Degas Dancers exhibition at the Royal Academy on Wednesday 16th November 2011

As previously announced, *THACS* has organised a visit to the Royal Academy to see its landmark exhibition focusing on Edgar Degas' passion for movement as an artist of the dance. The exhibition will trace the development of the artist's ballet imagery throughout his career. The exhibition will be the first to present Degas' progressive engagement with the figure in movement, and will include drawings, many pastels, paintings and prints, as well as sculptures and photography by the artist and by his contemporaries, and samples of film from the period.

As early booking is strongly recommended, we have pre-booked 50 tickets well ahead of time as this exhibition is likely to be a sell-out. In view of the popularity of this exhibition, **Friends of the RA will not be able to use their cards as normal, when entering an exhibition, but will need to pre-book a date and time with the RA to order their ticket, which is free to Friends.** Obviously, if you wish to come with *THACS*, we will do all the booking for you.

The coach will leave the bus stop opposite the Rose & Crown at 9.00am sharp, and will leave London for the return journey at 3.30pm. There are two entry times to the exhibition; 25 people between 11.00am and 12 noon, and 25 people between 11.30am and 12.30pm.

THACS plant stall at the village fete on Saturday 25th June 2011

Visit to Kenwood House and Estate on Thursday 7th July 2011

The House beside Hampstead Heath provided a wonderful collection of priceless art. It was a pleasure to view the works of many great artists, including Rembrandt, Vermeer, Turner, Reynolds and Gainsborough. The surrounding parkland set high on a hill consisted of lawns, lakes, ancient and new woodlands, all of outstanding beauty, together with an amazing view point of London.

The guided tours of the House and Estate were run separately, one during the morning and one in the afternoon. Both tours were interesting, informative and presented by knowledgeable guides.

There were 50 people in the group, and despite the heavy rain, the visit was thoroughly enjoyable. Fortunately most were well equipped with raincoats and umbrellas, and with so much to see, the wet weather conditions were unimportant. Delicious hot food, tea and coffee was available from the Brew House Café and gave the group an opportunity to "dry off", and discuss what they had seen.

The group arrived safely back at Tewin at 5.30pm, all delighted by a memorable visit to Kenwood House.

Visit to RHS Hyde Hall, Essex, on Wednesday 10thAugust 2011.

This was a popular event, with 53 people in the group. The coach left promptly at 9am, and the journey through the Essex countryside was interesting and pleasant. On arrival at the gardens, many enjoyed a cup of coffee before venturing into the wide open spaces of the gardens.

Hyde Hall is an informal garden, perched on a hilltop with superb views of the surrounding countryside. The hilltop garden and the upper pond area are magnificent with lush green lawns, fantastic herbaceous borders, and a rose garden. The dry garden situated at the side of the hilltop, demonstrated the range of plants that are grown to cope with drought and exposure to wind. In a more protected area, the Queen Mother's garden was a scene of tranquillity and peace with beautiful lawns, flower boarders and trees.

Many of the group visited the plant centre which stocked fine looking traditional favourites, and newer varieties. Baskets and bags were soon filled with plant purchases, and carried to the coach for the journey home.

The weather was fine and warm, and we were able to enjoy the gardens for the whole day. Everything went smoothly and everyone enjoyed a great day at Hyde Hall.
