Telephone faults

Unfortunately over the Christmas period some telephone cable was stolen in Churchfield Road resulting in a lot of houses in the village being without any telephone services. Whilst BT Open Reach has now replaced the cable there still seems to be some on-going problems such as crossed lines. BT is aware that more work needs to be done. Please continue to report all faults to your phone provider.

High speed broadband

BT Open Reach intend to install FTTC (Fibre to the Cabinet) in Tewin later this year, which would make "40 Mbit/s" broadband available. Their first planning application to site the new cabinet near the existing BT cabinet on the corner by Muspatts Farm was rejected by East Herts Council because *'The proposed tele-communications cabinet, by reason of its height and siting in a public landscaped amenity area, would be unduly intrusive in this setting within the street scene and wider rural landscape'.*

Digital switchover

Analogue television will be switched off in April 2012 and if residents don't have digital TV by the time of switchover, they will lose their TV channels. Whilst most people's equipment is already compatible and will just need re-tuning at the time of switchover there are some people that will need to convert them to digital using a Freeview box, a digital satellite service or digital cable. You can check the options for going digital in your area, and what channels will be available through an aerial, using the postcode checker at digitaluk.co.uk.

There is also a scheme called BBC-run Switchover Help Scheme to provide everything needed to switch one TV set to digital. People are eligible for the Help Scheme if they are aged 75 or over, or registered blind/partially sighted, or receiving Disability Living Allowance, or Attendance or Constant Attendance Allowance, or Mobility Supplement, or living in a care home (since six months or more). Please ring for free **0800 40 85 900** for more details or visit helpscheme.co.uk. Textphone users can call 0800 40 85 936. If you have any questions about switchover, you can call the Digital UK advice line on 08456 50 50 50 or visit digitaluk.co.uk.
