#### Vicar's letter

#### Olympics

Let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us. [Hebrews 12:1]

It was probably the trauma of school PE that put me off sport. I know PE teachers yell as it's difficult to be heard on a noisy hockey field, but at the time I only associated it with them all being grumpy, never endearing me to the lessons. Watching sport also seemed to affirm this view, the tranquillity of Sunday afternoons often interrupted by aggressive primeval howls as my father watched his beloved Spurs give yet another goal to Arsenal.

But there is something in the build up to the Olympics which I find quite appealing. It is less the sport that will happen in the official stadiums (although I suspect even I will enjoy watching an event or two) but more so the lives of ordinary people who have been brought into the spotlight as we've prepared for the event. And within that the many, many stories of people who have overcome adversity through determination and spirit.

There are the stories of the Olympic torch bearers – some of whom have battled against the odds with illness in their own lives. There are the stories of the Olympic athletes who arrived in this country to compete, having trained in countries of great poverty or conflict. There are the Para-Olympic athletes, some of whom have shown great self determination and belief in their abilities in a world which so often focuses on people's disabilities.

This week I attended sports day at Pinewood school, where some of our young people with learning difficulties and disabilities learn. As they lined up to race with varying levels of physical ability the words from St Paul's letter to the Hebrews seemed particularly apt. For each of them, as for everyone of us, the race before them had unique challenges. But as they made their way down the tracks, in varying speeds and styles, it seemed a metaphor of what lay ahead of them in life itself. The determination on several faces made me think they would actually run it well.

For each of us our race is unique and all athletes know the challenge of injury and obstacles - but, says St Paul, perseverance is the key.
