What is it about nativity plays that are so utterly appealing?

Shepherds may bash angels over the heads with their crooks, sheep may fidget nonstop because of their woolly tights, innkeepers may flummox teachers by proudly declaring "yes there's plenty of room do come in!", wisemen may trip over their camels, forget their gifts and pick their noses – but somehow there is nothing that a child can do that can take away the delight which adults get from watching them year after year (children please note this is not a challenge).

I am sure there is something to do with nostalgia for those of us who remember such plays in our childhood (particularly those who got to be starring roles such as angels or Mary rather than be the boring old narrator as I was year in year out).

I am sure also there is something to do with their unpredictability. In fact a school which has productions so perfect, that no halo is askew, no baby Jesus dropped on head and no shepherd needs to make an emergency escape to the bathroom fails in its duty.

I am sure there is something also that children manage to give us which adds to the truth of the story. And that is their inability to hide their imperfections - bad habits, nerves, urgent needs (I need the toilet NOW) - coupled with a desire to shine and please which can be read all over their faces.

And, for me, this is what makes the plays so very special. Because that is exactly what the core of the story is about. That God comes to us, just as we are, with our funny habits, insecurities, grubby faces and desire to be loved.

So why not, this year, settle for a less than perfect Christmas- because truthfully it is in the imperfection that Jesus can be found. He comes to you and me showing we are loved, just as we are. Even if that's hard to believe.

Churchwardens' Notes

If all goes as planned this will be the last edition of Parish News in its current format. After around 50 years, we are changing to A5 format with a card cover. There will be space for all the Parish Council news and information, including the useful contact numbers as a permanent feature on the inside of the back cover. Consideration is being given to taking advertising for local businesses. Meanwhile it is hoped to include profiles on Tewin businesses, provided the owners agree. We would like to cover all Tewin clubs and activities with the organisers' agreement and their provision of appropriate copy. It would be ideal to circulate this to the whole village on a monthly basis. In order to give everyone the opportunity to see what is on offer, it is intended to circulate the first issue for January 2013 free of charge to all households, with the hope that many of those who do not see the Parish News currently will wish to join the current list of over 300 subscribers.

The more 'senior citizens' among you may remember the A5 Parish News back in the 1960's. This consisted of four sheets, including the cover, which were specific to Tewin, with four inside sheets (16 A5 pages) of syndicated material which no doubt appeared in many other village news sheets. It carried advertisements such as "D. L. Tyler Fishmonger Greengrocer Poulterer Woodside Road, Digswell" and "For Goodness Sake, Drink Bartons Health Tonic, The Marden Dairy Farm, Tewin" (from the November 1961 issue.)

You may have noticed, especially if you attended the Act of Remembrance on 11th November, that the War Memorial has been repaired, all the joints being sealed with lime mortar and the cross at the top cleaned. With the sunshine on that Sunday, it looked very good! We are most grateful to Friends of Tewin for their contribution to the Parish Council equivalent to covering the costs of the repairs; and to the Parish Council for paying the invoice direct to the contractor.

Thanks to the good efforts of Dorothy Swann, we have been awarded a grant of £600 by the Church Building Council towards a conservator's report on the Sabine Memorial, which currently sits in the porch at St Peter's. This report will contain advice regarding resiting the Memorial in its original position on the Sabine Family Vault.

We had a full church for our School's Remembrance Service on 9th November. Later in the month, one class of 'Detectives' were due to visit St Peter's to uncover details of its history! And another to attend a 'Baptism Workshop'.

After this goes to press our Christmas Market will have been held and we hope that you all enjoyed it. To look forward, in addition to the services listed at the top of the page, there is the Friends of Tewin 'Carols Around the Christmas Tree' on 20th December and an 'Activity Afternoon' in the church for children on 22nd December.

He quotes the Chief Executive of Noah Enterprises, a charity set up in Luton 25 years ago to help the homeless. He later says, about charities, 'an added concern is that much of the funding from Government and local authorities is being cut back at a time when many charities are finding it harder to raise funds.'

What better way to transform our communities than to give generously of our time and money?'

Then, at the Crib service in St Peter's on 23rd December, the collection will go to The Children's Society. Ofwat have just asked Affinity Water to consult what their customers want before preparing their next Water Management Plan which comes into effect in 2015. On 7th November 2012 the East Herts Council Development Control Committee agreed to defer the decision while the applicant Riversmead Housing Association looks at extending the road through the grass area between the existing bungalows, still maintaining it as a no through road.

Welwyn Hatfield Emerging Core Strategy Consultation

This is open from 12th November 2012 to 18th January 2013. The full documents, supporting information and questionnaire is available online at: **www.welhat.gov.uk/localplan2012** as a list of venues where the plans will be on display.

The main point of relevance to Tewin is the release of safeguarded land to the north-east of Welwyn Garden City, at Panshanger Aerodrome, for about 700 dwellings although more details will be given in a future planning document. The proposal is to provide a wide mix of housing size, type and tenure including Gypsy and Traveller provision. Open space, allotments, play areas; provision for primary and secondary education; a convenience shop; maximising opportunities for walking, cycling and public transport; sustainable design and construction and an area of landscaping at the edge of the development.
