#### **Recipes**

Thanks to Sue Enmarsh for this recipe.

#### **Lemon & Almond Biscuits**

#### **Ingredients**

110g (4oz) caster sugar

60g (2<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>oz) icing sugar

1 large free-range egg yolk

150g (5oz) ground almonds

1 tsp almond extract

300g (10oz) plain flour

1 tsp baking powder

Finely grated zest and juice of a large unwaxed lemon 1 small jar of lemon curd (the thicker the better)

#### Method

- 1. Preheat oven to 190<sup>o</sup>C/375<sup>o</sup>F/Gas 5 and line two baking sheets with silicone or greased baking powder.
- 2. Beat the sugar and butter together until very pale and fluffy. Beat in the icing sugar, egg yolk, ground almonds, almond extract, zest and 2 tsps of the lemon juice and mix well. Sift in the flour and baking powder and stir until everything is just combined.
- 3. Divide the dough into golf-ball sized pieces, place on the baking trays then squash the middles with your thumb to form a well. Put a small amount of lemon curd in the depression (not too much or it will overflow in the heat of the oven).
- 4. Bake for about 10-12 minutes until golden.
- 5. Transfer carefully to a wire rack to coll. The biscuits will be very soft when first out of the oven but will firm up as they cool.
