railway, the Beds, Herts and Essex Junction Railway, was proposed to run from the Bedford area through Ayot St. Lawrence, Welwyn, Digswell, Tewin and Bramfield en route to Hertford and Essex.

New railways had to be passed by an Act of Parliament. This proposal was set up in great detail with every property, landowner and occupant listed by surveyors as a proposition to the House of Lords for legislation. See opposite for the list of plots (not house numbers) affected with the corresponding map. You will note the names of some of the people impacted at the time were of families who still exist in Tewin today.

Many homes around Lower Green would have been affected, indeed demolished, when the railway passed through as the proposed route would have cut a swathe of around 100 yards (30 metres) through what has now become the newer parts of the Village.

The Old School House (no longer a school by then) and some of the properties to the North of Lower Green were not affected: the Forge, Vine Cottage and others would have been unscathed. However, much of today's Lower Green would not have existed.

This proposed junction railway was part of the "railway mania" in the 1840s and did not proceed through lack of funds due to the financial crash of 1845. The financial chaos unfolded through a specific timeline:

The Boom (Early 1840s to 1845): Easy credit and high returns from early railways created a massive speculative fever. Investors poured money into new rail ventures, driving share prices to unsustainable peaks.

The Crash (October 1845): The bubble burst when the Bank of England raised interest rates, which made borrowing for speculation much more expensive. Railway share prices dropped 40% from their August peak.

The Aftermath: Investors panicked as companies with unfinished railways collapsed and the remaining costs for shares were called in. This crash wiped out the life savings of many middle-class investors.
