Vicar's letter

"I declare before you that my whole life, whether it be long or short, shall be devoted to your service ... But I shall not have strength to carry out this resolution unless you join in it with me, as I now invite you to do: I know that your support will be unfailingly given. God help me to make good my vow, and God bless all of you who are willing to share in it".

These were words spoken by Queen Elizabeth II on her 21st birthday in 1947. In a world where promises seem cheap and readily broken it is awe-inspiring to see footage of this young woman committing herself to her country and to think upon the decades she has faithfully done so. On national and international stages, in political and social arenas the world has turned relentlessly – much has come and gone – but it seems to me that the Queen's commitment to her role and the countries she serves remains constant.

Of course the idea of monarchy and service are deeply imbedded within biblical tradition. Yes, kingship was a privilege but with it came a hefty responsibility for the care of one's people. Old Testament prophets got very angry when ruling monarchs forgot this. Obviously the most notable model of rule and sacrifice is to be seen in Jesus himself, the servant king.

Her speech also invites us all into her role: into service and neighbourliness of one another and perhaps also prayerful support of her. So as we approach our Jubilee celebrations it is right and proper this is done together as communities. Armed with bunting and teapots, jazz and dancing, the villages of Datchworth and Tewin promise to be examples of this nation at its best - for there is no better way, I feel, to celebrate a monarch who's promoted responsibility and care of one's neighbour than to get together with our own.

Among the celebrations will be a special village Jubilee service of thanksgiving on Lower Green. Fuelled with a hearty English breakfast in the Memorial Hall, sing with us some of the nation's favourite hymns, join in with prayers for our Queen, nation and neighbours and then listen to the wonders of the Welwyn Garden City Male Voice Choir. Sunday 3rd June 11am, Lower Green. Then, to complete the day come to St Peter's church for tea and cake in the afternoon. I'm sure her Majesty would thoroughly approve!

Tewin Memorial Hall AGM – cont'd

This award was the culmination of many months of hard work by our small committee, whose devotion and commitment was truly tested as we navigated our way through a series of major refurbishment projects and fund raising efforts. The fact that we received this official recognition, despite stiff competition from fellow village halls lying within such a large area of Hertfordshire, illustrates the true extent of our achievements over the past 12 months.

The financial element of this award is £10,000, which is to be invested in the creation of much needed additional storage by extending the Scout Hut, for which we are currently seeking permission. Our Treasurer, Peter Burleigh's, report details the full extent of our finances but I would like to mention that in 12 months we secured grants, and fund raised, to the tune of £59,792, which drew interest from the local media and is thanks to our dynamic committee and loyal supporters. Space does not allow me to name everyone who has played such a key role in our success, but I would like to highlight the day-to-day maintenance work done by Rod Frayne and Keith St Pier, who have saved us thousands of pounds and allowed our hard earned fund raising monies to work even more effectively for the benefit of the Hall. In addition, Julia Tizard has also given great support, whilst Lynn Farr has worked feverishly putting together the grant papers, with Peter providing the financial element. All our submissions were completed to a very high standard, which afforded us a level of success way beyond expectations. I would also like to mention Paul and Diane Hagger who were key organisers of our kitchen, toilet and bar refurbishment, and would also thank Debbie Kirby of the Under 5's Group, who managed to secure a significant grant to help finance the replacement of the Scout Hut roof.

Moving on to fund raising, I think it is fitting to mark and celebrate the 10th anniversary of Todd and Jean Canton's command of the well-oiled machine that is Operation TMH – Jumble Sales. This year they, and their army of loyal volunteers, broke all previous records, which increased the total raised in 10 years to a massive £28,886. Lynn Farr is now in the process of planning our Fete, which is another successful event, raising much needed funds, and brings our small community together. This year she needs extra support, so if you are able to either join her planning group or be there on the day, please contact her straightaway on 01438 798307. Both this and the Jumble Sales could be in jeopardy of cancellation in the future if we do not get some new blood on board and SOON!

Despite being very well managed and publicised by Lisa Bove, our Supporters' Club struggles to secure more members, even though we offer the potential of winning 4 prizes per month for only a £1 contribution, and from this we direct £6 per member each (plus gift aid) into our funds. So please spread the word and encourage others to sign up NOW! I must also thank Linda Crawford and David Gregg (Friends of Tewin) for their tireless efforts on the Book Sales, which have proved to be another good fund raiser. Further generosity from the Parish Council, THACS and Friends of Tewin was also very much appreciated by the Management Team as they were crucial sponsors in securing our *Biffa Award*. I also wish to convey thanks to the *THACS* Committee and its members for their generous donation of £1,000 towards the acquisition of projection and sound equipment. This will not only support *'The Screen on the Green'* initiative, but will provide valuable additional facilities for hirers of the Hall. So far all of the screenings have been sell-outs, so thank you Linda Adams, Kevin Brazier, Rod and the Team.

Finally, on fund raising, I must make a plea to our residents to consider hiring our Hall for weddings, celebrations, business or recreational purposes, or please support our Zumba, Yoga and Badminton Groups, who may soon cease functioning without new members. The phrase 'Use it or Lose it' comes to mind here (see Tewin website for details). When compared with other venues, the hire cost of your Hall is well below the market rate, and our catering, bar and toilet facilities are of a very high standard. Feel free to come and look at the improvements. We are now looking for someone to join the Committee in a marketing role, with a view to increasing our bookings. Is there anyone out there who would like to help?

In addition, this time last year I announced that Peter wished to hang up his abacus and hand over his Treasurer duties. Thankfully, he was too loyal to walk out the door but insisted we identify a replacement whom he would support through their first year. Into the breach stepped Gail Elliott as Treasurer Designate, and by Pat Fulford as Assistant Treasurer. Both these ladies have a professional background in finance and we are fortunate to have them on board. Going back to Peter, I would take this opportunity to say a few words on his outstanding commitment. When he took over in 2001, no returns had been completed for the Charities Commission, and the Beit Trust monies had not been claimed for 6 years. Peter has rectified this and has also set up a Gift Aid facility. In 2001 the annual spend was £356, in 2012 it fell just shy of £50,000, and the total balances were £6,000 and £57,000 respectively. (David continued his tribute to Peter Burleigh but space doesn't allow for the full report which can be seen on the Tewin website).

Other future plans include work on our car park, finishing the secondary glazing and replacing guttering. In the meantime I want to state that it has been a real pleasure working alongside such wonderful people.

Following the Parish Council meeting on May 14th 2012 Kristina Lawson and Keith St Pier were elected as Chairman and Vice Chairman respectively with the unanimous support of the Councillors.

Sevenacres

Planning Application 3/12/0597/FP - Demolition of Seven Acres House and erection of 28 dwellings (including 18 previously approved) new dwellings (including 11 affordable units). Tewin Parish Council displayed paper copies of the planning application in Tewin Memorial Hall from 2.30pm to 7 pm on 14th May 2012. This presentation was well attended and seventeen written comments were left as well as a number of verbal comments.

The Parish Council agreed to submit a response to EHC Planning reflecting parishioners' main concerns which were the cumulative effects of further development, to retain the existing tall hedge that borders the tennis courts on Upper Green, inadequate parking provision, unwanted overflow on to the Upper Green car park, narrowness of the site roads, insufficient recycling provision and impractical storage of bins. The Parish Council would like consideration to be given as to how the site is to be maintained and ensure that garages are not converted and front gardens not paved over through use of planning conditions. The Parish Council support the use of low level lighting bollards and the proposal of at least 75% of the affordable housing as some form of part ownership with preference to people connected with Tewin.

The Parish Council is in the process of arranging a meeting with Taylor Wimpey to discuss the way forward with regards to the footpath and the flashing solar powered speed sign.

River Mimram

The River Mimram is in danger of being damaged by a lack of water, partly caused by Veolia extracting water on our behalf. The Environment Agency has developed a positive business case to justify a reduction of water abstraction by 2015. For this to come to fruition it needs to be approved by Ministers before Christmas 2012.
