### **AGM** Report

### Chairman's report for 2010

It's been another successful year for *THACS*. We had a full and varied programme of events and all but one of them were well-supported, so thank you, members.

We organised and ran twelve events during 2010.

1) Monday 18th January - Ninth AGM

In January we held the ninth AGM which was followed by an informative and entertaining talk entitled 'The history of paper making and printing' by Mike Creasey.

2) Monday 15<sup>th</sup> February - Jewellery workshops started

In February, Maxine and Charlotte Callaghan ran the first of another series of Jewellery workshops at their shop, Homebeads in Knebworth. Four workshops were held during 2010, with an average class size of six.

3) Friday 26<sup>th</sup> February - Calligraphy workshops started

Also in February, Jo Cooper ran the first of another series of calligraphy workshops in Burnham Green Hall. Ten workshops were held during 2010, with an average class size of seven.

4) Saturday 20<sup>th</sup> March – Ninth Spring Show

The ninth *THACS* Spring Show took place in March. There were 226 entries from 51 exhibitors which was a marvellous effort. Despite having tolerated one of the worst winters and late springs for many years, the gardeners of the society managed to display daffodils and other spring flowers, as well as shrubs and indoor plants. The Arts and Crafts, Photography and Culinary classes were also very well supported.

5) Wednesday 31<sup>st</sup> March - Visit to the Royal Academy of Arts to see *The Real Van Gogh: The Artist and His Letters* 

37 people took a coach trip to the Royal Academy see this exhibition.

The letters that Van Gogh had written to his brother, Theo, were well displayed in the centre of the galleries, with plenty of room around them. There were also many works that had not been exhibited in the United Kingdom before, including some beautiful drawings using reed and quill pens. The outing was enjoyed by all and we were pleased to experience such an excellent exhibition.

6) Saturday & Sunday 15-16 May - Open Gardens

In May, more than 260 people took advantage of the *THACS* Open Gardens event and visited some of the Open Gardens in and around Tewin. Fourteen gardens opened this year and the event

was held over two days. Some opened on Saturday and some on Sunday, ensuring that there were not too many gardens to visit in one day. There were enough Open Gardens to make up two full days out and enough variety to give all of the visitors plenty to see.

7) Wednesday 23<sup>rd</sup> June - Visit to Beth Chatto Gardens

We had a glorious summer day for our visit to Beth Chatto Gardens in June and it seemed particularly appropriate for us to visit them in 2010, since this is the year of their 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary. There were 41 people in the group and 27 of them had chosen to go on the optional one-hour guided tour. The gardens were inspirational and a joy to explore. The gravel garden, water garden and woodland garden each had their own distinctive styles, but also linked together well.

The extensive and well-stocked nursery was also very popular and most of the group returned to the coach laden with their purchases.

8) Saturday 26<sup>th</sup> June - THACS plant stall at the village fete

The *THACS* plant stall at the Tewin Village Fete in June was a resounding success, raising more than £400 for the Tewin Memorial Hall.

9) Saturday 4<sup>th</sup> September - Ninth Autumn Show

The ninth *THACS* Autumn Show took place in September. It was the largest show yet with 111 exhibitors taking part and an amazing 528 entries. The hall was full to brimming with produce and displays of many kinds making an exciting show for all who came in the afternoon.

- 11) Saturday 23<sup>rd</sup> October 10<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Party
- 12) Monday 8<sup>th</sup> November Talk entitled *The Garden in Autumn and Winter* by Margaret Easter.

Reports on the last three events are given later in this newsletter.

Also in November, we had hoped to have a visit to the Royal Academy of Arts to see *Treasures from Budapest*. Unfortunately, this event was cancelled due to lack of support.

In addition to these twelve events:-

- 1) We made a donation of £250 to the Tewin Allotment Association towards the cost of extending the water supply.
- 2) We laid a wreath at St. Peter's war memorial on Remembrance Sunday in November.

Our events and activities were made possible by a large number of people who have given their time and skills so freely. We are indebted to them for their help and support.

As I complete my second year as chairman, I would like to express my gratitude to the *THACS* committee. We have an excellent team, who work well together and individually.

Our Spring and Autumn shows entail much hard work from the committee and other staunch helpers, who are always willing to support us in catering, setting up and clearing the hall. Thank you to these people and to the judges, who give us their valuable time and expertise.

Our thanks also go to the numerous willing members and supporters of the society, who reliably help us with diverse tasks such as:-

- 1) distribution of the newsletter
- 2) displaying posters for our events
- 3) manning our plant stall at the Village Fete
- 4) providing plants for us to sell
- 5) making cakes for use at our events
- 6) serving refreshments at our meetings.

THACS is a thriving society and is well supported by our members and friends. The Committee appreciate this support and thank you for it. Long may it continue!

# Treasurer's report for financial year 1st November 2009 to 31st October 2010

The 2010 financial year was successful and our funds are healthy and secure.

The cash surplus for the year was £1,215.28, compared with £311.06 in 2009. At the end of the previous financial year no adjustments for prepayments or accruals were made. Included in 2010 cash surplus is £181.00 covering deposits for 2011 events.

Removing the effect of these deposits over the 2010 year end, the cash surplus of £1,215.28 becomes an income surplus of £1,034.28.

The Membership at the end of 2010 stood at 214 members compared with 203 members in 2009. Of the 214, 174 pay their subscriptions by standing order, making a savings on

postage and administration costs. It would be appreciated if the remaining 40 members would consider signing standing order forms to increase this savings.

Our Membership income of £1,050 covered the AGM costs, RHS Membership, the Newsletters, Printing and Sundry expenses, Gifts, plus the losses on our Spring and Autumn Shows. These expenses amounted to £845.30.

The Newsletter printing and postage costs for 2010 have reduced by £49.94, helped by 44 members electing to receive their Newsletters by email.

Income from Advertising was £256.50, a reduction of £102.50 from 2009. As planned we reduced the advertising space in the Newsletters.

Prior to the closure of The Tewin Society, an amount of £150 was donated to *THACS* for the purchase of an annual trophy. The trophy has been purchased and is available for presentation.

Thanks to hard work of our Chairman, Ray Keppler, the Open Gardens event resulted in a surplus of £646.24.

During the year we gave donations of £96.19 to the Tewin Memorial Hall for part cost of the public address system, a donation of £70 towards the renovation costs of the Tewin Telephone Box, and a donation of £250 to Tewin Allotments.

It is not our aim to accumulate funds, and from time to time we may consider donations to other local activities. Before our next Spring Show we intend to purchase two or three additional display boards which may be of considerable expense.

The schedule of the Analysis of the Accumulated Funds, reflects the income and expenditure details for the individual activities carried out during the year, and is also a guide to the make up of our results.

Thanks to Hilary Tipping, *THACS* presented an outstanding Craft Show, which brought in a surplus of £200.99. The visit to the Royal Academy for "The Real Van Gogh" gave a surplus of £37, and the outing to Beth Chatto Gardens a surplus of £86.50, which resulted from filling a 57 seater coach.

The Photo talk was a loss of £9.00, and nine Calligraphy workshops gave a further loss of £9.67. Tickets for Talks and Workshops are sold in advance at a small fee, so we can ensure that lack of numbers will not be an embarrassment to the Speaker or Tutor.

On 23<sup>rd</sup> October 2010, *THACS* 10<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Party took place, despite knowing in advance that the numbers attending were disappointing. After

ten successful years of the Society, we decided to continue with the celebration, and keeping the expenses as low as possible, and the evening resulted in a loss of £112.79.

Having achieved excellent financial results for the year, the bank and cash balances to be carried forward at 31<sup>st</sup> October 2010 were £ 5,568.65, compared with £4,353.37 at the end of October 2009.

We shall continue to act carefully to ensure our Society's finances remain secure.

Finally, may I thank Graham Spring for his help and advice in acting as the Independent Examiner of these accounts.

We intend to present the award every year at the *THACS* AGM commencing in 2012. Meanwhile, we need to determine the award criteria, adjudication method, nomination procedure and publicity. The *THACS* committee thinks that it would be best if this was achieved by a new Tewin Society Award committee to be established, for the specific purpose of dealing with these issues and managing the award each year. This committee would be chaired by the *THACS* chairman and consist of a small number of appropriate people from the village. The formation of this committee is under way.

You'll be hearing more about this in due course but, meanwhile, you can help by thinking about who you would nominate to receive this award and why, so that you'll be prepared to make the nominations once the procedure is announced.

The main message of the talk was that our gardens do not have to be dull, boring and devoid of flowers during autumn and winter. Margaret encouraged us all to use plants that flower in that period and to plant them with earlier-flower plants and bulbs to ensure a succession of flowers.

Margaret has compiled an extensive list of plants that flower between September and February. She introduced us to these plants using excellent photographs and gave us information about their requirements and uses, with a few tips about their care. Most of the plants on the list are available from her nursery, LW Plants, and the catalogue can be down-loaded from her web site www.thymus.co.uk. (If you would like a copy of this actual list, please contact the Editor). The talk was followed by Q&A and refreshments were served whilst her plants and books were viewed and purchased.

Many of the audience expressed a desire to have a guided tour of Margaret's garden in Harpenden, so we will be organising this visit for 2011 (probably in early June).
