# **Churchwardens' Notes**



A couple of maintenance jobs were carried out in August. Firstly, Pete took the 15 teak folding chairs, stored near the book shelf, to Audrey's garage. (Thank you for the use of the garage, Audrey!). Pete has re-oiled them to keep them in good condition and enhance their appearance. They are now all back and ready for service. The second job was the removal of the long-standing stains and other marks on the South Altar table. This was carried out by Bill Down (who made the candlesticks that sit on the table). It has had four coats of a protective finish and will hopefully withstand future wear and tear.

On 30<sup>th</sup> September there is a national event called *'Back to Church Sunday'*. Although we do not officially register with the national organisation, it is an occasion when, as ever, you would be most welcome at St Peter's, particularly if you are an infrequent visitor. Additionally it is an occasion when you might like to bring with you friends or neighbours who do not usually attend church but may have done so in the past. You will be assured of a cup of tea or coffee and biscuits at the end of the service!

Since Pete rediscovered the Sabine Family Vault in the churchyard, we have been giving consideration to the future of the Sabine Memorial which sits in the south porch. We have now arranged for an accredited conservator to prepare a report on its condition, any necessary remedial work, and the possible re-location to its original site on the Family Vault. Thankfully, grants are available for both the cost of the report and any renovation work. We are very grateful to Dorothy Swann for taking on the job of accessing grants.

Our search continues for a solution to our need for space adjacent to the church for the use of children during service times and for other social purposes. Back in 1991, plans had been developed for a space adjacent to the south porch but the cost was seen as excessive at the time. In 2007, we investigated the re-installation of a ringing floor in the Tower, with glazed screening in the archway and extending to the north door. In 2008, we requested a visit from the Diocesan Advisory Committee. Their report supported some form of structure around the south porch. Consideration of this area will be helped when we have a clearer idea of our options regarding the Sabine Memorial. Of course, the justification of expenditure, especially at the present time, will be very much in our minds.

We hope that you will be able to join us at St Peter's on 2<sup>nd</sup> September for the last in this year's series of Summer Evensongs (followed by a glass of wine!).

## **Olympic Ringing**

On Friday 27<sup>th</sup> July there was a national initiative to ring bells of any kind at 08:12 to mark the start of the Olympic Games.

The bell ringers of St Peters decided to join in before they went on their annual outing this year to Norfolk.

The ringers were David Rawlins, William Grimwade, Mark Hall, David Hall, Julie Grimwade and Susan Hall.



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## Tewin Bellringers' Outing

On Friday 27<sup>th</sup> July the bell ringers ventured to Norfolk for their annual outing. We were staying at The Old Rectory, Crostwick, about 5 miles from Wroxham on the Norfolk Broads. There were 17 of us in total, including Audrey's sonin-law and grandson. On the Friday evening we all gathered

in Susan and David's room to watch the Olympics opening ceremony, but couldn't make it past 11pm. On Saturday morning we made our way to St Mary & St Andrew's Church at Horsham St Faiths. This was an upstairs ring of 6. It was quite a climb to the ringing chamber, and the bells were very loud. Next stop was All Saints Church Marsham, an upstairs ring of 8 bells, entering the ringing chamber through the floor - the trap door had to be closed during ringing. Our next tower was a first for us, an upstairs ring of 10

bells. We were expecting a parking issue as a market should have going on, but that was not the case. The ringing chamber was huge. The tenor (the heaviest bell) was 17cwt and took two people to ring it up. The ten were nice to ring and after a lot of hard work we went on to lunch at the Goat Inn in Skeyton. Our pre-ordered food was waiting for us. After a good lunch we went on to St Andrew's Church, Felmingham. This was an upstairs ring of 8 with an



extra bell. These were also nice to ring. By now we were starting to think that all the ringers in the area were vertically challenged as the ropes were very long, and at our next church in Buxton, Adam, Audrey's grandson, rang on his knees! Our last church was a ring of 6 at Wroxham. By now were we beginning to flag and the hot weather didn't help. A wash and brush up later we had a lovely meal at the hotel. After a good break-



fast we went to Mundesley beach. As Jill and Phil had brought their dog, Lol, we went to the dog zone of the beach. The weather was hot, sunny and hardly any breeze. We made camp and Lol had a wonderful time chasing the waves. In fact Jill had to fetch her back from the dog free zone. The teenagers started to dig a hole. When they were little they loved to make the hole bigger than themselves. This time proved very difficult as they're now well over 5ft tall. William, well armed with a garden spade, managed to reach the water table and had his own paddling pool. Some were brave enough to swim in the sea, others just paddled. We had a lovely picnic lunch, which Jill and Julie went to get. By about 2pm we could see black clouds gathering. There was rain out at sea, very black clouds, rain, thunder and lightning either side of us, but beautiful sunshine on us. As the clouds moved closer, we decamped and went back to the car park for a cup of tea and a selection of home-made cakes. Graham and Mark tried to fly kites. We thought it a bit risky with lightning around us. By about 4pm the clouds had reached us and we could no longer escape the rain. As we all made our way home, we passed the motorcade carrying Michelle Obama to Mildenhall air base. We had a really good weekend and the weather was kind to us this year.

## **New Councillor**

He would like to ensure that the area remains peaceful and relatively undeveloped for the benefit of the residents whilst taking advantage of any opportunities to improve Parish amenities. He has extensive experience in the house building business, budgeting, commercial issues, building, planning, section 106 contributions, dealing with councils and all types of people.

#### Faster broadband

After intervention by the Parish Council, *BT Openreach* was able to complete the installation of a new cabinet providing super fast broadband to the lower end of the village.

**Development at Garage Site to the Rear of 17-28 Grass Warren** Demolition of garages and clearance of associated land. Erection of 1no 4 bed detached house, 4no 3 bed semi detached houses and 3no 2 bed bungalows.

Tewin Parish Council held open display of the plans for this application on 6<sup>th</sup> August 2012. About 30 parishioners attended and discussed their views and some left written comments. The Parish Council agreed at their extraordinary meeting on 6<sup>th</sup> August to recommend refusal of the application in its present form.

Their objections ranged from dismay at the narrowness of the access for cars, refuse and delivery lorries etc, insufficient turning space, no room for a pedestrian and a car/lorry to pass each other, the access way is a poorly made up track with utility services just under the surface of the track, the distance from the bungalows to their parking is contrary to Policy HSG6, design of the houses is not in keeping, insufficient detail about fencing proposals, lack of tree survey and lack of consideration for construction traffic access and parking.
